Sharp Shooters

Steve Bajer and John O'Hara know how to pick 'em

ou look at Steve Bajer and John O'Hara moving around the sales at Keeneland each September and November, and they seem like two guys who took a wrong turn on the way to a fishing trip. Bajer, 62, and O'Hara, 53, both married, walk the grounds with an easy give-and-take dialogue running between them, accompanied by O'Hara's son, Dustin. They're dressed casually, and while they're paying close attention to the business at hand—picking out weanlings and yearlings to buy—they give off the impression of two guys on holiday looking for a restaurant. The results of their purchases, however, paint a far different picture.

Shopping in the equine bargain bins, Bajer and O'Hara have enjoyed an enormous amount of success. They had two of their purchases pre-entered in this year's Breeders' Cup World Championships. One of them, J P's Gusto, is already a grade I winner. Nicole H. wound up running in the Dream Supreme Stakes on the Breeders' Cup undercard. In previous years they have been involved in buying some horses you may have heard of—Alphabet Soup, winner of the 1996 Breeders' Cup Classic (gr. I); Adoration, winner of the 2003 Breeders' Cup Distaff (gr. I); and grade I winner Santa Teresita. For a couple of easygoing guys, these Californians are sharp-eyed sharks. *(continued on page 3516)*

Both found their way to bloodstock work after would-be training careers didn't blossom as expected. O'Hara hails from Maryland, where his parents owned horses. He spent his summers during college working for trainers Patrick Byrne, John Forbes, and Steve Brown, then went to work fulltime as a groom, foreman, and assistant trainer for all of them before migrating to the West Coast and becoming an assistant to Jack Van Berg. After Alysheba retired from racing after winning the 1988 Breeders' Cup Classic (gr.I), O'Hara went out on his own and enjoyed moderate success but didn't attract the type of clients that could keep him going. He began pinhooking horses with prominent California owners John Toffan and Trudy McCaffery.

Bajer, meanwhile, a native of Detroit, joined some classmates who cut college to attend a Kentucky Derby in the early 1970s and fell in love with the horses. One of his classmates was Hank Wesch, who would become the longtime Turf writer for the San Diego Times-Union. Bajer tried his hand as a high school teacher in California for a year before quitting and crashing at Wesch's place in San Clemente. He got a job mucking stalls and feeding horses at a nearby farm, then began walking hots at Old English Rancho, working his way up to groom, foreman, and assistant trainer. He worked as an assistant for Loren Rettele and they won the 1978 Arkansas Derby (gr. I) with Esops Foibles. Bajer wanted

Bajer had met O'Hara when the latter was training, and the pair repeatedly found themselves trying to buy the same horses. They decided to join forces and have been together ever since, selling under the name Equine Prep.

The two run a unique operation. They have just two clients for whom they regularly purchase horses. But with their training backgrounds, they are more than happy to buy horses on their own, supervise the breaking and early training of their purchases, and take them to the racetrack, usually in the care of trainer Dave Hofmans. From there the horses are always for sale, and they've performed well enough to turn a nice profit.

"Their success, I think, is due to hard work," Hofmans said. "They go to the sales early and do their due diligence. They know what kind of horse they want to buy and they find them. They've sure sent me a lot of nice ones through the years."


"We both have training backgrounds and racetrack backgrounds, so we know what horses can handle and what they can't," noted O'Hara. "If a horse is slightly back at the knee, it's something we know we can live with and that horse can come forward through training."

O'Hara and Bajer aren't playing with unlimited bankrolls. Their success is even more impressive given the fact their purchases stay within a price range of \$40,000-\$150,000.

"If this were the NFL draft," said Bajer, "we'd get to start playing in the fourth or fifth round. At the sales everybody lands on the same few horses, and a lot of good horses are passed over."

Bajer and O'Hara bought Adoration from her breeder, Lucy Bassett, for just \$40,000.

"Adoration had a well-proportioned body; her front end matched her back end, she had a very nice walk to her, a good

brain," O'Hara said. "We look for running families, and her dam had four to race at that point, and all of them were over \$100,000 in earnings. We also like to buy product by younger mares because those horses tend to be less expensive. We count on our skills to know when a family can produce a runner, then it's just whether we like the physical.

Purchased from Book Five at the Keeneland September sale, J P's Gusto has won four stakes

"Adoration was slightly back at the knee, but she was training great leading up to the 2-year-old sale. Then she got sick so we pulled her out, but we knew she was a runner, so we gave her to Dave (Hofmans). She ran fifth in her first race; then we agreed to route her and she won

by eight. We sold her the next week to the Amermans, who are clients of Dave's. We were able to sell her for a good amount, and we are tickled to death she went on and won a Breeders' Cup race. Those owners support the business and they're satisfied, and that's what we're in the game for. It's a winwin for the business, and it lets us sell more horses."

At the 2009 Keeneland September yearling sale, the pair was at it again. They bought J P's Gusto for \$52,000 for one of their clients, Dr. John Waken, a retired pathologist, whom Bajer met 12 years ago while rehabbing a back injury by walking around his neighborhood in Arcadia, Calif. He kept running into Waken, who races as Gem Stable, on the walks, they got to talking, and Waken told Bajer he'd been in the horse business since 1967.

