## On the Road

Jonathan Sheppard keeps on moving and winning

#### BY ESTHER MARR

**ON A BLUSTERY** day in late February, Hall of Fame trainer Jonathan Sheppard made a sidetrip to Kentucky, taking a rare break from his demanding schedule to celebrate an old friend's 30th birthday. The visit wasn't with a human acquaintance but with a dear Thoroughbred, one that helped shape the trainer's storied career.

As Sheppard fed the now-pensioned Storm Cat some treats at Overbrook Farm near Lexington, he couldn't help but reflect on days gone by. It seemed only yesterday Sheppard had trained the son of Storm Bird to a victory in the 1985 Young America Stakes (gr. I) at Meadowlands and a close runner-up finish in that year's Breeders' Cup Juvenile (gr. I) at Aqueduct.

Sheppard also recalled how he and his wife of 20 years, Cathy, convinced owner William T. Young to deviate from his business plan and retain Storm Cat as a stallion. At the time, Overbrook typically sold all of its stallion prospects when their running careers were done. The Sheppards' conviction and persuasiveness resulted in the farm standing one of the most influential sires of modern times.

Storm Cat is now enjoying his retirement, but Sheppard is far from slowing down. Spend a few minutes with the 72-year-old horseman and Ashwell, England, native, and it is clear the zeal for his vocation still burns brightly.

He gets his thrills on the road, either checking on his horses (many of which he has also bred and owns) stabled at Ashwell Stables, his home base near Unionville, Pa., or at racetracks throughout the country.

Heralded for his triumphs in both steeplechasing and flat racing, Sheppard quickly credits one of his early mentors for

"Probably the most important thing I

learned in racing was from (steeplechase trainer) Burley Cocks, who was an extremely good, natural horseman and never gave up on a horse," said Sheppard. "With every horse he had, he thought it had to be a good horse; he just had to figure out how to get it out of him. I learned you don't just treat horses as disposable commodities but as living beings that have potential."

Sheppard has carried that philosophy

with him throughout the years-with horses such as four-time United States champion steeplechaser Flatterer, and more recently with 2008 champion grass female Forever Together and 2009 champion female sprinter Informed Decision, all of whom required patience to extract their full potential. Aside from their successes, these horses are a testament to the trainer through their owners, who have been Sheppard's clients for more than 40 years: Bill Pape had Flatterer, and George Strawbridge Jr.'s Augustin Stables had Forever Together and Informed Decision.

#### **Early Years**

Sheppard's association with horses goes back as far as he can remember. He grew up riding in a pony club, fox hunting, and racing ponies with his brother through the English countryside.

'We had friends in nearby villages, and we would ride over and spend the day playing games on our ponies, and racing around the fields," said Sheppard. His early hero in the horse industry was legendary English jockey Lester Piggott.

Sheppard kept up with the racing scene because his father was a track official, and soon he began dreaming of his own career in the industry—either as a jockey or trainer. His father's position, however, prevented him from getting a trainer's license for ethical reasons. Plus, he didn't have the funding to start his own stable, so Sheppard started his vocational career dabbling in a couple of other professions, including the military and the English stock exchange.

"I wasn't very happy doing either of those things. Eventually I was talking with some friends that said, 'Well, if you can't be a trainer in England, maybe you can be one somewhere else," remembered Sheppard. "I thought, 'Well, the only major racing country I know of where I can speak the same language is America."

Following a short stint working with a fox hunting club in Maryland, Sheppard landed his first racing job, with Cocks. He rode for the trainer's Hermitage Farm near Unionville, earning a respectable record and making numerous connections in the industry. Eventually the time came to

"My career was a bit stagnant as a jockey and I had married and started a family, he explained. "I thought (being a jockey) maybe wasn't the best way to make a living, so I decided to get into training.

Sheppard started with a small string of six steeplechase horses, saddling his first winner as a trainer with Haffaday at the Rose Tree Hunt Meet in 1966.

Over the years Sheppard has trained many successful horses—both over jumps and on the flat-for Strawbridge, who has the distinction of being Sheppard's first

"His career as an owner started around the same time mine did as a trainer, so we grew together and one step led to another," said Sheppard. The owner bought his first horses from Sheppard, some steeplechasers shipped from England to the U.S., in the 1970s. "Not all of it was based on success, but rather curiosity piques that encouraged us to go to the next level. I feel

particularly linked to him because of the successes we've had together and the longevity of our relationship."

Two of Sheppard and Strawbridge's biggest triumphs together came with Forever Together and Informed Decision, respective winners of the 2008 Filly & Mare Turf (gr. IT) and 2009 Sentient Jet Filly & Mare Sprint (gr. I). Sheppard and Strawbridge have also teamed to capture other grade I steeplechase and flat racing events with Invest West, Irish Approach, and With Anticipation.

Strawbridge said Sheppard's patience and horsemanship are the trainer's most impressive qualities. He often sends him his most high-strung, difficult horses because he knows Sheppard has the ability to calm them down and get them to concentrate.

