THE MARYLAND THOROUGHBRED breeding industry, already in steep decline, practically disintegrated when the financial crisis hit in 2008.

At Country Life Farm near Bel Air, brothers Josh and Mike Pons were more fortunate than most who watched as their livelihoods fell apart. The farm, founded by their grandfather Adolphe, who planned the mating that produced Man o' War, had made the star stallion Malibu Moon and had retained a sizable portion in him once he


moved on to greater glory in Kentucky in 2003.

With Malibu Moon providing a safety net, the Pons brothers concentrated on finding income at their Merryland Farm—less than three miles from Country Life which they had purchased from Delaware Park owner Bill Rickman in 2001.

"We adapted," Josh Pons said. "We fixed the racetrack up at Merryland, and we started breaking more and more yearlings. We morphed into a racing-partnership,

yearling-breaking, racehorse-training operation in Merryland. We rested the fields (at Country Life), re-seeded, sprayed for weeds, and grew hay for a couple of years."

Longtime clients, who supplied the mares and boarders at the heart of their business, either took their horses up the road to stallions in Pennsylvania and New York or retreated to the sidelines.

"It was like everything ran north, like I-95 only went one way," Mike Pons said.

The 2010 Maryland equine census reported a total of 16,040 equine facilities throughout the state, a drop of 21% from 2002. This included boarding venues, commercial and private breeding operations, farms, and private residences where horses were kept for recreation.

Yet the Thoroughbred breeders in Maryland, such as the Ponses, proved a resilient lot, and they dug in, diversified, prayed for good fortune, and waited.

"They were struggling, to say the least," said Cricket Goodall, executive director of the Maryland Horse Breeders Association. "They did anything they could. You saw some of them di-

versify into wine and Christmas trees. Some people started growing hay that they didn't before. Some people got cattle. Maybe they should have been diversified anyway because they have preserved farmland, but they wanted to be in the horse business. They want to do that first. They understood they had to stick it out and hope once Maryland was competitive, they could draw that business back."

That perseverance is now being rewarded thanks to a Maryland-Bred Fund breeders and owners awards program that launched in September 2013, which has begun to pay serious dividends.

A task force ordered by Maryland Racing

Commission chairman Bruce Quade had a simple mission: create a program that could compete with the one in Pennsylvania and make a compelling case for breeding Thoroughbreds again in the state.

Led by long-time state breeder and veterinarian Dr. Tom Bowman and commission member David Hayden, who has produced many outstanding horses including Hall of Famer Safely Kept at his Dark Hollow Farm near Upperco, the task force worked quickly.

They developed a framework for awards that gives a 30% bonus to Maryland-bred horses that finish first, second, or third at all levels of races run in Maryland. They phased in a bonus for the owner of a winning Marylandbred, beginning at 17.5%, which rose to 30% Jan. 1. Another 10% bonus goes to the owner of a Maryland-registered

The industry's horse racing purse dedication account receives 7% of all revenue generated by video lottery terminals at casinos in the state, with 85% of that going to race purses, including stakes races. The remaining 15% goes to the Maryland-Bred Race Fund, created in 1962 as the first of its

kind in the country. For calendar year 2014, VLTs poured \$5.79 million into that fund, according to statistics from the Maryland Lottery and Gaming Control Agency, up from \$4.1 million in 2013.

Breeder bonuses jumped from nearly \$1.96 million in 2013 to almost \$2.9 million in 2014, according to figures provided by the Maryland Horse Breeders Association.

In the summer of 2016, the highly anticipated MGM National Harbor resort and casino is expected to open in Prince George's County with 3,600 VLT ma-

chines. A Maryland Racing Commission report projected VLT funding of the horse racing purse dedication account to jump from \$38.6 million in 2014 to \$81.1 million in fiscal 2017, although Quade said, based on current VLT income reports, that number will be hard to reach.

There were apprehension and tugs of war during the implementation of the program, according to Bowman, as stakeholders argued whether it was right to pay bonuses at the lowest levels of racing as well as whether to begin conducting restricted racing for state-breds, but the program was voted through.

Bullish optimism hasn't been this high in years.

"What's neat about the program is, if you have a Maryland-sired Marylandbred, you get a 40% breeder bonus—or 30% with an out-of-town sire," Mike Pons said. "You're going to get a 30% owner bonus for a Maryland-bred, so you can have a homebred and get 70% plus the purse. You're like running for 125% of the purse, and it's on every race."

On selling this prospect to clients, Mike Pons said, "It's like the birds at the bird feeder: You put the bird feed out there, and they start pecking it up and saying, 'This is pretty good stuff!' "

The results have been nearly imme-

diate: After years of decline, 19 new stallions took up residence in Maryland in 2014. The 751 mares bred during the year may not seem like a lot when compared with the 16,826 bred in Kentucky or the 1,614 bred in New York, but it represents a 16.1% increase from 647 mares in 2013 and is 203 more than the 548 bred in 2011, when the industry hit rock-bottom.


That increase is the largest among any other breeding state in the country in the past year.

"The nice thing about Maryland is the infrastructure pretty much stayed in place," Mike Pons said. "Real good veterinarians, the feed guys, the racetracks—what we lacked were dollars. purse money, breed-fund money. All of a sudden, now that it's coming back again, it's like having an engine and you're putting high-octane fuel in it."

