Good and Lucky

Eddie Plesa Jr. rewarded with Itsmyluckyday

LIKE MANY OTHER trainers, Eddie Plesa Jr. believes in karma, good luck charms, and whatever other-worldly powers that might help give his horses an edge. After all, in a profession where you lose 80% of the time, any edge is much appreciated.

Therefore, when Plesa and his wife, Laurie, discovered that Eric Guillot, trainer of Moreno, their main rival for last year's Woodward Stakes (gr. I), had voodoo dolls hanging from a tree outside his barn, they felt compelled to neutralize that hex by hanging Eddie's St. Francis medal (to protect animals from harm) on the bridle of their Woodward contender Itsmyluckyday. It must have worked, as Itsmyluckyday ran down Moreno in the final furlong to win one of America's most prestigious races for older horses.

"We overpowered the voodoo," said Laurie Plesa, who is a part owner of Itsmyluckyday. "We figured we'd cover all bases. The St. Francis medal is more about a safe trip, but this time it was for the voodoo."

Of course, it could have been due to Eddie's training of the colt, such as equipping him with blinkers for the first time. But why interfere with a good story?

Itsmyluckyday has been the 65-year-old Plesa's crowning achievement as a trainer, winning more than \$1.7 million (continued on page 50)



while capturing the Woodward, Salvator Mile Stakes (gr. III), Holy Bull Stakes (gr. III), Gulfstream Park Derby, as well as four other stakes, and finishing second in the grade I Preakness Stakes, Whitney Stakes, and Besilu Stables Florida Derby.

Preceding the son of Lawyer Ron, whom Plesa purchased for Trilogy Stable (Marion Montanari and David Melin) and Laurie for \$110,000 at the 2012 Ocala Breeders' Sales Co.'s March 2-year-olds in training sale, were the ill-fated Three

Ring, winner of the grade I Acorn Stakes and grade II Bonnie Miss and Davona Dale stakes; and multiple graded stakes winner Gottcha Gold, earner of more than \$930,000; as well as a number of other stakes horses.

Plesa was riding high in 2014 with Itsmyluckyday; Concealedwithakiss, winner of Monmouth Park's Sorority Stakes; and Sapling Stakes winner Souper Colossal. Plesa also captured the grade III Jersey Shore Stakes with Prudhoe Bay.

Plesa, thanks in great part to Itsmyluckyday, has elevated his status on a national level, as the country now is well aware of what racing fans and horsemen in Florida and New Jersey have known for a long time— Eddie Plesa is a dangerous

competitor who knows how to train a horse.

And why shouldn't he? Saying the Plesa family has been involved in racing is like saying the Kennedys have been involved in politics.

Plesa's father, Eddie Sr., left home at age 12 and eventually became a jockey and trainer. Plesa's son Kyle has his Masters degree and aspires to be in racing, currently working in the marketing department at Gulfstream. Plesa's daughter, Kelsey, has grown up around horses and worked at the barn with trainer Kelly Breen when Breen had Pants On Fire in the Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (gr. I). Plesa's oldest son, Luke, also has his Masters, having studied criminal justice. He currently is a detective in Sunny Isles, Fla., but follows the stable diligently and knows everything about every horse in his father's barn.

Laurie's father, Joe Servis, was a jockey, a steward at Charles Town for almost 25 years, and manager of the Jockeys' Guild, and was elected to the Charles Town Hall of Fame in 2010. Laurie's two brothers, John and Jason, are both successful trainers, with John gaining national fame as trainer of Kentucky Derby and Preakness Stakes (gr. I) winner Smarty Jones.

"My father, who is still alive at age 87, won his first race at Ak-Sar-Ben when he was 13. He rode on the West Coast, in Ohio, and was the leading rider in Cleve-

land and Detroit," Eddie Plesa said. "He was from a very poor family in Omaha, Neb., and by leaving home at age 12, his family was able to feed one less person, and there was money being sent home.

"When my mother, who was from Chicago, was growing up, she moved around a lot, so it was important for her that I would go to school in one place, and that one place was Hollywood, Fla. We moved there when I was 4. I remember we used to play in a park off Hallandale Beach Boulevard near the railroad and horses would arrive by rail car and they'd walk them to Gulfstream. Back then you couldn't drive anywhere in Hallandale without driving over a land crab; they were everywhere. The town would close after the winter. Once Calder opened up it was a big thing having year-round racing in Florida. I remember my father saying, 'I don't care if I have to gallop horses, we're not moving



anymore.' I went to a school called Little Flower from kindergarten to eighth grade and then I went to high school down there. My father in the meantime had been riding horses and went back to training, which was the next logical step. But from the time I was 5, school would get out and my mother would close down the house and we would drive to wherever he was."

Plesa's most indelible memory growing up was when his family lived in Detroit and Ohio and he was walking horses at age 8 for Marion Van Berg, father of Jack Van Berg. When Plesa was 14, his father began training at Charles Town, which seemed like another world after living in South Florida for so many years.

"My father had the fourth-string horses for Fred Hooper, who would send him the worst of the worst in Ohio," Plesa recalled. "He did well and I was working for him. When I got out of school, I would leave and take the bad horses to Tampa, and I'd be there by myself with about 20 horses. We'd get rid of whatever we could and bring others back. Just before Rockingham Park burned down (July 1980), I decided I was going to go off by myself and train. I decided to go to Rockingham, but I needed to go somewhere for 30 days first and the place I went to was Beulah Park.