"He trains the horses not as if they're coming out of a factory, but as individuals," Strawbridge said. "That's really what differentiates him from other trainers."

Fittingly, it was Strawbridge's horse—Fugitive Angel—with whom Sheppard reached the 3,000-win milestone in flat racing at Delaware Park last Sept. 17.

Sheppard, a former president of the National Steeplechase Association, said he gradually added flat horses to his stable as he gained wisdom in his training methods. He has learned the art of maintaining infinite patience over the years, both with the people and the horses with which he is involved.

"You also have to be quite resilient to bad things happening, because bad things will happen," the trainer noted. "You need to be a bit of a business person, a good peopleperson with your staff, and have energy and enthusiasm for what you're doing."

One required quality that can't be learned is the innate gift of common horse sense.

"If I had a single quality that's helped me have an edge over my competitors, I would say that would be the strongest one," said Sheppard. "Part of that's natural, and part of that is because of my background and growing up with horses.

"I'm not right all the time; it's a guessing game, but as long as you keep your mind open to the fact horses aren't just robots, you're more likely to do better with them."

#### Then and Now

Sheppard may be in the twilight of his career, but he amazingly maintains around 150 horses spread among 20 owners, the most prominent of whom are Strawbridge, Pape, and Edward P. Swyer.

Sheppard additionally co-bred and coowns several horses with the latter two horsemen. Factoring together Sheppard's total earnings as a steeplechase owner by himself, plus the additional money he's earned in partnership, he currently ranks among the leading steeplechase owners of all-time.

"He's got impeccable knowledge and he's as conscientious as they come," said

Pape. The trainer co-bred Pape's Flatterer, plus other grade I-winning jump horses It's a Giggle and Mixed Up. In 2009 Mixed Up earned an Eclipse Award as champion steeplechaser.

The best runners Sheppard co-owned with Swyer (under the name Hudson River Farms) include grade I-winning steeplechase victors Ninepins, Sovereign Duty, and Arcadius. In 2010, Arcadius gave Sheppard his 1,000th career steeplechase victory as a trainer when he captured the grade I Helen Haskell Sampson Hurdle Stakes at Monmouth Park.

"(Sheppard) knows when (our horses) are ready and knows where to race them," said Swyer. "Also, even though my experience with horses is limited, he'll always ask my opinion, and I appreciate that," Swyer added. "As a partner, his word is his bond; we don't even have to shake hands."

As a breeder, Sheppard likes to be in control of the decision-making from start to finish.

He currently has a band of 15-20 broodmares at his Pennsylvania farm. He plans all his own matings, around 50% of which are with regional stallions versus Kentucky stallions.

"I decide who they're going to be bred to, when they're going to be weaned, how they're going to be broken, when they should go into training, which ones need more time, and which ones should be flat horses and jumpers," said Sheppard. His best broodmare, Effervescent, has produced two stakes winners, both of which he owned and trained. "It's a pretty multifaced program, and I'm rather intrigued by that and enjoy it."

Sheppard's weekly routine involves constantly circulating among the areas where he is most needed. He currently has barns

at Tampa Bay Downs and Gulfstream Park in Florida; Camden Training Center in South Carolina; Fair Hill Training Center in Maryland; and at his own Ashwell Stables. The trainer also has divisions at Keeneland during the spring and at Presque Isle and Saratoga Race Course in the

Sheppard likes to be present when his horses are doing gate work, schooling, and racing. When he can't be there in person, however, he relies on his 80-member staff, which includes eight assistant trainers and barn managers.

#### **Northeast Focus**

Chance may have brought Sheppard to the Northeast, but it's no accident that he has made Unionville his home base since

"It happens to be a good central location to most of the tracks in the Mid-Atlantic area," said Sheppard of his Ashwell Stables, which is tucked far away from the bustle of other Thoroughbred operations. "With the slots money in Delaware, Pennsylvania, Maryland, and New York, they're all just a short van ride away, and it's good prize money and lots of oppor-

Sheppard and his staff utilize around 300 acres in Unionville among Ashwell's broodmare operation, training facility, training track, and rented adjoining properties, The horses are worked over steep hills and wooded bridle trails to help develop both stamina and speed.


It may seem easy to forget some of the many horses that have served the trainer well, but Sheppard makes sure to keep up with all his former runners, wherever they

"I do have an emotional attachment to the horses for whom I had a special affinity," said Sheppard, who also visited Forever Together and Informed Decision-now broodmares at Stone Farm—during his recent trip to Kentucky. "With some people, once a horse leaves their shedrow, that's it. But I'm in the category where the horse means something more."

Going strong in a career that has spanned more than four decades and is punctuated by six Breeders' Cup victories and Eclipse champion titles for 13 of his horses, Sheppard still maintains a childlike enthusiasm when reflecting upon his successes, as well as his hopes

"At some point I plan to downsize, but I still have enthusiasm for the business...I enjoy being with the horses and the camaraderie with the other trainers, standing by the rail and telling stories," said Sheppard. "It gets to be a bit of a way of life." BH
