True horsepeople, C.L. and Ellen Caines are raising racehorses at their Caines Stallion Station





"It's not work if you like what you're doing," she said. "I enjoy handling the breeding, the foaling, treating the horses, stuff like that. I'll take in problem mares that people sort of give up on and mess with them until they get in foal."

The Caineses, married in 1985, are veterans of the Western show horse industry. Ellen, a Pennsylvania native, was crowned Miss Appaloosa America in 1984. With the exception of standing a few outside stallions from other breeds at the farm, now she concentrates on Thoroughbreds. Connie, born in Michigan, remains active in the show horse industry, especially as a judge, but lends his wife a hand feeding the horses and hauling hay.

Ellen Caines, who at a young age started riding horses, enjoyed the challenge of learning about them.

"I've always been a self-taught person," she said. "I saw what other people did, and I tried to do it myself, so I did a lot of listening and watching while learning. If I didn't understand something, I'd seek someone out and ask."

According to Caines, she learned from who she considers one of the best. "I got to work with a veterinarian when we had first gotten started," she said, referring to Dr. David Miller. "He was extremely talented in the reproduction part, and I learned from him. He's pretty much retired, but even today if I have a problem, I call him. He taught me more than I could ever learn in a book. If I run into a problem and start racking my brain, I'll call him and ask him about it, and he'll say, 'Ellen, go back to the basics.' Pretty soon a light bulb goes off in my brain."

The Caineses operate on 195 acres. The main tract is 55 acres and the remaining 130 is pasture and home to cattle.

"We're small and not as big as some other operations," Ellen Caines said. "There are some huge places in Oklahoma."

Caines Stallion Station offers foaling, boarding, sales prep, and stallion services, but not breaking or training. Instead, the farm specializes in foal development.

"We take the foals through specific learning stages and get them ready so they can be broken and sent to training centers,"

Caines said. "They get used to a lot of handling, which makes a difference later on. We keep them late into their yearling year or as 2-year-olds.

"When I drop them off at one training center, the guy there complimented us because they were so easy to handle. A lot of times we just back up the trailer and run them in. The training center people love it because with some other outfits they have to 'cowboy' them in.

"The same goes for some of my sale horses. I've had several people remark about how easy they are to handle."

Caines takes it in stride when she finds herself going full circle. "After the breeding and foaling seasons, I concentrate on the sales prep, which I do, not only for our horses and our clients' horses but also for other consignors," she said. "By the end of the year, I'm tired of the prepping and can't wait for the breeding and foaling seasons to start."

Caines Stallion Station is home to seven Thoroughbred stallions and generally about 20 broodmares, 10 of which are owned by the farm. "I'm a broodmare junkie; I love broodmares," Caines said. The farm races few runners. "I tell people our program is geared toward getting horses in the hands of others so they can race," Caines said. "We've had a couple of horses run, but our philosophy is to get them sold as late yearlings or 2-year-olds. We enjoy watching people get them and having success with them."

True Wink, bred by Ellen Caines and Jim Wells, won or placed in 11 of 20 races and earned \$131,188 racing on the East Coast and at Oaklawn Park.

Wells, formerly based in Oklahoma and now operating in Central Kentucky, had a big influence on Caines. "I call him my adopted dad," she said. "He's had some great horses."

One of Wells' runners was multiple stakes winner Explosive Girl, who is now with the Caineses. Explosive Girl produced Japanese grade I-placed Grass Eiko O for Wells.

"Jim was a great Oklahoma horseman," Ellen Caines said. "I always knew him,

but as I started drifting over to Thoroughbreds from the other breeds, Jim was the one I went to for advice. He took me under his wing, and he's the type of guy who is happy when you do well. He has hooked me up with a lot of clients."

Wells owns Candy Meadows Farm near Lexington with his wife, Janie, and Everett Dobson of Oklahoma City. "She was a quick learner," Wells said about Caines. "She's conscientious, good with horses, a good working horsewoman. She does a good job whatever she does and is especially good with mares and babies.

"They have a show horse background, and there came a time when they were in-

terested in doing something a little differently. It was when Oklahoma was getting pari-mutuel racing (at Remington Park) that I introduced her to Thoroughbreds."

