Investing in Texas

Century Acres a new player in Lone Star State

ABOUT 40 MILES northwest of Houston, Texas, in an area known for the horse farms that populate its sandy soil and gently rolling hills, there is a new kid in town. It was around a year ago when partners Teofilo "Teo" Mallet and David Ranslem bravely put down roots in the 100-acre property adjacent to Lane's End Texas, aptly named it Century Acres, and gave legs to the venture they had been planning for years.

"This is the best horse land in this area of the state, and being located next to Lane's End was a no-brainer," said Mallet, 46, who serves as manager of the Hempstead, Texas, operation.

Century Acres may be starting out small—there are currently about 25 horses boarded on the property—but Mallet and Ranslem have big dreams.

"We're trying to bring nice Kentucky blood here to Texas," said Mallet, who purchased nine yearlings by sires such as Pleasantly Perfect, Parading, Stroll, and Sightseeing at the 2013 Keeneland September yearling sale that he plans to pinhook at this year's Texas 2-year-old sale.

"I'm hoping a small fish in Kentucky is a bigger fish in Texas," he explained. "We're trying to give the buyer a different option, because we have so few stallions here. I'm hoping that's a winning strategy."

Mallet and Ranslem also own three mares and board another five on behalf of clients. Their goal is to increase their broodmare band to around 15 with the intention of operating as a commercial, breed-to-sell outfit. The farm will also offer boarding, foaling, sales prep, and lay-ups for outside clients.

really caters to hands-on service," Mallet explained.

One of the partners' first purchases was Mimi's Affair, a daughter of Perfect Soul— Luv Peddler, by Black Tie Affair, whom they acquired for \$9,500 at the 2007 Fasig-Tipton Texas August yearling sale. Consigned by Five Point Thoroughbreds, agent, she was bought under their former stable name, Haras Agua Azul.

Mimi's Affair had a modest race career, winning once and running third twice in 17 starts and earning \$8,093. The now 8-year-old mare has since produced two foals for Mallet and Ranslem: a yearling filly by Grasshopper named Soul Affair and a newborn Grasshopper colt born Feb. 11. Due to Mimi's Affair's modest race record and pedigree, Mallet and Ranslem will most likely race her offspring as "sentimental homebreds."

Century Acres' other mares are Rockintotherhythm and Kate's Hurrahy. They bought Rockintotherhythm in foal to Concord Point for \$18,000 at last year's Keeneland November breeding stock sale from Claiborne Farm, agent, and plan to use the winning daughter of Broad Brush—Juke, by Mr. Prospector, as a commercial broodmare.

"I really liked her bloodlines," said Mallet. "She's by Broad Brush and is out of a Mr. Prospector mare, and we don't see a lot of that down in Texas. She also came from a Claiborne family and is a half sister to grade III winner Haka, who I hear Clai-

borne is really high on (as a broodmare)."

Mallet added it was also exciting that Rockintotherhythm was in foal to Concord Point, a son of hot sire Tapit. "We're planning on sending her back to Too Much Bling, which is an A nick," he said.

The farm inherited Kate's Hurrahy, a 19-year-old daughter of Rahy, from its previous owner. A stakes producer, Kate's Hurrahy is now retired and will live out the rest of her days at Century Acres.

Mallet and Ranslem's sole horse in training is Jungle River, a 3-year-old son of River Squall who is slated to begin his season at Retama Park. Jungle River's dam, the El Leopardo mare Amazon Slew, was one of the first horses Mallet and Ranslem bought together along with Mimi's Affair in 2007.

"Amazon Slew was a very athletic, tall filly, but we never got to race her due to an injury," said Mallet. "Unfortunately, she passed away two weeks after Jungle River was born, and he's the first horse we ever bred, so he has some sentimental value. He seems to really enjoy training. He's like his mom—really athletic-looking and 16.2 hands. He's showing a lot of potential and we're hoping that will translate to the track."

The Century Acres land was originally developed by Lane's End owner William S. Farish, who used 300 acres for his own farm, then sold a 100-acre parcel to another horseman. After downsizing his operation, that horseman sold the property to Mallet and Ranslem.

Century Acres, which boasts one main barn and 20x30 run-in sheds for each of its three paddocks, recently acquired an exercise wheel for prepping yearlings. The farm shares a driveway with Lane's End that allows easy access to their stallions and also employs veterinarian Dr. Marcus Hutka, who works for Lane's End. Another selling point for potential clients is the fact the farm is located a short distance from the new Texas A&M Equine Center and veterinary hospital.

"One reason we bought this farm was so we could manage the whole career of the horse—from breeding all the way to the racing days," said Mallet, who plans to eventually install a training track at Century Acres. He is also currently in the process of taking out his trainer's license so he can condition the farm's horses himself. Mallet spoke highly of farm foreman Rogelio Sandoval, who has worked on the Century Acres property for 17 years.

