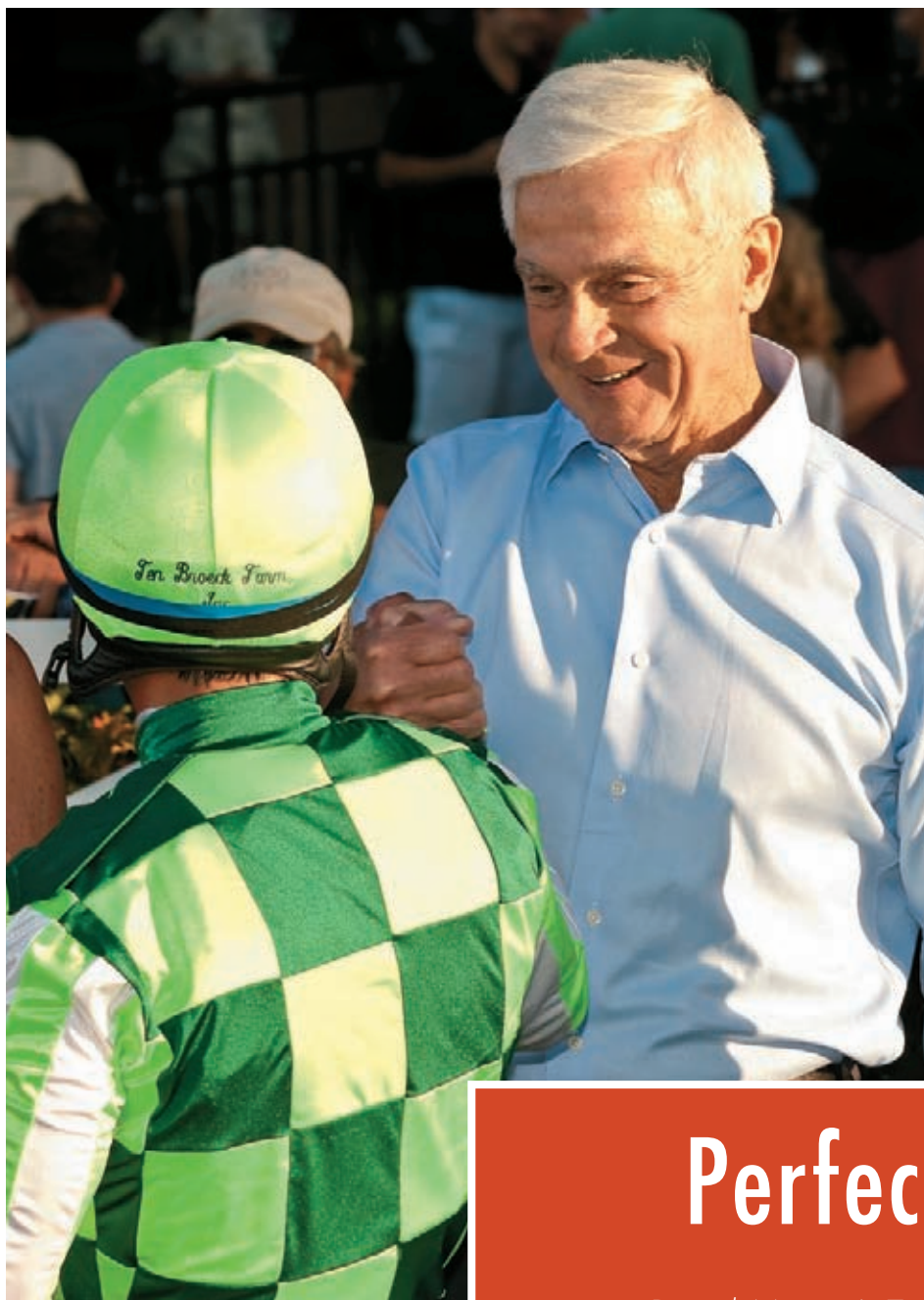

David Mowat's Ten Broeck stable has the glow of success

WASHINGTON NATIVE DAVID Mowat has minimized his Thoroughbred operation, withdrawing from Kentucky—where he once owned Fawn Leap Farm and Ten Broeck Farm—to focus on building a select racing stable. That decision has proved fortuitous for the self-made owner, who still sends his runners out under the Ten Broeck banner. In 2014 his grade I winner Sunset Glow took him not only to the winner's circle with

multiple graded stakes scores but to Royal Ascot as well.

