Trevor Denman still thrills fans after 30 years of race calling at Santa Anita

rainer Vladimir Cerin will sometimes spend time between races at Santa Anita Park or Del Mar in the announcer's booth visiting with race caller Trevor Denman

"I get so nervous for him," began Cerin, who is Denman's one close friend among the horsemen in California. "It's three minutes to post and we'll be talking about why a soccer team isn't playing a certain forward more, and I'll say to him, 'Trevor, you have to get ready for the race.' And he'll lean into the microphone and announce, 'The horses are approaching the starting gate.' And he'll turn to me and say, 'Yeah, but I don't like that forward, he doesn't deserve to be playing more minutes,' and I'm like, 'Trevor, go call the race.' And he'll say, 'Nah, we have time.' He literally memorizes the horses' names as they're going into the starting gate. It's amazing."

Having begun his 30th year calling the action at Santa Anita, perhaps it is not surprising that Denman has his routine so down pat. The youthful-looking native of South Africa, who could pass for two decades younger than his 60 years, has long since crossed the threshold of becoming an institution in Southern California racing. His style, weighted heavily toward description, broke through the barrier of boilerplate race calling when Denman reached these shores in the 1980s, and his voice, tinted with a slight nasal

tone and quality, imparts legitimacy and authority, a natural progression from the stentorian high-pitched calls of the great Frank Caposella, who ruled New York through the mid-20th century.

Denman's popularity comes from a heady blend of style and substance. While his accent creates a dulcet quality pleasing to the ear, that would mean little if not for the verbal portrait he is able to paint as each race unfolds. While he is calling the nuts and bolts of which horses are positioned where, Denman also flaunts an uncanny ability to identify which horses are poised to present a run just as they hit their best stride, a talent honed by his youthful experiences as a part-time jockey in his native land.

"Horse racing was massively popular in South Africa," Denman related. "It was like being in Louisville at Kentucky Derby time. It wasn't front-page news in the sports section; racing was front-page news, period."

Denman, slight of build as a child, was told by a family friend he was tailor-made to be a jockey. He went out to the races as a youngster and got hooked immediately. However, when Denman tried to attend the racing academy that every jockey needed to graduate from in order to be licensed, he was rejected because it was thought he would outgrow a rider's weight requirements.

Denman did eventually ride at the equivalent of a county fair track as a teen-

ager, traveling 500 miles to do so because the circuit was short on jockeys. While the regular riders got the good horses, freelancers such as Denman were able to take out day licenses and get up on the leftovers, so the 16-year-old received experience under racing conditions.

"I didn't do it long enough to figure out what kind of rider I was," Denman said with a laugh. "I do remember not winning because the local jockeys always knew which horses to ride. But I figured if I couldn't ride, I'd be a racetrack announcer. So I called races into a tape recorder for four years and was lucky enough to get a job when I was 18 in Durban, where I was brought up."



The only foreign races available to South Africans at the time were from England and Australia, and Denman was taken by an Australian caller named Bill Collins, whom he terms a "guiding light."

"He was a horseman who knew what he was talking about, and was very exciting and good; extremely descriptive. While I was intent on developing a unique style as opposed to copying anyone, I really looked up to Bill Collins," said Denman.

Denman visited California in 1982 and

called a couple of races at Bay Meadows and Santa Anita. He was hired by Alan Balch at Santa Anita two weeks later and has manned the binoculars ever since.

"I've been calling races for 41 years," Denman said, stunned by that number. "Wait, let me calculate that...yes, that's right. That's just incredible. Wow, and 30 years at Santa Anita. Somebody who is 29 and married with a family wasn't even born when I started here. That's weird. Absolutely weird."

There was a time when Denman worked

every track on the Southern California circuit, which includes Fairplex Park and Hollywood Park, but he stopped calling at Hollywood a decade ago, a move that was crucial to keeping his energy level up for the job.

