# The Doctor Is In

Dr. George Sikora builds Mapleton Farm in Buckeye State

**ALTHOUGH THOROUGHBRED RACING** has been reduced to a whisper around the country, the sport is actually causing quite a commotion in—of all places—Ohio.

That's right, Ohio, with ThistleDown's Racino humming from 1,100 video lottery terminals and the complete tear-down and redevelopment of River Downs into the new Belterra Park Gaming & Entertainment Center.

In the middle of the Buckeye State's bustle and positioning himself to ride the growth curve is veterinarian George Sikora. Already an innovator, Sikora has taken veterinary medicine to new levels with a veterinary clinic brokerage firm that spans the United States. He also owns an agricultural managment firm that runs farms in Ohio, Missouri, and Texas. Sikora's newest venture hopes to take advantage of Ohio's approval of racinos by building a major breeding operation at his Mapleton Thoroughbred Farm near Polk, Ohio.

Although still in its fledgling stage, the 200-acre Mapleton Farm has already attracted new stallions Mobil and Lunarpal and has built its broodmare band to 14, with those numbers expected to increase as the industry in Ohio grows.

At age 71 Sikora remains a visionary and is constantly on the go, whether building up the farm or traveling the country for his brokerage firm, Total Practice Solutions Group.

"I still work six days a week," Sikora said. "When I was 30 or 40, I used to work seven days a week. But I enjoy everything I do every day. People talk about retirement, but I don't want to sit in McDonald's drinking coffee every day."

Sikora, who grew up south of Cleveland, knows about horses, having spent part of his youth as a groom at Darby Dan Farm near Columbus during the summers of 1965 and

'66 while attending Ohio State University, first as an undergraduate and then during his veterinary studies.

"After I graduated in 1967, I was single and there was a war going on, and I spent my first two years as base veterinarian at Richards-Gebaur Air Force Base, south of Kansas City in Belton, Mo.," Sikora said. "When I came back, I started on the racetrack. I followed the horses and

owned some claimers. In those days horses would come to the track in March and April and leave in October and November. I had no desire to follow the horses, so I set up a small animal hospital. After a few years I saw where the money came in from, and I went ahead and developed and sold five veterinary practices, and had three at one time.

"When I got out of the practice, I went into something unique. I started to broker veterinary practices from Chicago up to Maine and down to South Carolina, along with two other doctors. Basically, if you're a veterinarian and want to sell your practice, you'd call me and I will tell you what it's worth. I'll then go ahead and find a buyer for you and charge you a commission."

Sikora just recently returned from visiting a practice in Chicago and had a closing in Kankakee, Ill. Meanwhile, another doctor visit a farm in Effingham, Ill.

"I'll probably get those practices listed and then I'll sell them," Sikora said. "That's basically what I do now. I deal with practices in New England and just listed a

practice in Vermont."

Many of the associates were owners or still own practices, and are licensed real estate brokers.

"A veterinary practice is 24/7, and at some point in my career I decided I wanted some time off," Sikora said. "I started the Group in 2005 with Dr. Len Jones, and we now cover all states from California to Maine, down to Florida.

"I also have an agricultural firm that owns farms in different states. My wife and I have that company. I get involved with the breeding and mating and buying, and I have a partner who is in his 50s and does the hands-on vet work."

Just when Sikora thought his life's work was pretty much stable, the major changes in Ohio's pari-mutuel landscape made him reassess the future.

"What drove this whole farm and breeding enterprise was seeing Thistledown and Beulah both sell within six months of each other," he said. "Thistledown sold for \$43 million, and two or three years before that you could have bought it for \$6 million. I knew then in my mind that the slots were a done deal."

Sikora's vet practice had been based at Mapleton Farm, which was set up as a bovine embryo transfer center. In 1980, he and two other vets became one of the first veterinarians in Ohio to collect the embryos from valuable cows and place them in surrogates. They had a dozen or so donor cows come in and would have as many as 50-80 recipients on the grounds

at one time.

"My veterinary practice was located right on the farm, and when I quit my practice in 2005, we got out of that, but I still had the farm," Sikora said. "We asked ourselves, 'What are we going to do with this?' We started talking about the slots coming to Ohio, and that's when we transformed it into Mapleton Thoroughbred Farm."

The farm, which is owned by Sikora along with partner Dr. John Bryk, and an investor, Dr. Terry Ochterski, is 200 acres, with 85 of them fenced pastures, and the rest used for growing hay.

"Our program was this: We were going

to be competitive in Ohio," Sikora said. "I'm not foolish enough to think I can be competitive on a national level. You're competing against billionaires. With that said, I decided I wanted to produce the best-bred accredited horses in Ohio. That is our goal and our focus. Right now we have 17 mares, and we want to get that up to about 24. We have two stallions: Mobil, who we got out of Canada a year ago last November, and Lunarpal, who we got two years ago."

