Rider Up

Alan Garcia is king of the hill in New York

Alan Garcia is quick to make an impression in and out of the saddle. In his first full year of riding in New York in 2007, the jockey with the Hollywood smile finished second in the year-end standings with 213 winners to Eibar Coa's 262.

In five of the six meets run at New York Racing Association tracks last year, Garcia finished among the top five riders. At the conclusion of 2007, Garcia had won 11 graded stakes. This year, through Oct. 6, he has 21 graded wins. In 2007, his mounts earned \$11,805,722, ranking him 13th in the country. With a little less than three months remaining in 2008, Garcia's mounts have already earned \$12,561,679 (through Oct. 6).

The native of Peru captured the coveted Saratoga title in 2008 by booting home 39 winners. That feat came on the heels of Garcia finishing second at both Belmont Park's spring/summer meet and Aqueduct's winter/spring meet.

Garcia, who turned 23 Oct. 2, won his first grade I aboard the Kiaran McLaughlin-trained Lahudood in the Flower Bowl Invitational (gr. IT) at Belmont Park Sept. 29, 2007. The proverbial icing on the cake came 28 days later at Monmouth Park in the \$2-million Emirates Airline Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf (gr. IT), when Garcia and Lahudood won the race by three-quarters of a length over Honey Ryder. Lahudood, owned by Sheikh Hamdan's Shadwell Stable, was the eighth choice in the 11-horse field at odds of 11-1.

It was Garcia's first mount in the Breeders' Cup, and the only one he had during the two-day Breeders' Cup Championships.

McLaughlin is not only appreciative of Garcia's prowess as a rider; he greatly admires Garcia's work ethic in his barn, where the jockey has become an important cog during morning training sessions.

"He is great with horses coming out of the gate," McLaughlin said. "I give him a lot of credit for our success with 2-year-olds this year because he came in the morning and worked them out of the gate for us. He knew them and understood them, and that helped us in the afternoon. He doesn't have many weaknesses as far as riding races—whether he comes from last or goes to the lead. He reads races well; he rides the turf.

"The main thing to me is that I am a believer in positive energy, and he has a lot of positive energy with our staff and horses," he said. "He's a positive person and happy and he doesn't have to fight his weight. And he enjoys what he is doing, and that just says a lot about him. Alan deserves everything he is earning today. He has taken advantage of an opportunity and taken it to the next level."

CLASSIC KID

Undoubtedly, a career highlight for Garcia was his win in this year's Belmont Stakes (gr. I) aboard the Nick Zito-trained Da' Tara. The win was significant on sev-

eral levels. As when he rode in the Breeders' Cup last year, Garcia's mount in the Belmont Stakes was his first in a Triple Crown event. The hoopla surrounding the 140th running of the Belmont Stakes was solely centered on Big Brown, the winner of the Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (gr. I) and Preakness Stakes (gr. I).

Barely any attention was paid to Da' Tara, save for the fact he was trained by Hall of Famer Zito, who showed his magic touch for upsetting a Triple Crown hopeful

and when they come off for some ping pong

four years earlier when he sent out Birdstone to thwart Smarty Jones' potential sweep of the elusive Triple Crown.

Garcia rode Da' Tara, a son of Tiznow, in his career debut Sept. 28, 2007, just one day before winning the Flower Bowl with Lahudood. Da' Tara finished second in the maiden race, and then he and Garcia were separated until their reunion in the Belmont Stakes. Da' Tara headed to Florida for the winter, and Garcia remained in New York. Garcia obtained the mount on Da' Tara after Tomcito, whom he was engaged to ride, was injured.

Da' Tara entered the Belmont with only one win in seven starts, and therefore was the longest shot in the nine-horse field at odds of 38-1. Zito had said in the race lead-up that he believed the colt would establish the early pace. Garcia followed the trainer's instructions to the letter.

Da' Tara wound up winning the Belmont Stakes by 5¼ lengths, after leading from start to finish. As such a surprise as that was, the bigger head-scratcher was that Big Brown was eased by jockey Kent Desormeaux early in the stretch of the

12-furlong race after it was apparent the colt wasn't the same horse who had shown brilliance in winning the first two legs of the Triple Crown.

"I was waiting for Big Brown, before the quarter pole, at the quarter pole," Garcia said, looking back at his first classic victory. "When I saw the first television (in the infield) and I was five in front, I thought, 'Oh my God, I think I can do this.' I was riding my horse harder. Then I knew I was going to win. I was so excited. What an amazing feeling. In the Breeders' Cup it was a good feeling, but to win the Belmont was great because it wasn't (expected). I didn't know how we were going to beat Big Brown."

Stunned reporters flocked into the post-race interview room at Belmont Park to hear what the winning connections had to say about the shocking upset, but everybody wanted to hear from Big Brown's connections, as well. In the middle of the interview with Garcia, Zito, and Da' Tara's owner, Robert LaPenta, Desormeaux came into the room and recounted how the race unfolded for Big Brown.

In sympathy, no doubt, to Desormeaux being on the hot seat, Garcia turned off his high-wattage smile that beamed strongly before his colleague's entrance in the interview room. But not unlike a kid who had some great news to tell his parents, Garcia squirmed in his seat, and you knew he was just dying to say, "Can we get back to my story now?"