"The enthusiasm is the same now as it's always been," stated Denman. "I don't feel any different whatsoever. I have a huge advantage, and that is the farm (wife) Robin and I have in Minnesota. That I can go there five months every year is why I still feel 40, and it's definitely the reason I'm not bored with horse racing."

The Denmans own 110 acres in Minnesota but are surrounded by almost 500 more acres of farmland, making it a remote outpost that is the perfect antidote to the remainder of the year spent in Southern California. At his farm Denman catches up on reading—he is a history and philosophy buff—and does chores around the property.

"It's kind of embarrassing when people ask me what I do there," he said. "I can account for about four hours a day and the rest, I don't know. It just flies by. The nearest town is 15 miles away, and you can't hear a thing. It's great. The tough part is coming back to the L.A. freeways. It's scary. I get picked up at the airport, and I can't drive for two days while I re-acclimate."

This year will mark the seventh Breeders' Cup World Championships that Denman will call on national television. Racing's big days fire him up.

"The Super Bowl is different from a regular Sunday afternoon game," he explained. "The key is adrenaline and the excitement. When you're calling a Santa Anita Handicap or Pacific Classic (both gr. I), you have that adrenaline rush, definitely. The Breeders' Cup is all that, plus added stress. It's not that the big fields bother me because in South Africa we were brought up on 20-horse fields. But the catch is only 10-15% of the Breeders' Cup horses have raced in California. So I've never seen 85% of those horses.

"I can tell you from an announcer's point of view, if you see a horse once, it's a whole different ball game. If, for example, I have seen Curlin run once, it's cake. You know his style—does he take a hold of the bit, does he drop back, is he a puller who wants to go to the front? It's not the same looking in the *Form* as when you see them live, and just that one run makes a massive difference. But that first time it's a whole new name to you, particularly the weird names. Awesome Feather...what?"

Denman does have the advantage this year and next of calling the Breeders' Cup from his home base at Santa Anita. "You have your own sight lines, you're in your own booth with your books, and you feel at home there," he said.

One of the rare times Denman has come under criticism was during his first year

at the Breeders' Cup mike at Churchill Downs in 2006. While Denman is adept at brushing off both criticism and the many accolades that come his way, he was taken aback by the arrows slung at him after he was late picking up the run of Street Sense in that year's Bessemer Trust Breeders' Cup Juvenile (gr. I). Much of the incoming artillery came from East Coasters likely upset that New York legend Tom Durkin was no longer calling the event.

"It was the biggest brouhaha in a teacup I've ever seen," said Denman. "Street Sense made a massive move at the rail from last and then went clear before I picked him up. I was late, but not that late. I missed him from just inside the quarter pole to just past the three-sixteenths pole, and it became a mob thing like sharks circling blood, people claiming I never called him or I didn't catch him before the wire. If you go back and look at the race, it wasn't that big of a deal. Of course, I've called 100,000 races and this happened to occur in my second Breeders' Cup race, just my luck. But the flak I came in for was absurd, and 95% of it was from the East Coast. East and West here are like two different nations that are at each other's throats."

Denman also pointed out the disparity in excitement levels between the coasts when Zenyatta was putting together her 19-race winning streak, and as someone who tire-

lessly promotes the game through appearances and hosting various events at racetracks, he feels racing missed a golden opportunity to bring new people to the sport.

"Zenyatta was the greatest, most charismatic horse we've had since Secretariat," he stated, "and she was ignored on the East Coast. I couldn't believe it. This was a chance to get horse racing into the mainstream. She was almost human. She literally nodded her head at the crowd. Sure, you had to use a little imagination, but she's the closest thing you're going to come to being human that I've ever seen



in a racehorse. And we missed the opportunity of a lifetime to sell our sport through Zenyatta because of the silly fact she came from California instead of New York.

"A lot of people who call themselves experts in racing don't know horses. Yeah, they know numbers and speed figures and blah, blah, blah, but most of them have never sat on a horse in their life and they really don't know the sport."