Country Life is standing four new stallions-Friesan Fire, Cal Nation, Freedom Child, and Super Ninety Nine.

Freedom Child (stud fee \$3,000), like Super Ninety Nine, is owned in partnership with Spendthrift Farm. He is the first son of Malibu Moon to stand in Maryland, and, according to The Jockey Club statistics, led the state with 81 mares bred in 2014. Friesan Fire was second at 64.

Cal Nation is owned in partnership with WinStar Farm and Friesan Fire in

partnership with Rick Porter and Vinery Farm.

Mike Pons said Country Life wanted to partner with major Kentucky farms that would then have a vested interest in the success of the stallions.

"I didn't want just a horse, somebody to ring a doorbell and leave him on my doorstep," he said. "I wanted somebody who loved the horse and who would put money up and their mares up to help us, and that's what they've done for us, which is a huge thing."

Mike Pons said that one of the strengths of the Maryland breeding in-

dustry is its relatively modest requirements to register a horse as a Maryland-bred.

"There's no domiciling rules; there are no horse police here; you don't have to be here Oct. 1 to be a registered Maryland-bred," he said. "You have to foal here, and you've got either to be bookended—the foal has to be by a Maryland sire or (your mare has) to be bred back to be a registered Maryland-bred. In any other state—New York, Pennsylvania—you have to be there a minimum of 90 days, 120 days, six Continued on page 48

months, year-round, whatever, to be included in the program.

"The guys in Kentucky can ship up, foal their mares, and bring them back to the stallions they have here. What will happen is, when those babies get sold or whatever happens, they'll all come back here to race because the money's too good."

Breeder Barbara Wheeler, who operates farms in both Maryland and Pennsylvania with her husband, Chip, believes Marvland needs to be careful about not having a domicile rule because out-of-state broodmare owners could take advantage without truly supporting the industry other than

through the stallions.

"Pennsylvania had it (no domicile rule) at the onset of its gaming involvement," Wheeler said. "People would foal out and literally put them right on the trailer and send them back home. I don't know anybody who did that, personally, but that's why they have the domicile requirement.

"Maryland has to protect those funds for people who are truly supporting its

program. The last thing it should want is to have its money taken away from someone in Kentucky or Louisiana because they foaled in Maryland. That would be a hard pill to swallow."

Mike Pons, though, said the mare boarding business has been coming back at Country Life, and he's heard the same thing from Murmur Farm and Bonita Farm.

Bowman, meantime, partnered with his son, Brooke, and Louis Merryman, to open Heritage Stallions near Chesapeake City in 2014, on part of the property of the old Windfields Farm, where Northern Dancer and Halo once stood.



Giacomo, Plan, Street Magician, Tritap, and Seville, who is the first Galileo stallion in the state.

Bowman, 72, has spent his life working in Maryland, and was a former partner at Northview Stallion Station, the leading stud farm in the state.

When Northview expanded into Pennsylvania in 2007, Bowman was at pains to say they weren't abandoning Maryland, just taking advantage of a business opportunity.

"It made sense, businesswise, because Maryland was in dire straits," he said. "So, I'd be lying to say I disagreed with the

move, because that wouldn't be true, but I was torn because of my affinity for the state of Maryland and everything I had invested in. I didn't care how successful Pennsylvania was; I didn't want Maryland to lose at the expense of any other

Like Country Life, Heritage is launching stallions in partnership: Street Magician and Despite the Odds with Larry Johnson, and Plan and Giacomo with Adena Springs. Bowman has his highest hopes for Seville, who won or placed in group I races in four different countries.

Heritage is syndicating the stallion, selling 40 shares for \$15,000 apiece.

"I can't remember the last time anybody

fully syndicated a horse in the state of Maryland," Bow-man said. "Since we announced that we were getting a son of Galileo, there have been four of them coming to Kentucky. I think we accurately gauged the pulse of the people. We've still got to do some convincing."

Bowman doesn't expect a return to the glory days of Northern Dancer and Native Dancer,

but he believes strongly enough in the industry to take a shot with Heritage.

"How disingenuous would it be for me to head up a task force to create a new wave of enthusiasm in Maryland and sort of turn my back on it myself?" he asked.

If the momentum continues, as expected, several issues are in the offing: One is whether the racing programs at Laurel Park and Pimlico should include races restricted to Maryland-breds. Presently, the only restricted events are Maryland Bred Fund stakes races and the sire stakes of the Maryland Million.

"It is quite obvious how Maryland's larger purses are attracting more and more horses from other states," said Richard Golden, president of Northview, which stands the venerable 25-year-old Not For Love, Maryland's all-time leading sire. "Our objective should be to stay focused on keeping as

> much of this Marylandcreated purse money and bonus money in the state of Maryland through restricted races."

Another issue is whether a regional program should be developed.

Discussions are under way among various tracks' managements, after years of stops and starts, to create a Mid-Atlantic racing circuit. Stronach Group COO Tim Ritvo suggested the possibility last November when he announced the replacement of Maryland Jockey Club president Tom Chuckas with Sal Sinatra.

"I think the next step is once they get a circuit for the racing opportunities, then they start a breeders' incentive circuit so you have Mid-Atlantic breds," Goodall said. BH
