Family Ties


The Von Hemel clan proves powerful throughout the Midwest

oylynn Von Hemel isn't surprised that her sons Donnie K. and Kelly have flourished as trainers. "They've been very successful at it," she said. "They've had a good teacher."

That teacher would be Roylynn's husband, Don, who is the patriarch of one of the nation's most successful training families.

That was illustrated during Oaklawn Park's racing Festival of the South, when all three Von Hemels won a stakes. Kelly sent out Semaphore Man to win the Count Fleet Sprint Handicap (gr. III). Two days later, Don won the Northern Spur Stakes with Sebastian County, and Donnie saddled Euphony to win the Instant Racing Stakes.

"They're just terrific people," said Josephine Abercrombie of Pin Oak Stud, who has Euphony and other horses with Donnie. "They're all horsemen, and that's the most important thing. They grew up with horses; they know horses. They know all about them. That's different from quite a lot of trainers. The Von Hemels are horse people, and I think they're terrific."

Together, the three Von Hemels have won more than 5,000 races and \$82 million in purses with an 18.6% winning rate.

Don Von Hemel, 74, has amassed 2,363 career victories in a training career that began in 1956 in western Kansas. He won or tied for the leading trainer title at Ak-Sar-Ben six times in eight years from 1987-94, and was inducted into the Nebraska Racing Hall of Fame. In 1984, his Win Stat set an American dirt record of 1:38²/₅ at a mile and 70 yards at Oaklawn.

Donnie, 47, has won 1,684 races and holds many of the training records at Remington Park, where he is a member of that track's hall of fame. He started training in 1984 and ascended quickly with the success of runners such as grade I winner Clever Trevor and multiple stakes winner Explosive Girl. He has maintained a steady stream of stakes winners ever since, including millionaires Mr Ross and Bien Nicole, plus graded stakes winners Going Ballistic, Brownie Points, Bedanken, See How She Runs, and Evansville Slew.

He and Don took turns overseeing Mariah's Storm, who won 10 of 16 races and upset eventual champion Serena's Song in the 1995 Turfway Park Budweiser Breeders' Cup (gr. II).

Kelly, 43, won his 1,000th race in 2007 and has a 20.1% career winning rate. He is based at Prairie Meadows, where he holds the record for most stakes victories by a trainer. His runners have included Miss Macy Sue, third in the 2007 Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Sprint; the aforementioned Semaphore Man; and Sure Shot Biscuit, the only Iowa-bred to win more than \$1 million.

"My dad is an excellent horseman and so is my brother," Kelly said. "Just growing up with Dad and watching him operate and how he does things day-to-day, you can't put a price tag on that. I couldn't have had a better teacher."

The Von Hemels' start came in Manter, Kan., a town of 250. Don's father worked for rancher Guy Roric, and Don started helping with chores at the ranch at age 9 in 1943. By age 12, he was starting to groom and gallop horses. He began training for Roric in 1956 and did so until 1968, when he started his own stable.

"I was just making a monthly wage, and there was more month left at the end of the money," Von Hemel said. "That's when I decided to get out on my own and give it a try.

"There were a lot of times when I didn't know if I could make a living at it, but I loved it enough that I was willing to give it a hard try."

Beginning with four horses, including two maidens, at Sunland Park, Von Hemel did his own grooming and galloping. He struggled for two years before he started winning and attracting the attention of owners, who gave him more horses.

During the school year, Roylynn would be at home in Manter with Donnie, Kelly, and daughter Pam, now a speech pathologist in Omaha. When he could, Don flew home to catch one of his children's athletic events, even though the nearest airport was 80 miles away.

"He did that several times," Donnie said. "You always wanted to do well, of course, but when he was there, you wanted to do extra well. It made you appreciate that he made the effort to get there."

In the summer, the family would join Don at whatever track he was at.

"The boys started walking hots around the barn and then turned to rubbing horses and exercising horses," Don said. "They were pretty attentive all the way along.

"They showed a passion. They were ready to go to work in the morning, and a lot of times they'd work into the night."

As Donnie and Kelly got older, their parents told them to go to college, get their degrees, and then decide if they wanted to train. When Donnie graduated in accounting and took his CPA exam, Don and Roylynn thought their son was headed for a 9-to-5 job.

They were in for a surprise.

"It wasn't that close (of a decision)," Donnie said. "I did everything I was supposed to in school, but I was ready to give the track a try when I got out.

"Explosive Girl was probably the first real good horse I had a chance to go with, then 'Clever' was the first national horse I ever had. They give you a chance, and you have to make something of your chances."

Explosive Girl earned eight stakes victories between 1987 and 1989, and banked \$467,592 for her career, which included 15 victories, 10 seconds, and five thirds in 40 starts. Clever Trevor, a Slewacide gelding, earned \$1,388,841, winning half of his 30 lifetime starts, including a victory in the 1989 Arlington Classic (gr. I), one of nine stakes wins in his career. He ran unplaced behind Sunday Silence in the 1989 Kentucky Derby (gr. I).

Kelly followed a different script. He attended Bethel College in Kansas as a freshman, where he played football, but quit after a semester. With prodding from his parents, he tried another college, but left in 1985 to help his father at the racetrack.

"We tried to keep him in," Don Von Hemel said. "He just wasn't satisfied.

"When he came out of school and started to work, I made it as hard on him as I could. If he could keep his nose to the grindstone with me after him all the time, I knew that's what he wanted to do."

Don gave Kelly 10 horses to train at Fonner Park, and in 1986, Kelly won 30 of 86 races.

"He had horses that needed to be worked on," Don said. "They needed their ankles worked on. They needed hosing, and rubbing and icing. You had to get them ready to run."

Kelly showed a lot of the same traits as Don. "He is patient," said Jason Loutsch, who owns Miss Macy Sue with his father-in-law, Dennis Albaugh. "If the horses aren't ready, they don't run. He's not in a hurry. When they're not ready, they don't run.

"When Macy was 2, she was just a speed bullet. He worked so hard on getting her to settle down, and it paid off."

Miss Macy Sue, by Trippi, is a six-time stakes winner, including a victory in the 2007 Winning Colors Stakes (gr. III) at Churchill Downs. She also won that year's Presque Isle Downs Master Stakes, and has come back this year to finish second in both of those races. She has also won the Saylorville Stakes two consecutive years. Miss Macy Sue has banked \$880,915 to date.

Semaphore Man, also trained by Kelly, is a Formal Gold gelding with three stakes wins and nearly \$400,000 in earnings to

for his career.

for prostate cancer, had a hip replaced, and has a breathing problem, but he has no plans for retiring. When Oaklawn opens in January, he'll be back at the barn.

"I'll still be able to tell people what to do," he joked. "Overall, I'm doing pretty well."

If it's one thing Don has been over the years, it is steady. Like clockwork each morning, after training is over and entries are drawn, he can be found playing cards in the rec room

He said his favorite memory after more than a half-century at the track hasn't come from the horses he has trained.

"I guess the highlight of my career is seeing those boys compete at the level they're competing at and having the success they're having," Von Hemel said. "Those are the things that make you proud."
