# **Heavy Lifting**

### Dana and Jimmy Barnes make Hall of Fame trainer Bob Baffert's barn run smoothly

immy and Dana Barnes' road to Bob Baffert's employ began on horseback at Golden Gate Fields in 1983. The couple met while exercising Thoroughbreds in the mornings, which led to marriage, two daughters, and major roles on the Baffert team as the Hall of Famer's assistant trainer and one of his go-to exercise riders.

Baffert, of course, quarterbacks a championship stable from his Southern California base, one that regularly succeeds in Triple Crown, Breeders' Cup, and other important races. In 2011 alone Baffert has won the grade I Kentucky Oaks, Santa Anita Handicap, Santa Anita Derby, Hollywood Gold Cup, Haskell Invitational, Del Mar Futurity, Goodwood Stakes, and Pat *(continued on page 3588)*

O'Brien Stakes. Game On Dude ran second in the Breeders' Cup Classic (gr. I), and Baffert also captured the inaugural Sentient Jet Breeders' Cup Juvenile Sprint—which is not yet graded—with Secret Circle.

Jimmy and Dana are instrumental components in Baffert's success. Jimmy helps Baffert as his assistant at the Santa Anita barn, with Mike Marlow looking after matters at Hollywood Park. Jimmy travels extensively when Baffert has horses running at home and across the country on the same weekend. Dana works many of the stable runners and sometimes heads out on the road with Jimmy.

"Jimmy has been gone probably more than he's been home this year," said Dana. "We've just run so many horses. There were four weeks in a row where he was back and forth from the East Coast to the West Coast. He'd come home for two days and go back."

Jimmy usually flies with the horses, making sure that each horse receives first-class care.

"His biggest enjoyment is when I send him on the road with a horse to the big races and he wins," said Baffert. "He knows everybody; he's the best roadman."

Dana noted that in addition to trips to

Churchill Downs in the spring and fall and the frequent trips to the East, Jimmy in 2011 traveled to Arkansas, Indiana, Ohio, Florida, Louisiana, Oklahoma, and Texas. Dana went to Kentucky both times and to Maryland.

It's a schedule more easily kept these days, especially for Dana, now that their daughters are grown. Jimmy, 52, and Dana, 48, have raised daughters Jenee, 24, and Jordan, 18. Jenee is studying law at Tulane University, while Jordan is preparing for college.

When the girls were young, Dana found her job as exercise rider—minus the travel—almost ideal.

"It was a great job for a mom because I'd be home by 10 and have the whole day with my kids," Dana said, adding that the only difficulty was finding a babysitter for the odd hours and days.

While a racetrack schedule can play havoc with a marriage when one of the partners has a "normal" job, Jimmy and Dana's marriage has thrived. Jimmy says he probably sees Dana more at the barn than at home.

"It's amazing how a husband and wife can work together and get along," said Baffert. "I thought at first when I had them together, 'Oh, man, this might not be good." But they work great together."

Jimmy's day starts at 4:30 a.m., while Dana begins about an hour later. Dana finishes by late morning, and Jimmy might get home at noon for a quick break if he leaves the barn at all during the day.

Baffert regularly has about 120 horses in training, which keeps everybody busy, both at Santa Anita and Hollywood.

"Jimmy is a working machine," said Baffert. "He and Mike Marlow are workaholics."

Baffert recalled one time he saw Jimmy raking the shedrow.

"What are you doing?" Baffert asked him. "No, no. You're the assistant. You don't rake shedrows anymore."

Jimmy loves his job, not only because he has spent his entire life on the racetrack but also because of the quality in the Baffert barn.

"It's great to wake up every morning and come out to a barn full of classic horses," Jimmy said.

It's quite a list, one that goes back to Eclipse Award winners Silver Charm and Real Quiet in the late 1990s on through 2001 Horse of the Year Point Given and more recent champions such as Lookin At Lucky and Midnight Lute.

#### **Apprentice Days**

Before Dana and Jimmy began working for Baffert, they apprenticed with many other top California horsemen.

Jimmy grew up in Northern California, where his father, Laverne, owned some horses.

"My father trained a couple of horses on his own when I was 7 or 8 years old," said Jimmy. "I'd come out and help clean stalls, walk hots, whatever I could do. Then I went to work for his trainer during the summer, traveling the fairs. That was a lot of fun."

Jimmy graduated to galloping horses and wanted to be a jockey, but his mother, Barbara, refused to let him ride until he was 18, insisting that the young boy get an education. Jimmy rode in a few races before he outgrew a career as a jockey. He trained on his own for a while and then worked as an assistant to trainer Allen Severinsen.

Dana, meanwhile, called Southern California home, growing up in the horse town of Norco, east of the Los Angeles area.

"I had my first pony when I was 2 years old," said Dana. "We always had show horses, but I wanted to ride racehorses."

Dana showed Quarter Horses in classes such as Western pleasure before starting English riding lessons in fourth grade. That led to learning to gallop racehorses at a local training center.

At age 17 she worked at Old English Rancho in Ontario, Cal., until she could go to the racetrack at age 18.