Mobil, a 14-year-old son of Langfuhr, was the champion older horse in Canada in 2004, and won 11 stakes during his career, including the grade III Dominion

Day and Toronto Cup handicaps and the Ontario Derby. In his final career start he was second in the Atto Mile Stakes (gr. IT), now the Woodbine Mile. He retired with 12 victories in 29 starts for earnings of \$1,877,136.

Mobil was represented by 2012 stakes winners Hard to Be Humble, Welloiledmachine, and Mobthewarrior (Tri-I). In 2013 Welloiledmachine and Hard to Be Humble repeated as stakes winners and were joined by new stakes winner Hobnobsnob.

Lunarpal, a son of Successful Appeal, raced only six times, winning four, including the grade III Bashford Manor Stakes and Kentucky Breeders' Cup Stakes, and the listed Three Chimneys Juvenile Stakes, all at Churchill Downs. The 12-year-old stallion formerly stood at Le Mesa Stallions in Louisiana.

"I'd like to get one more stallion better than Mobil at some point in time when the state can support it," Sikora said. "Remember, we don't have a lot mares in this state. We had reached the bottom. It was either the slots or you could close everything up. So I think we're on the rebound and we will be as competitive as our neighboring states—Indiana, West Virginia, and Pennsylvania—once these things kick in and the purses increase. If we can get our maiden special weight purses up around

\$35,000, we're home free."

As for his current roster of mares, several were claimed off the track, others were purchased at the Keeneland sales, and a few were purchased privately.

"I just bought a Johannesburg filly off Helen Alexander who has a nice grade III filly in her family," Sikora said. "You go wherever you can find value. I just try to put things together where we can be competitive. I bought Alpha Heat from Canada, who was a stakes winner and grade III-placed and earned over \$300,000. I sold her yearling filly last fall at Fasig-Tipton for \$50,000. I have to tell you the Ohio market right now will not support that, but in a couple of years it will. So you can't spend \$100,000 for a broodmare and breed her accredited because they're not going to pay that kind of money for an accredited horse yet, but we're still ahead of the curve and we want to stay ahead of the curve. And within 24 months we believe the accrediteds will be worth something.

"We spent money like a drunken sailor. The clinic is still here, operated by Dr. David Hadam and an associate, Dr. Dan Moehring, and Dr. Bryk is still a part-owner. Everything else was torn down or revamped to accommodate the Thoroughbred operation. We've got the stallions on one end and yearlings in the middle and the broodmares on the other end of the farm. We're probably going to wind up with 3½ miles of board fence, and we're probably going to put up a new stallion barn next year."

Sikora believes in raising horses the old-fashioned way and keeps them outside most of the time.

"We have to run horses as horses and you can't baby them to the point where they're made out of glass," he said. "We're not as fancy as Kentucky, but our barns are functional. The mares are put in at night in the wintertime and stay outside all day in run-in sheds. We separate them into two to three groups, with seven to 10 in a group. The more space you can give

them and the smaller the group, the better off you are. We try to do things smart. Hopefully, in a couple of years it will pay off.

Over the next 24 months Sikora said he plans to sell his colts and maybe keep only three or four good fillies and sell the rest. He had four yearlings in 2013 and sold them all. At the farm are three newly-turned yearlings by Lunarpal and 14 mares due this spring that are in foal to Mobil and Lunarpal.

Sikora says he wants to produce 12

http://www.youtube.com/watch?v=9eQvXVK-308&hd=1 to 16 yearlings every year that are for sale. The more the Ohio racing industry grows through slots, the more optimistic Sikora is for the future of the breeding industry.

"They added four more accredited stakes in Ohio, and we're up to 13," he said. "That'll probably get up to about 15 to 20 eventually. That's where our focus is."

As for embarking on this venture at his age, Sikora said, "J.C. Penney set up J.C. Penney department stores at age 65."

Although Sikora's agricultural firm Bonge Holdings lists his wife, Bonnie, as co-owner, Sikora says that is in name only.

"My wife follows the sport passively and is a stay-at-home wife who raised our kids and isn't involved in the business part," he said. "Her name is on everything, but she doesn't work at everything. Of our four children, we have one son who is 50 that helps on the farm full time.

"I've been very lucky in that every day I've gotten up in my adult life since I got out of veterinary school I've enjoyed what I did. It was never work for me. If you love what you do, it's not work. I've been blessed with good health and a good work ethic that is my comfort zone.

"We figure within 24 months Ohio will have enough mares to support the type of stallion we want to get. At that time I'll put a group of people together. We thought when we started this it was a five-year project, and if things progress like we thought they would in the state we would be very competitive. And right now we feel we're right on course."