Caines gives the Oklahoma breeding program high marks. "They are changing things to make it even better," she said. "Our purses and the breeders' incentives have gotten better, which has brought in a lot of outside trainers.

"It has certainly helped the sales. I had a lot of people looking for Oklahoma-breds. People used to laugh at us because we're basically a Quarter Horse state. It feels good that they recognize us now."


Caines, who mainly sells in Oklahoma and Texas, sold two

of the highest-priced yearlings at the 2010 Fasig-Tipton Texas summer yearling sale. As agent, she sold a Tale of the Cat colt for \$55,000 and a Mineshaft filly for \$50,000.

"The Texas sale is our biggest sale," Caines said. "I do the prep work myself and don't like to take more than 20 to 25 horses to the sale because that way you can give them all the attention they need. At the sale I had people looking for Oklahoma-breds."

Caines took a stab at the recent Keeneland January horses of all ages sale. It proved a valuable learning experience.

"It went OK," she said. "Being the new kid on the block, I was put at the end of the sale, which really wasn't bad. I had a lot of traffic and was really pleased about that. Some of our horses were

for us; some were for clients."

The exposure at the sales has helped Caines gain a following.

"There are a lot of local people that I help with breeding decisions," she said. "Friends of mine from other states have called me because I've been to Kentucky and have seen the stallions. They ask me, 'Who should I breed to?' Some people haven't had the opportunity to come to Kentucky, but I have, which is nice.

"Around here we don't get a lot of prebookings. As far as people calling up and saying, 'Hey, we want to breed a mare to this stallion,' and having them show up doesn't happen much. It's not like it is in Kentucky."

Caines has her work cut out as far as making stallions. "The stallions that I get off the track, I have to build a program around them," she said.

Country Be Gold is the highest-priced stallion at the farm. The son of Preakness Stakes (gr. I) winner Summer Squall, out of the Personal Flag mare Beloved Bea, stands for \$1,500.

Country Be Gold won four stakes, including the Aqueduct Handicap (gr. III), and his four graded stakes-placings include a third-place finish in the Jockey Club Gold Cup (gr. I). As a stallion, Country Be Gold has sired Right Squall, who is stakes-placed at Remington, and multiple winner Country Green, who is a winner already this year.

"A lot of people here want to see what a stallion can produce," Caines said. "I was really happy with the response Waupaca got as a first-year stallion. There were a lot of people last year who bred to other



him for several years, and some people bred to him and some didn't, and now his babies are out there and doing really well. I've got a lot of people who have them, and they want to come back and breed to him this year."

Veteran stallions Leave a Legacy and War Machine were both stakes performers at Remington. Leave a Legacy (Marquetry—Fantasy Cat, by Cougar II) won the Remington Futurity and three other stakes at the track. War Machine was twice stakes-placed at Remington and equaled a course-record there.

"Leave a Legacy is a pretty boy; he's another that was trained by Donnie," Caines said. "His runners have done well, and there's a lot of interest in breeding to him.

"I get horses like him off the track, and it takes three or four years before their ba-

bies are out there doing something. And then they get some good runners, and people realize how good they are."

Caines calls War Machine a kitten. "He doesn't breed a lot of mares, but he's got a good one in Haymow Bob," Caines said.

Through 2010 Haymow Bob has won 13 of 47 races and earned \$167,111.

"He's steady, and one of his horses can pop up at any time," Caines said about War Machine, who is by Explodent out of the Wig Out mare Billy Jane.

Jack Wilson, who has been standing at Caines Stallion Station since 2008, came to the farm as an established star. To date, the stakes-winning son of Encino out of the Mr. Leader mare Ahpo Hel is represented by 13 stakes winners.

Caines Stallion Station also stands Surachai, a stakes-winning son of Slewpy out of the Don B. mare Corvettin. "He's a nice horse," Caines said. "He gets a lot of Quarter Horse mares and some Paint and Appaloosa mares."

Caines finds pleasure in her farm work. "We were going to dinner one night and Connie goes, 'You're always so tired.' I looked at him and told him 'I know,' but that I'd rather be tired doing something I love rather than something I hate."
