# Westbury Stables' Nora and Al Figliolia enjoy classic success

ora Figliolia has a problem. She can't bring herself to watch races in which horses bred by her and her husband, Al, run. And so increasingly, she's missing some of the better events on the sport's calendar, such as last year's Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands and Belmont Stakes (both gr. I).

As relatively new and small breeders under their Westbury Stables banner, the Figliolias probably didn't figure they'd find themselves in this sort of quandary. But in quick succession, runners like Denis of Cork, Awesome Chic, Deep Dish Pie, and Just for Keeps have aced stakes contests in the past two years, causing Nora to find new and creative ways to keep occupied while hooves are flying.

"When Awesome Chic ran for the first time, she won by 17½ lengths," she said. "I (continued on page 58)







was in the kitchen cooking, and we had a bunch of people over and everybody was screaming for me to come watch the race. For Denis of Cork in the Kentucky Derby, I had my head stuck in a friend's shoulder. The Belmont? I wasn't watching there, either."

Nora missed Denis of Cork's third-place effort in the Derby and runner-up finish in the Belmont, but that's about all the Figliolias have missed out on since beginning to develop their Westbury Stables operation and farm near Reddick, Fla., just six years ago.

A pair of retired New York business executives, Nora and Al Figliolia had always wanted to own land, and they used to travel to Ocala to visit friends in the area. Then, in the early 1990s, Nora became ill with a couple of auto-immune diseases, and the physical therapies prescribed for her weren't working. One of their friends, a doctor in Ocala, suggested she try therapeutic horseback riding. Not only did the riding improve her physical well-being, but the couple fell in love with horses, and soon had six riding ponies.

Next up was a place to keep them. "Al has been developing land since he was young; that's his passion," noted Nora. "We both wanted to be surrounded by nature; we used to go for rides on Sunday afternoons and dream about having a big piece of land and being in the country. And we were fortunate enough through friends to meet Barbara and Francis Vanlangendonck, Nick and Jackie de Meric, and Brent and Crystal Fernung. So it was a no-brainer when we found 47 acres that Leo and Jeanette Hamill were selling in 2002 that was already a horse farm (the Westbury operation has since expanded to more than 200 acres). It was good for our six riding ponies, and since we were surrounded by all these wonderful people in the Thoroughbred business, we thought we'd go ahead and buy a few broodmares and see how it went."

Since this writer is a native of Westbury, N.Y., I asked if that town on Long Island was the inspiration for the name of the Figliolia's operation. "Well, at first we came up with the name Pegasus Stables," said Nora, "but that was a name being used by other outfits, so we decided to pick something else. Al was looking at a coffee-table book I'd given him that had aerial photos from all over the world. He happened to flip to a page of a place called Westbury, in England, that has natural salt formations in the shape of big, white horses. One of our favorite pets is a big, white Percheron we call Big Daddy, and Al said, 'Westbury Stables, that's a great name.'

There were a few lessons learned when the Figliolias went to buy those first broodmares. They went to Keeneland to purchase a mare with \$250,000 burning

a hole in their pockets. "We thought for that money we'd get something wonderful," Nora said. "And we're sitting there for a couple of days and they're going for \$4 million, \$3 million; and then after a few days the prices were getting more reasonable—\$1 million, \$800,000. And we're looking at each other and feeling very intimidated."

The Figliolias' plan starting out was to create a small, quality operation. They currently have 16 broodmares with a goal of getting to 20, and tend to go about their business in a quiet and efficient manner.

"Al and I are both dedicated and focused people," said Nora. "When we first met Leo Hamill, from whom we bought our farm, we realized he was dedicated to creating good stock, and kept things close to the vest. But people knew if they were buying a horse off his farm, it was going to be a good, quality horse that was well-raised; one that had been handled and taken good care of; and that's exactly our philosophy as well. We started with just a couple of broodmares and wanted ones with nice pedigree and conformation. We breed them to nice stallions and wanted to stay small enough where we could keep our hands on them and our eyes on everything.

"We were watching a training race recently that included one of our babies who had just started to work, and they had 10 or 11 horses in the field and three or four of them wouldn't load; one dropped the jockey; and our little filly came along and she walked right into that gate and Al and I looked at each other and said, 'See? See?' "

After their early adventure at Keeneland,

They purchased Unbridled Girl (Unbridled—Sound Wisdom, by Pirate's Bounty) at the 2004 Ocala Breeders' Sales Co.'s January mixed sale for \$95,000. Their first breeding of Unbridled Girl, to Harlan's Holiday, produced Denis of Cork, winner of the Southwest Stakes (gr. III) and dual-classic placed earner of \$613,252. Denis of Cork is being pointed toward a 4-year-old campaign in 2009 by owners

Mr. and Mrs. William K. Warren Jr. and trainer David Carroll. The Figliolas sold Unbridled Girl, in foal to Harlan's Holiday, to S.K.A.S. for \$750,000 at the 2008 Fasig-Tipton November mixed sale in Kentucky. She was consigned by the Vanlangendoncks' Summerfield, agent.