Mowat, 76, has accomplished much in the Thoroughbred industry, breeding 1996 Belmont Stakes (gr. I) winner Editor's Note and half brother Hold That Tiger (champion 2-year-old male in Europe in 2002) along with such stakes winners as A. U. Miner and Sala de Oro—the latter was named champion juvenile filly of 2003 at Mowat's local oval, Emerald Downs.

One of the original investors in Emerald Downs, Mowat got his start in the game when his daughters, Kimberly and Mari, were riding hunter jumpers.

"Driving them around to all the different shows was really my introduction to horses, and the racing end of things just kind of evolved," recalled Mowat, who, with his wife, Pat, had four children, including sons David and Mark. "I'm not sure exactly how it started other than I ended up with a yearling filly and raced her at what was Longacres at the time, and one thing led to another. I wasn't born into the business, but I really enjoy it. For me, breeding made the most sense, and I had to pay attention and make it a business to make it work."

Mowat is a University of Washington graduate who got his degree in civil engineering. Along with son Mark, he owns and operates David A. Mowat Co., a highway and bridge construction company. He took the plunge into the breeding end from a commercial side "kind of because I had to keep selling," and wound up with a pair of foundation mares that shaped his early program.

One was Beware of the Cat, a minor stakes-winning daughter of Caveat who produced Editor's Note and Hold That Tiger along with stakes winners Catnip and Cat-friend. Mowat purchased her for \$280,000 at the 1990 Keeneland November sale from Ryehill Farm through the Eaton-Williams consignment. He sold Editor's Note for \$125,000 to W.T. Young's Overbrook Farm

at the 1994 Keeneland September yearling sale, while Hold That Tiger went for \$1.1 million as a weanling from the Lane's End consignment at the 2000 Keeneland November sale when Demi O'Byrne signed the ticket on behalf of Coolmore.

Not only did Editor's Note win the Belmont but he finished third in the 1996 Preakness Stakes (gr. I) and 1995 Breeders' Cup Juvenile (gr. I). He also competed in the 1996 Breeders' Cup Classic (gr. I). Hold That Tiger earned his European championship with victories in the Grand Criterium Lucien Barriere (Fr-I) in France and

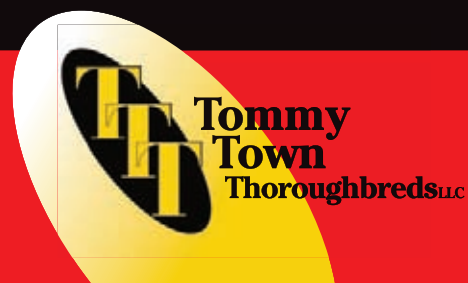

the Anheuser Busch Railway Stakes (Ire-III) in Ireland, and was sent to the United States to finish third in the 2002 Bessemer Trust Breeders' Cup Juvenile (gr. I), second in the 2003 Woodward Stakes (gr. I), and fifth in the 2003 Breeders' Cup Classic.

Another key mare was stakes winner Won't She Tell, a half sister to Affirmed, found by Washington bloodstock agent Tim McMurray. The daughter of Banner Sport produced grade III winners White Crown and Drilling for Oil and was acquired privately from her breeder, E.C. Johnston Jr.

"Tim found Won't She Tell out in Texas, of all places," Mowat said. "I remember him calling me up one day and saying, 'I found a half sister to Affirmed!' and I thought, 'Wow, let's take a look!' He flew out and bought her; she was one of my foundation mares

that was really good, a very, very pretty mare. She's still got daughters that are floating around—Gainesway's got one. She was a horse by a nondescript stallion but out of a wonderful mare and the family has been great."

Mowat's Fawn Leap Farm bred Belmont winner Editor's Note

Ten Broeck Farm, in central Washington, is 165 acres

breeders and sold pretty much everything at the Keeneland sales as yearlings,” Mowat said. “I always actually bred to proven stallions. Storm Cat was kind of my go-to guy. He was good to us. I tried to breed to the best stallions I could afford and tried to upgrade mares as well as I could.”