STARTING THE FIRE

Garcia's story began in Peru. The son and grandson of jockeys, and the second youngest of seven siblings, he remembers his first ride as one that was a bit too docile for his liking. When he was 5 years old, Garcia said a groom would lead him around in circles while on horseback. Things sped up eight years later, when Garcia began galloping Thoroughbreds. When he was 14, he entered Peru's riding school, which had graduated top American rider Rafael Bejarano the year before.

Garcia rode his first winner, the aptly named Start the Fire, in Peru in 2002. The following year, Garcia was the leading apprentice in Peru. He came to the United States later in 2003, following the advice of a family friend and former rider, Alfredo Clemente.

Garcia rode at Meadowlands in New Jersey, where he was leading apprentice at the conclusion of the track's fall meet. He also rode at Monmouth Park, the Maryland circuit, and during the winter at Aqueduct, before making New York his year-round base last year. He is represented by agent Tony Micallef.

Garcia said he is careful not to get cocky about his rise to fame. He said he has an important circle of family and friends keeping him focused and grounded. He

particularly credits his parents, Dagoberto and Consuelo, and Micallef and McLaughlin.

Dagoberto is an exercise rider for Gary Contessa in New York, and sees his son frequently. Garcia's mother, Consuelo, is trying to obtain a visa to come to the United States to visit her son, but has been unsuccessful so far. When the opportunity presents itself, like recently when Garcia was serving days for a riding infraction, he goes to Peru to visit his mother.

"It is very sad that my mother can't come here to visit," Garcia said. "That is the one person that I want beside me when I do well. When I started my career in my country, she was right behind me. She always looked out for me; kept me straight. And I think she did an excellent job."

GRADE I GARCIA

Besides stakes victories this year for McLaughlin and Zito, Garcia has ridden black-type winners for, among others, Christophe Clement, Tony Dutrow, Bobby Frankel, Steve Klesaris, Michael Matz, Bobby Ribaud, and Jimmy Toner.

He won aboard the Frankel-trained Vineyard Haven in the Three Chimneys Hopeful Stakes (gr. I) at Saratoga on closing day of the meet, and the gate-to-wire victory clinched the riding title for Garcia. The rider completed a sweep of the closing weekend juvenile stakes at Saratoga by winning the Spinaway (gr. I) aboard the Klesaris-trained Mani Bhavan.

"When you aren't winning, you start thinking too much, instead of going with the flow," Frankel said. "And I think (Gar-

cia) is just going with the flow right now. I let him make all the decisions with Vineyard Haven, and obviously he made all the right decisions. The horse broke sharp. He could have taken a hold of him and let someone else go, but he had the confidence to let my horse go."

Micallef made the decision to remain in New York for the final day of the 36-day Saratoga meet, rather than honoring a verbal commitment to Zayat Stables to ride Alaazo in the \$1-million Pennsylvania Derby (gr. II), which was given before Garcia was in contention to win the Saratoga title.

As a result of not honoring the call, Philadelphia Park stewards fined Micallef \$250. With Frankie Pennington in the saddle, Alaazo finished ninth in the Pennsylvania Derby.

Garcia rode eight stakes winners at Saratoga, with four of the wins coming in grade I races. In addition to Vineyard Haven and Mani Bhavan, Garcia's other grade I scores came in the NetJets King's Bishop (gr. I) aboard the Matz-trained Visionaire and the Sword Dancer Invitational (gr. IT) on Grand Couturier for Ribaud.

McLaughlin snagged his first training title on American soil (he previously had won titles in Dubai) at the Saratoga meet. Fifteen of the 17 winners McLaughlin saddled were ridden by Garcia.

Garcia rode five winners on Travers day, and three of them were for McLaughlin.

A great deal of the success McLaughlin has had in 2008 has come with Garcia in the saddle. Among the stakes races won by the McLaughlin-Garcia tandem are the Metropolitan Handicap (gr. I) with Divine Park; the Futurity (gr. II) with Charitable Man; Bernard Baruch (gr. IIT) with Shakis; Alfred G. Vanderbilt (gr. II) with Abraaj; and Tom Fool (gr. II) and Bold Ruler (gr. III) with Lucky Island.

The trainer said there is no contract between him and Garcia, and that he doesn't balk when Micallef and his rider have outside mounts. In fact, he is delighted when they enjoy success with others.

"Sometimes Tony (Micallef) tells me they have to ride Clement, Frankel, or for Shug (McGaughey), and I understand," McLaughlin said. "I want him to ride the best horses."

This winter, Garcia and Micallef will venture to Florida for the first time. McLaughlin has several talented 2-year-olds in his barn, among them Charitable Man, Girolamo, Majestic Blue, and Regal Ransom, and Garcia doesn't want them out of his sight.

"I have to follow my horses," Garcia said. "The money is better (in New York) than Florida, but I want to ride the Kentucky Derby and the Breeders' Cup, and to get those horses, I have to go to Florida. I have to follow those good horses I ride to Florida." 📍
