Springtime for Horses

Ran Jan Racing excels ontrack and in aftercare

ROBERT A. NAIFY and his wife, Jan Van de Bos, began their current Ran Jan Racing stable by purchasing a few horses from the estate of Naify's late brother, Marshall, who died in 2000. But the real roots harken back to Naify's mother, Hannah.

"It started with my mother," said Naify. "She had a brother who liked the races. We'd go to the races a lot because she enjoyed that."

Hannah had emigrated from Syria, and Naify's father, Michael, came from Lebanon. They raised their family in the San Francisco area, and Michael founded the United Artists chain of movie theaters in the 1920s.

Marshall and Robert grew that business and also were pioneers in the cable television industry. Yet they both learned to love racing from their mother. Robert sat on the Golden Gate Fields board of directors in the 1970s while Marshall enjoyed owning racehorses. Marshall raced in the name of 505 Farms, his best horse being 1993 champion older male Bertrando, whom he owned with breeder Ed Nahem.

The Naify family had another branch with roots in California racing history. Robert and Marshall's sister, Dodie, married John Rosekrans of the Spreckels family. Adolph Spreckels bred 1922 Kentucky Derby winner Morvich, the first California-bred to win the classic race.

Today, Robert and Jan, married since 1998, live in the San Francisco house Robert, Marshall, and Dodie grew up in, which was built during the 1920s. Robert and Jan split their time between the Bay Area and California's Santa Ynez Valley, where they own Springtime Farm. Jan has turned the 10-acre former hunter-jumper facility into a home for their retired racehorses, a few open broodmares, and the occasional layup.

They also make plenty of forays to Southern California when offspring of their foundation mare Cambiocorsa compete. An absolute monster down Santa Anita's hillside turf course, Cambiocorsa has developed into a top-flight broodmare.

Mougin, and Alexis Tangier-are stakes winners or graded stakes-placed. Because all four are fillies, they are creating a dynasty that could put Naify and Van de Bos in the winner's circle for vears to come.

The many tributaries of Naify's family that contributed to the creation of Ran Jan Racing are represented in the house at Springtime Farm. The living room naturally sports many of their win photos. Jan has decorated hallway walls with historic Spreckels and Morvich photos, as well as her own photographs of Cambiocorsa and several of the stable's horses.

While she loves photos of "Cambi" and her girls, Jan points with special pride to any photos of Mackelwane. A son of Bertrando, he is the equine starting point for Ran Jan.

When Marshall's horses were dispersed at Barretts in 2000, Bob suggested to Jan that they buy a few.

"We decided that we would get into it on a small scale," said Jan. "We wanted to buy some from Marshall, and we loved Bertrando. Pretty much Continued on page 118

what we bought were Bertrando mares or Bertrando horses."

Robert told Jan that she could pick out a horse. Jan knew Russell Drake, farm manager of Martin and Pam Wygod's River Edge Farm near Buellton, Calif. Drake looked at the list of yearlings and recommended one by Bertrando—Specific Gravity, by Afleet.

"He's so powerful; he's correct—I think he's going to be a real runner," Jan remembers Drake telling her.

Robert didn't want to bid against anyone else in the Naify family, which included Marshall's daughter, Marsha. Since that time, Marsha has served as chair of the Thoroughbred Owners of California, co-owned such major winners as Street Boss and Surf Cat, and is the breeder of undefeated Red Outlaw in the name of Liberty Road Stables.

"Marsha went to \$210,000 and she got out," recalled Jan. "We bought him for \$230,000. I went back to the barn and looked at him before we bid on him. I remember when I was looking at him, Ron McAnally walked by me and said, 'That's a really nice-looking colt.'"

Back then Jan didn't know who Mc-Anally was. Robert told her that he was a Hall of Fame trainer, and that endorsement encouraged them to buy the colt.

They raced their first horses, including Mackelwane, with a few of Robert's

friends in the name of Excelsior Racing. John Shirreffs trained the colt, but Mackelwane didn't want to be a racehorse, running second once in five starts.

Robert and Jan enjoy golfing—one of their first dates came on the golf course and Shirreffs occasionally played golf with them. One day on the golf course, Shirreffs and Jan discussed Mackelwane's future. That's when Shirreffs changed the course of Jan's life by suggesting that she take some riding lessons so that she could eventually ride Mackelwane.

"I've always been an athlete," said Jan. "John really prompted me to begin riding."

Not only did that suggestion begin Jan's riding career, it eventually led to Springtime Farm when Jan realized they needed their own farm for the retirees.

"My aftercare program is as important to me as the racing, if not more important," said Jan. "Every decision I make on the racetrack, I think about what is their future. Are they going to be a broodmare? If they are geldings, are they going to go to a show home? I'd like to make Bob proud, and I want to do the best for all of my horses. I want to give each one of them every opportunity to excel."

Excelsior Racing, however, did not excel.

"We couldn't win a race—we had terrible luck," said Jan.

Robert and Jan decided to form a stable of just the two of them. Because Robert's nickname is Ran for his initials, they came up with Ran Jan.

Jan found their first Ran Jan winner, California-bred Quisisana, buying her privately and inexpensively as a yearling through Tom Hudson, manager of Magali Farms.

"I told Bob that she's really little and really skinny, but she has a sweet eye," Jan said. "There was something about her. I raised her, and we nurtured her."

Jan proved prophetic, as Quisisana not only won first time out but captured the 2010 Sunshine Millions Filly and Mare Sprint Stakes. Trained by Mike Puype, she earned \$334,158. Naify and Van de Bos still own her. She is currently not in foal in Kentucky, and Van de Bos said she may bring her back to Springtime and breed the mare to a California stallion.