Zenyatta figured in one of Denman's most memorable race calls as he described her run from the back of the field in the 2009 Breeders' Cup Classic

the 2009 Breeders' Cup Classic
(gr. I), culminating with him exclaiming, "This is un-bel-lieve-able!" when she became the first female to win the Classic, a race he terms the greatest he's ever announced. Other Denman favorites include the 1989 Preakness Stakes (gr. I), coming at a time when he was calling the races at Pimlico Racecourse.

"Easy Goer/Sunday Silence was the quintessential horse race," he said. "They were never separated by more than a half-length; you had Pat Valenzuela and Pat Day, two of the greatest jockeys; two of the greatest horses nose and nose to the wire, virtually impossible to separate them. That was a horse race."

Denman also noted that Precisionist was one of his favorite performers because of his magnificent good looks and his ability to win in grade I company at both six furlongs and 1½ miles. He also mentions another favorite, if not so well-known runner

named Hollywood Reporter, "who used to love to bite other horses as they went by him, or at least tried to, so I took a liking to him."

Denman noted that although the racing game in California may not be as strong as it was when he started there, California racing still has an X factor to it, a touch of glamor and glitter that makes it more fun than racing in other parts of the country. And then there is the view from his "office."

"The first day I got to Santa Anita I said, 'Man, did they build the mountains around the racetrack or the racetrack

inside the mountains?' It is just spectacular. And the same could be said for Del Mar. How many racetracks are on the ocean?"

A fringe benefit to his Los Angeles locale is the film and television work Denman has picked up along the way. He has appeared in films such as "Let It Ride," "Dreamer," and "Simpatico," and on TV series such as "The Simpsons," "Luck," and "Jockeys."

Less known about Denman is that he is a racehorse owner as well, and lights up when speaking about Kings Call, a 5-year-old who is a winner of three races in South Africa.

"He's on the cusp of being a big-time horse," said the proud owner, "but he's had a bleeding problem and an ankle problem—you know horse racing. I call the trainer and tell him what to do. Of course, I've known him for 40 years. If he gets into a stakes race and I'm not working, we'll go over there to see him run."

When Denman leaves work for the day, he also leaves the world of horses behind him. Aside from reading, a good portion of his attention is taken up by soccer. And he'd rather talk current events than horses while on his own time. That, and his preference for privacy and not wishing to be seen as playing favorites, precludes his socializing with horsemen.

"There's only one subject racing people want to talk about," he said. You ask, 'What's going on with Afghanistan?,' and they'll say, 'What claiming price is he in for?' "

Some of Denman's biggest fans are the people he works for. Said Joe Harper, CEO of the Del Mar Thoroughbred Club, "At the risk of having to pay him a lot more money, Trevor is the best race caller I've ever heard. He also does all the publicity you ask him to; he hosts the Doughnuts at Del Mar program and is so good at bringing out people's personalities and getting the public to understand the sport. He's got a magnetic voice and a personality where he can put a race across whether people know the sport or not."

George Haines, president and general manager of Santa Anita, added, "We at Santa Anita take pride in 'ownership' since Trevor was first hired here. He opened up the racing world to a new way of calling, and it was very controversial at the beginning. His call is so distinctive and mesmerizing, and his ability to pick up a horse in mid-pack who is making a move still amazes me."

Of his popularity in California, Denman said, "Obviously you're flattered when people tell you they enjoy what you do; you'd rather hear that than the opposite, but I try to put it in my back pocket and pretend I didn't hear it. You try not to let it get to you, because if you start thinking that way, you're gone."

Others, though, will continue to sing his praises. Said Cerin, "It comes down to this: If you're late getting to the races and you're in the parking lot listening to the race call, who is the number one person you want that call to come from? It's unequivocally Trevor. You know if your horse is in trouble even if he's on the lead, and you know when your horse is in fifth at the quarter pole but you'll ultimately be the winner."