They bought Angel Kate (Mt. Livermore—August Days, by In Reality) for \$80,000 at the 2002 OBS October mixed sale, and their first breeding of her, to Bro-

ken Vow, produced Just for Keeps, winner of the 2008 Mamzelle Stakes at Churchill Downs. Just for Keeps placed in three additional stakes contests in 2008 and has made better than \$227,000 to date for Ken and Sarah Ramsey.

Our Patty (Personal Flag—Axe Creek, by Gulch) was one of the first mares purchased by Westbury Stables, and she produced Deep Dish Pie, by Hennessy, who won the 2007 Prix des Sablonnets in France and was runner-up in two additional stakes events there. The Figliolias also bought stakes winner Amber's Way (Forest Wildcat—Simply Saucy, by Lord Avie) for \$135,000 at Keeneland November in 2004, and she has a yearling Songandaprayer filly and was bred to Fusaichi Pegasus.

The Figliolias have leaned heavily on their established friends in the business for education. "Being that we're surrounded by these wonderful people," said Nora, "I feel if we can learn what they've forgotten, then we'll be successful. I try to watch the mares, watch the horses, be aware, go to the sales and watch people look at horses. Every day is a learning curve, and that's actually a wonderful thing."

Last spring they experienced a really wonderful time, what with Just for Keeps winning the Mamzelle on Thursday of Derby week, Awesome Chic running in the Kentucky Oaks (gr. I) the next day, and Denis of Cork competing in the Derby the day after that.

"For us to win (as breeders) the Mamselle that Thursday—wow," said Nora. "And the best part was going to the barns in the mornings and the mist is on the track and you hear the hoofs before you see the horses come out of the mist. We were sitting with a gentleman there one morning—Bennie Stutts—and he was so

eloquent talking about when he was a little boy he'd sit on the fender of his father's truck and watch the Derby contenders. He worked his entire life dreaming, and he finally made it to the Derby. And I looked at my husband and started to cry. We were so blessed to be there, and hopefully we'll be able to do something good with the success we might have."

Along those lines, the horses campaigned by the Figliolias race for a cure for cancer, and their silks have ribbons on them indicating such. Although those racehorses have up till now been ones that didn't sell at auction, Al and Nora have caught the racing bug and plan to keep one horse back per year to race.

The couple really enjoys studying pedigrees and picking out matings. They put out feelers and send pages on their mares to stallion stations to get an idea of what studs they'll be able to go to. Then they like to make their decisions soon after the stallion fees come out in November. They've sent their mares to stallions such as Harlan's Holiday, Awesome Again, Dynaformer, and Fusaichi Pegasus. While most of the Westbury mares go to Kentucky, some are kept in Florida, and the Figliolias would like to see the Florida breeding program flourish.

"We've gotten involved in building a small stallion portfolio here in Florida," said Nora. "If people would stand their ground down here and keep some of their top stallions here...there are a lot of nice mares here with several farms building good broodmare bands. We'd love to see some of these mares stay and be bred down here."

Awesome Chic and Denis of Cork have been the stars of the Westbury operation, and were early standouts, although not as early as when some people claim they

can tell who will excel.

"The people who talk about 'the minute he was foaled out we knew...' really get me," said Nora. "I say, 'How the heck did they know that?' Denis is a very flashy individual. He was always athletic and playful. Awesome Chic-when we turned her out in the field, her hoofs didn't hit the ground. She would gallop around and around, stop to take a drink, look at us, and back she went to galloping.'

The Figliolias have developed their farm into a showplace, thanks to Al's talent for design and development. Of the six barns presently on the grounds, the eight-sided yearling barn is the pride and joy of the operation, featuring 20 stalls, an observation deck, and even a chandelier. Just completed is a barn for the mares, with another one on the drawing board, actually an original barn on the farm that Al wants to rebuild, along with a covered bridge to connect the two broodmare barns. There is also a quarantine barn for horses coming off the track or back from sales.

Nora is quick to credit key staff members for Westbury's success. Melissa Bailey serves as farm manager and was formerly a Navy nurse. With a background in both medicine and horses, she has well-rounded experience for her job. Al Morton serves as special projects manager in charge of all the new construction of barns and roads. There is an elaborate underground piping and plumbing system that draws runoff into the farm's various ponds, some of which include fountains.

From the sage advice of their friends, to the beautiful environs of their farm, to raising Thoroughbreds, to achieving remarkable success quickly, the Figliolias are cognizant of their good fortune, and they are enjoying each moment of it.

"We are very religious people," Nora said, "and we feel we've been very blessed here. We've been blessed to be able to take care of the horses, because this is really their success. We're giving them the opportunity. We feel very responsible because we take them out of their natural environment and run a business, but the bottom line is your product is a living thing, so there is a big responsibility to give them the utmost care.

The miracle of life is what's so great about this. Having the opportunity to be with the mares and be there when they foal out, and to hold that life. Hearing the mare nicker to that foal and having that big brown eye look up at you and then watching it grow and having it go out and do something productive and knowing you gave it a good start. It's wonderful, a complete miracle."