"Then we were able to buy into Cambiocorsa—we really wanted to buy into a nice mare who could be a foundation mare," said Jan.

Hudson knew about Cambiocorsa, who had already won a couple of minor stakes

Cambiocorsa has proved to be a top runner and a successful broodmare

in Southern California for Ty and Lee Leatherman.

"We had her a lot at the farm throughout her career," said Hudson. "We were able to buy half of her for Mr. Naify from the Leathermans."

At the time, Cambiocorsa, trained by Doug O'Neill, was in the middle of her streak of victories down Santa Anita's hillside turf course. She won her first eight races on the course and eight out of 10 attempts on it overall. After Ran Jan bought an interest in her, she captured the 2006 Las Cienegas Handicap (gr. IIIT) and Senator Ken Maddy Handicap (gr. IIIT) en route to earnings of \$522,055.

Hudson was helping Naify and Van de Bos buy some broodmares, and as the Leathermans didn't want to be in the breeding business, he recommended that they buy out the Leathermans' interest in Cambiocorsa.

"This is a great mare," Hudson told them. "She's a great racehorse, and she's going to make great babies."

A California-bred daughter of Avenue of Flags—Ultrafleet, by Afleet, Cambiocorsa is a full sister to California Flag. That multiple graded stakes winner won the 2009 Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint.

Hudson recommended that they send Cambiocorsa to Kentucky. He and Naify selected the sires to cross her with and came up with a stakes horse every time.

Bred to Ghostzapper, Cambiocorsa pro-

duced Schiaparelli in 2008. Trained by Puype, Schiaparelli won the 2013 Royal Heroine Mile Stakes (gr. IIT) and Great Lady M. Stakes, earning \$274,184. Midway through her racing career, Schiaparelli had problems with her front fetlocks, and Jan brought her to Springtime Farm, caring for her until she could return to the track and become a stakes winner. Schiaparelli is now in foal to Tapit.

Second came Vionnet, by Street Sense. Trained by Puype and Richard Mandella, she earned \$175,140 and placed in three stakes, including the 2013 Rodeo Drive Stakes (gr. IT). She is in foal to Kitten's Joy.

Moulin de Mougin, by Curlin, and Alexis Tangier, by Tiznow, arrived next and are both in training with Mandella. The two of them combined for the ultimate highs and lows in racing this past Sept. 27.

Moulin de Mougin, coming off a sparkling victory in the John C. Mabee Stakes (gr. IIT) at Del Mar, was tuning up for a possible Breeders' Cup start in the Rodeo Drive Stakes (gr. IT) while Alexis Tangier was entered in the Unzip Me Stakes.

Turning for home in the Rodeo Drive, Moulin de Mougin was poised for a big effort when she clipped heels, slipped, and tumbled to the ground in a spill that looked devastating. Amazingly, she

righted herself and sped off without jockey Mike Smith, apparently suffering only a couple of cuts.

Jan, who fondly calls Moulin de Mougin "Big Ears," was so upset that two races later, when Alexis Tangier defeated Gender Agenda by a neck in the Unzip Me, she was still in tears as she and her husband accepted the trophy.

A couple of weeks later Van de Bos, Mandella, and veterinarian Dr. Jeff Blea decided to look further via a nuclear scin-

tigraphy scan and discovered some residual bone bruising. They are resting Moulin de Mougin so that she can return next year.

Cambiocorsa has a 2-year-old colt by Arch named El Gran Turismo and a weanling colt by Medaglia d'Oro. The mare, who is back in foal to Ghostzapper, resides at Taylor Made Farm near Nicholasville, Ky., with her daughters Schiaparelli and Vionnet.

Robert and Jan keep about six mares in Kentucky and 10 in California. Jan has been studying bloodlines, and their young horses now include a yearling filly by Cape Blanco out of their mare Vadahilla.

"She is bred like Frankel," said Jan, noting that Cape Blanco is by Galileo, Frankel's sire, and Vadahilla is by Danehill, Frankel's broodmare sire.

Unlike many other breeders, Robert and Jan don't worry about keeping all of their mares in foal every year, so some are currently open, including the three who reside at Springtime.

One of those, Specific Gravity, is the dam of Mackelwane, another Springtime retiree. Bred and raced by Marshall Naify, Specific Gravity is now 22. Jan has pen-

sioned her and will see that she always has a home.

Not only has that philosophy led Robert and Jan to re-home some of their racehorses as polo ponies and hunter/ jumpers, but it has populated Springtime. When Jan is at the farm, she rides several of their ex-racehorses daily. When she can't be there, her crew, headed by Ellie Flores, jockey David Flores' brother, lunges the horses and keeps them happy and healthy.

Many are young Thoroughbreds and full of energy. Seven-year-old Outrageous Fortune, however, is quite content to live in lethargic retirement. He wasn't cut out to be a racehorse and never won in nine starts.

Claimed away from Ran Jan, he ended his career finishing last in a \$20,000 claiming event. Jan claimed him back to retire him. She now does yoga on his back, and he responds positively whenever she calls out "namaste."

Jan goes the distance with her horses. She nursed Diorella and Lady Nydia back to health from fractured skulls. Crazy as a Fox has returned more than once from serious leg injuries. Jan even agreed to give a home to a 24-year-old pony named Shadow, who was owned by the people who sold the farm to Robert and Jan.

Those horses Jan feels can't be rehomed remain with her at Springtime, whether geldings or mares. When a mare can no longer produce or will have trouble carrying a foal, Jan pensions her.

"We don't feel it is fair to dump or sell older mares," Jan said. "We feel morally responsible for their lives."