"He worked for the previous farm owner, and then stayed with me," Mallet explained of Sandoval, who fulfills the day-to-day barn duties and assists with yearling sales preparation. "I'd be lost without him; he's forgotten more than I know in the horse business. I was really

"I like to find a mix of what's popular commercially, but also find some stallions that had some staying power and raced past their 3-year-old year," said Mallet. "That's difficult to do nowadays."

Mallet has come a long way since casually riding hunter jumper horses in his native Mexico City as a young boy.

"That's when I fell in love with horses," he said.

Always in the back of his mind were dreams to pursue his equine passion, but living in the city prevented Mallet from riding as much as he wished, and horse racing was difficult to keep up with when he later moved to Texas with his family.

"We didn't have much exposure to horse racing when we first moved to Houston," Mallet explained. "It was difficult to follow when I was young—we only had network TV—and there was no place to buy *The Blood-Horse*, Equibase, and there was no *Daily Racing Form*, except at the track, and Texas didn't have tracks."

When Texas obtained pari-mutuel wagering in 1987, Mallet became a racetrack regular. While attending the University of Texas, he routinely went to the races with his college buddies at the nowshuttered Manor Downs.

"(Manor Downs) used to have weekend fair meets," Mallet explained. "It was a small track...we would go during college, and while we were home we'd go to the Houston track (Sam Houston Race Park). It was really fun...even though I wasn't riding anymore, I really enjoyed the racing aspect of (the horse industry)."

After graduating from college with a degree in economics, Mallet worked for a bank managing assets and later became an insurance bond manager in the Houston area. But he always had a nagging feeling he was neglecting his true calling in life. In a brave move, Mallet quit his job in 2002 and moved to Rockport, Texas, where he lived on a sailboat and learned to fish.

"That was before I got serious about buying a horse or a ranch, but it was when I knew I wasn't going to be in a suit from 9-5 for the rest of my life," said Mallet. "It was my 'discovery' time."

It was during that transitional period that Mallet began studying books on Thoroughbred pedigrees and training methods. He

especially focused on biographies about "old school" trainers such as Ben Jones, who became one of his inspirations in the business. In 2006 Mallet connected with Ranslem through his sister, who was good friends with Ranslem's wife, Leigh Ann.

"He had some clients from Kentucky

and was attending Kentucky Derbys on a regular basis," Mallet said of Ranslem, who owns a retail natural gas company in Houston.

The two men bought their first three horses together in 2007 and six years later purchased Century Acres as a joint venture.

"I looked at (buying horses with Mallet) as a fun thing to try," said Ranslem. "My wife and I weren't that into horse racing, but we enjoyed it. I thought it would be a low-risk activity to do with him. It wasn't a hard sell to get me aboard, but at the same time I knew it was a very tough, competitive business."

Ranslem told Mallet that if they could find some well-developed acreage close to Houston, he would be interested in starting a breeding operation at some point.

When the Hempstead land became available, it seemed like the perfect fit.

"We've enjoyed the farm so far and hope to spend more time out there," said Ranslem, whose two young daughters board their riding ponies at Century Acres. "We are looking to get more of our own horses to the races, and we want to nurture the farm, purchase more horses, train them, and sell them at auction."

Ranslem said Mallet's willingness to take the reins and assume the day-to-day responsibilities at Century Acres has fueled his own excitement for the business.

"Teo's energy and the amount of time he's willing to spend on it are my driving force to keep nurturing the relationship," said Ranslem. "In the past, when things were slow (with our racing stable), if he had let things subside, I would have been fine with it, but he kept at it, and because of that we've been able to set it up for much more success.

"He's very motivated—the things we talk about, he puts into action—whether it's getting new horses or working on the property and the house," Ranslem added. "It's really kept me on his side."

Mallet's enthusiasm is rooted in his passion for the Thoroughbred industry, which he hopes will help establish his operation as a success. "I was really competitive in sports as a youngster, so this is a way to own a sports team for me...you really get to manage the players and their whole careers," he explained.

Mallet and Ranslem know it may be difficult to compete in the upper echelons of breeding and racing while being based in Texas. The state's Thoroughbred industry has struggled in recent years due to the absence of casino gambling that has boosted surrounding states' purses and breeding programs. But the Lone Star State is home to the Century Acres partners, and they are committed to their operation.

"A lot of our expansion depends on the future of Texas racing,"





said Mallet. "If it's going to continue to stagnate it will be difficult to grow the operation, but we're realistic about that. We've made an investment here because we think eventually something will be done and purses will be on par with our neighbors in Louisiana and Oklahoma. If that happens, then in five years we think we could have a full broodmare band."

The most important thing to Mallet and Ranslem is that they are involved in a venture they both love.

"The paperwork and management part is just work, but the time in the morning with the horses—whether it's walking them in, checking on them, or getting them ready for the sales—is what I love," said Mallet.

"I'd rather be in the barn working with the horses than on a beach vacation," he added. "I went from being miserable to doing exactly what I wanted to do in life."