"I learned a lot there, things like how to break babies, bandage horses," said Dana.

Dana freelanced as an exercise rider at the racetrack in between attending college. She galloped horses for Laz Barrera and Bob Wheeler and then took a more permanent job with Michael Whittingham. Horses in the Whittingham barn at the time included Malibu Stakes (gr. II) winner Pacmania and multiple stakes winner Vigor's Lady.

But Dana wanted to become a jockey, and she thought she had a better chance to break in on the Northern California circuit. It was the 1980s, which meant women were legally allowed to ride in races, but few could get many mounts. Mary Bacon was about the only female jockey riding with any regularity at Golden Gate Fields and Bay Meadows.

After Dana met Jimmy, however, her priorities shifted.

"I decided I wanted to get married instead," she said.

The couple moved to Southern California and married in 1985. Dana went back to work for Whittingham, who also hired Jimmy as an assistant trainer. Dana regularly breezed Skywalker, winner of the 1986 Breeders' Cup Classic (gr. I) at Santa Anita.

When Whittingham went east to train and his father, Hall of Famer Charlie Whittingham, needed someone to head up his Hollywood Park string in the early 1990s, Jimmy and Dana signed on with the elder Whittingham.

"There's never going to be another Charlie," Dana said. "He knew every single horse, and he truly loved horses. He would go around to every horse and give them a peppermint."

Charlie once told a friend of Dana's that she was one of the best exercise riders he'd ever legged up on a horse. While he wasn't the type to pay her that compliment directly, he saw to it that Dana finally realized her earlier dream of becoming a jockey.

He urged her to get her license and ride some horses for him. Dana's jockey career didn't last long, but she finished second on a Whittingham horse and ultimately won some races at Los Alamitos.

Because Jimmy managed Charlie's second string, he didn't have the opportunity of working as closely with him as Dana did.

"He was a fun guy to work for, genuinely nice," said Jimmy. "He took very good care of us."

#### **Baffert Charm**

During the 1990s Jimmy also worked for Jerry Hollendorfer and Dave Hofmans. Meanwhile, Dana came to Baffert's notice because Baffert had the barn next to Whittingham at Santa Anita. She began working horses for Baffert about the time of Silver Charm and Real Quiet, when both won the Kentucky Derby (gr. I) and Preakness Stakes (gr. I). Dana worked with both champions.

"Silver Charm was the smartest horse," said Dana. "We had taken him to Hollywood Park to work him. I was jogging him back to where the casino is, and a whole bunch of people standing there realized it was Silver Charm. They started clapping, and you could literally feel that horse puff up."

Silver Charm enjoyed attention to such an extent that Dana recalls the horse getting upset after Real Quiet won the Kentucky Derby.

"They were stabled right next to each other in Kentucky," Dana said. "Everyone was around Real Quiet's stall, taking pictures and talking about him. Silver Charm would take his hay net and sling it out as if to say, 'Hey, I'm over here!' Great horses know they're great."

A later Baffert champion, 2010 Preakness Stakes winner Lookin At Lucky, likewise reveled in his notoriety. Dana said he would play like a little kid on the shank at one end of the shedrow. But when he walked to the other end where photographers were gathered, he switched into regal champion mode, stopping and posing for pictures.

Jimmy joined Baffert's barn in the late 1990s, not long after Dana was able to work for Baffert full-time because their daughters were older. One of the many horses to impress Jimmy was Point Given.

"He was a racehorse, a beast," Jimmy said of the 1,280-pound champion. "There were always anxious moments around him because you could never tell what he was going to do, whether he would behave or misbehave."

According to Dana, Point Given's bad-boy street cred was somewhat undeserved.

"He had a bad reputation because he liked to rear up," she said. "He only reared up on days when he first went back to the track. I only worked him, so he never reared up with me. In the stall he was so sweet. He loved candy."

Dana finds most of the horses in Baffert's barn to be sweet, but even she had to confess that 2000 Santa Anita Handicap and 1999 Pacific Classic (gr. I) winner General Challenge was "a goofball."

"At Del Mar in the paddock, he would stop and stare at himself in the office windows for the longest time," Dana said.

Some horses such as The Factor demonstrated their quality right from the beginning.

"The first day I got on him, I thought that this horse was nice," said Dana. "He is so smooth in switching his leads. You can see him do it, but you can't feel it."

Jimmy and Dana both enjoy when the 2-year-olds first arrive at Baffert's barn. Jimmy said that everyone tries to predict which horses will emerge as the superstars.

"I picked (Del Mar Futurity winner) Drill," said Jimmy of the 2011 crop. "But then there are always others that come up and surprise you, like Secret Circle."

In the spring Jimmy, Dana, and the entire Baffert barn crew are at their busiest. While the pace rarely slows much, the closest they come to down time is in the fall after the Breeders' Cup. Still, Jimmy daily makes out set lists and follows up on numerous details after Baffert marks charts, decides where horses will run, and otherwise outlines battle plans.

"I'm busy buying horses, trying to stock the pond," said Baffert. "He's doing all the heavy lifting."