"I was the second-leading trainer at Tampa and was the second-leading trainer at Beulah with 20 live horses. Every time I ran a horse there would be five or six claims in for it. The reason was, Beulah opened twice a year and they never had any fresh stock and here came these young, fresh horses. Because I was having my horses claimed from me, I was looking to claim others back, but they're all 9, 10, and 11 years old. I couldn't claim them and replace the ones I lost. Of the 20 horses I had, they claimed 16 and I only had four left, so it wasn't worth it to go up north to Rockingham. They claimed me out of business, so I went back to Florida. The racing secretary at Calder, Gary Smith, liked me and offered me a job working in the office. My first reaction was, 'You mean I get a day off?' That sold it to me. So I went to work in the office and eventually became assistant racing secretary at Calder and Hialeah. I was assistant when Kenny Noe and Terry Meyocks came in and took over Calder."

While working in the office, Plesa met Laurie.

The main reason the Plesas got involved in horse ownership was to have something to fall back on and help eliminate the risk of being left with nothing. Plesa had always wanted to own horses, even if it was just one horse. In his mind, if you wanted to hit a home run in this business, or even a double or triple, you needed to own a horse.

"You look at trainers who are successful and they don't own anything, and when the dust settles and the luster is off,

"I can drive a nice car and go out to dinner, but now I don't have anything. I remember when Buddy Lepman, who was leading trainer many times at Monmouth, retired because he trained a horse named Eillo, who was the champion sprinter and the first Breeders' Cup Sprint (gr. I) winner. In his mind, he had two or three shares and he could collect the horse's stud fee for the next 10 vears. So he retired and the horse died and he wound up broke. He had given up all his horses. I look at the game and I say I'm no longer a voung trainer: I remember being at Monmouth with all the old-timers, and I'm not stupid; I know in five or 10 years, maybe I'll be the old-timer. I've always said I need to have a horse."

After his time as a racing official, Plesa felt it was time to get back to the racetrack. When Noe and Meyocks came in at Calder and

pretty much cleaned house, Plesa stayed on, but was shifted from assistant racing secretary to patrol judge, considered the lowest rung on the ladder of racing officials. Plesa was then offered a job at Monmouth as an official, and he and Laurie packed up, moved up north, and lived in a 35-foot trailer they drove up from Florida.

Plesa and trainer Stan Hough became good friends, and after two to three years in the racing office, he was offered a job as assistant to Hough, who had taken over the Harbor View Farm horses.

"I had missed training and having a day off wasn't as important to me anymore," Plesa said. "But providing for my family

was. I was his assistant until Stan quit, and I found myself training 20 horses for Harbor View at Monmouth. But when Frank Martin took over the horses I knew I had no chance with him. Ollie Cohen of Crown Stable, owner of Eillo (Ollie spelled backward), was from Boston and my father had horses for him. He told me he hadn't had horses up in New England for a while and said he'd like to have horses there again. So he sent me \$100,000, and I claimed five or six horses for him, and I picked up some other horses for other people."

Plesa's career as a full-time trainer finally had begun, but he was a bit wary at first.

"Laurie was pregnant and was due in about a month," Plesa said. "We went up there and I picked up the *Racing Form* and read that they had had a shootout in the clubhouse at Suffolk Downs. I'm thinking, 'Oh, my God, what am I doing coming to this place?' There were two indoor barns and (racing secretary) Bobby DeStasio put me in one of them next to the kitchen. Kathy Ritvo was up there. She was a little girl, around 10 years old, and her father had horses."

Plesa eventually became a fixture in Florida and New Jersey, splitting his time between the two tracks. He takes great pride in his job with his first million-dol-

lar earner Best of the Rest, who raced until he was 8 while having to overcome a stress fracture. But knowing what a tough game this is, Plesa has managed to make sure his three children received an education and went in other directions.

Plesa reached his pinnacle with Itsmyluckyday, who brought him to the Kentucky Derby trail and into the national spotlight.

"He's just a horse that I liked," he said. "I buy a lot of horses from Barry Eisaman at Eisaman Equine. He's the kind of guy you can trust when he tells you something, and I have a great rapport with him. So he had the horse. He didn't tell me to buy the horse, but I had confidence in him that the horse was a keeper. He was the kind of horse I was looking for the partnership, and he fell in our price range. That's where luck

comes in. I liked him, I wanted him, and I got him. But if he had gone for much more than \$110,000 I wouldn't have been able to buy him. We were looking to spend about \$100,000. He showed right away he was a class horse. He's just a neat horse to be around. He has a great personality and has become a celebrity around here. People are always stopping by to bring him carrots."

Life is good for the Plesa family these days. They have had success on a national scale, and Luke presented them with their first grandchild Dec. 21, 2014. They take great pride in all three of their children. Although Itsmyluckyday didn't make it

> to the Breeders' Cup, they still were able to participate in racing's biggest day, sending out Live Oak Plantation's Souper Colossal in the Sentient Jet Breeders' Cup Juvenile (gr. I), in which he pressed a brutal early pace before tiring.

> "I don't know how my dad deals with the stress and the excitement, but he seems pretty calm and collected about it," daughter Kelsey said. "He never jumps ahead of things.

> "My dad has been in this business for so long. He's given his whole life to it, and he always puts the horse first and doesn't cut corners. He doesn't have five barns of horses, but he still does really good with what he has, and he's been rewarded with success."