"He's an Iron Man to be in the business that long," Bajer said. "He's had five heart attacks, he's

been given his last rites, and he's been pronounced dead twice. He's a wonderful guy. Here's a guy who loves the game and loves the action, and he'd been in it 48 years without having a winning year."

J P's Gusto had an older full sister who became graded stakes placed after the sale catalog came out, marking his family as one Bajer and O'Hara were interested in. They bought him out of Book Five.

"He fit our criteria for the things we like physically," said Bajer. "He was a little back in the knee, but we know that once those horses get broken and start getting some exercise, they straighten out."

Added O'Hara, "We had Smokester and all his horses for John and Trudy, and every one of those horses were back at the knee as yearlings. It's a learning experience on the buying side as to what you can forgive in a young horse. On the training side you don't see all that because you're just getting 2-year-olds. J P's Gusto never had a backward day. Ever."

J P's Gusto, who ran sixth in the Grey Goose Breeders' Cup Juvenile (gr. I) Nov. 6, swept Del Mar's series of 2-year-old stakes, winning the Best Pal Stakes (gr. II) and the Del Mar Futurity (gr. I). He is a four-time stakes winner of \$387,360 to date. A year earlier Bajer and O'Hara had bought Harissa for \$95,000 for Waken, and she's gone on to win the Sunland Park Oaks and earn \$292,466 so far.

"It's not easy buying at our price level

because that's where everybody's at today," O'Hara stated. "But we know what we can stand for training. That's the edge we have. Outside agents are out trying to buy the perfect horse, or as close to perfect as they can get because they don't want somebody coming back to them complaining about buying a horse that toes out or whatever. There are things we will accept that other people won't.

"We look at three or four criteria they have to have, and we view pedigree as the ceiling as to what we're going to pay and eventually receive on the selling end. We want to buy it for half what we think we can sell it for, and our sales multiple over the past 15 years is 2.16."

After Bajer and O'Hara buy yearlings, they're broken at Schvaneveldt Farm in Riverside, Calif., under the care of Monte Schvaneveldt.

"We've had real good success out there," said O'Hara. "I go out there and stay on top of everything. We develop a game plan for each horse, and for six months we get to see them train every day. We can put them in race situations, behind two horses or inside them. They pass through the gates each day. When Dave gets them, they've seen everything. So we know how they handle things, how sound they are, what their movement is like, and whether they will be an early or later 2-year-old."

Last year Well Deserved won her first race and won the Cinderella Stakes at Hollywood Park in her second start. J P's Gusto was ready to run after just a month at the racetrack.

"We've bought horses for a lot of people who end up sending the horse somewhere else, so it's out of our hands," said Bajer. "But part of our expertise is placing these horses. David is a perfect fit for us. He knows when to back off and when to push young horses, and his experience is invaluable to us. He helps us by getting them to the races and winning, and he gets careers out of them, not two or three races and they're on the sidelines and you never see them again.

"We bought Alphabet Soup as a 2-yearold after they couldn't sell him at a training sale. We gave \$100,000 or \$125,000 total for him and a Wild Again because Mrs. B.J. Ridder was looking to buy a 2-year-old and Kip Elser had a couple of them. Mrs. Ridder picked the right one. We brokered that deal. David won stakes with him at 4 and 5."

Bajer and O'Hara's other major client is Marc Ferrell, who as a teenager used to walk hots for O'Hara. O'Hara hadn't seen him for 15 years when he received a phone call from Ferrell, who went on to own five hospitals and was looking to get into the horse business. For Ferrell, Bajer and O'Hara have picked out Well

Deserved, and privately purchased Fiddlers Afleet, winner of the 2009 Oklahoma Derby and earner of \$463,885; Goldsville, winner of this year's Exelsior Stakes (gr. III) and earner of \$276,940; Tidal Dance, a multiple stakes winner who made \$237,506 before being retired; and bought Quality Council, who finished third in the Nov. 6 Nashua Stakes (gr. II) at Aqueduct. Ferrell has recently purchased a 125-acre farm outside Lexington, near Versailles.

"What is great about these guys is their honesty and integrity," noted Ferrell. "They give you their honest opinion on a horse, and you never have to worry about an ulterior motive. The customer comes first, and that's very rare. We've had a lot of success together because they can look at a horse and tell you how it's going to grow and what it will be a year down the road. They're easy-going guys and fun to be around."

Waken owns about eight horses and Ferrell perhaps a dozen, yet a half-dozen of those 20 have become stakes winners.

"We have one guy who's been in the business forever and loves it, and another one who's brand new and trying to learn and wants the farm and the broodmares and everything," O'Hara said. "So we have two great guys who love the game."

Although Bajer and O'Hara can't presently play at the high-end financially, they wouldn't mind getting the opportunity to give that a try.

"We'd love it if someone told us one day, 'You have a budget; now try to exceed it,' "Bajer said. "But we're having a good time right now, and we think it matters to have someone between the trainer and the owner who understands the game. We love being involved."