Among the horses sold by Mowat was Coordinator, a son of Deputy Minister out of Won't She Tell. D. Wayne Lukas went to \$775,000 for the colt to top the 1993 Keeneland September yearling sale. Coordinator, who only ran twice, was purchased by Bob and Beverly Lewis. The following season they went to \$325,000 for the mare's Dr. Caton, a son of Seattle Slew who finished second in the 1996 Buick Haskell Invitational Handicap (gr. I). Cheveley Park Stud also got in on the action, going to \$500,000 and \$320,000 for group III-placed Wind Cheetah (by Storm Cat) and stakes-placed Confidante (by Dayjur), respectively, at the 1995 and 1996 Keeneland September yearling sales.

“I took quite a few fillies off the track and put them in our broodmare band. I've had the best luck with horses that have actually been decent racehorses—never had any world-beaters on the racing end, but always had good pedigrees and tried to stick with the best conformation we could afford,” Mowat said.

When Mowat sold Ten Broeck in Kentucky, he took the name back to central Washington after purchasing a 165-acre farm near Ellensburg, Wash. Developing about 20 acres for horses and

maintaining the rest as a timothy hay operation, he dabbled in pinhooking for a while. His farm includes a barn, paddocks, a few three-acre pastures, and round pens but does not have any horses stabled there currently.

“We mostly were pinhooking weanlings out of the Keeneland November sale, bringing them back to Washing-

ton, raising them, and sending them back and selling them in September,” Mowat said. “Our breeding industry is not too good out here right now, so it would have been a struggle to continue. Now my focus is more on the racing end—that's what I'm enjoying the most right now. We'll look for a horse or two at the sales, but that's about it.”

Sunset Glow, bred by Gayla Rankin/GLR Ranch, was a 2013 Keeneland September yearling sale purchase selected by Ben McElroy from the Eaton Sales consignment. The Exchange Rate filly out of the Dynaformer mare Perfect-forthepart won the Sorrento Stakes (gr. II) and the Del Mar Debutante Stakes (gr. I) before a runner-up finish in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf (gr. IT). Prior to those adventures, she headed to Royal Ascot and ran second in the Albany Stakes (Eng-III) for trainer Wesley Ward.

“We got lucky with her, and it's been great,” Mowat said. “She's taken me places I'd never been; number one, to Ascot, and that was a great experience. I had my daughter and daughter-in-laws over there with me. We didn't completely meet the Queen, but we got pretty close. It was a great experience. Breeders' Cup this year was also a wonderful experience, and we hope to do it again soon.”

In fact, the Ten Broeck silks got closer to Queen Elizabeth II than Mowat did at Royal Ascot, as jockey Victor Espinoza was introduced to Her Majesty at the English oval while wearing the Washington owner's colors.

Although Ward conditions the majority of Mowat's runners with five at the track for Ten Broeck, trainer Simon Callaghan has one for him as well—stakes winner Warm Breeze. The daughter of Street Sense out of the Gilded Time mare Cry Me a River was a \$130,000 purchase from de Meric Sales at the 2012 Keeneland April sale of 2-year-olds in training. She won the Happy Ticket Stakes at Fair Grounds Race Course & Slots in February 2014 and was third in the Winning Colors Stakes (gr. III) at Churchill in May for trainer Grant Forster before heading out to Callaghan in Southern California.

McElroy, who selected both fillies, said Mowat is an easy client to work with.

"It's great to have somebody like him do well in the business," McElroy remarked. "If I really like a horse, as an agent, it makes your life easier when the client trusts you if you feel that strongly. With any client I'm just trying to buy horses I like—but for David in particular, I'm looking for really nice fillies he can have a lot of fun with on the track, hopefully get that black type, and move

them on (to become broodmares)."

The good feeling McElroy had about Sunset Glow at the sale has translated to her racing career.

"She was good-sized for an Exchange

Rate, a good walker, but what stood out to me at the sale was just her attitude," the agent remarked. "Every time they brought her out, when she was being shown she never tired. She just had a great disposition, a very willing filly. You can see that in her races now; the one thing that stands out to me is her attitude."

Jenny Webber, who has worked as Mowat's farm manager for the past 10 years, echoed McElroy's sentiments about the Ten Broeck Farm owner.

"He's so easy-going and positive, and he really values everybody's opinion and takes everything into consideration," Webber said. "We've toyed with a lot of different things and he's accomplished a lot in the industry, but he's having so much fun with the racing and so much success that we're pretty much sticking to that and enjoying it. He's a great guy to work for; I got really lucky in that regard."

Mowat said he tries to keep his operation low-key and he likes flying under the radar. But with a talented arsenal of fillies in his stable, the Ten Broeck owner has the potential to be making noise in the racing industry for years to come. **BH**
