Clear Vision

At Clear Creek Stud, the horse comes first

YOU CAN'T FOLLOW Val Murrell on Twitter or "like" him on Facebook, but the man who runs Clear Creek Stud near Folsom, La., has more apps on his iPhone than most teenagers. Behind the technology curve? Not this guy. Attention to detail and a penchant for accurate, up-to-date information forms the core of Murrell's personality and is one of the reasons that Clear Creek Stud is the premiere horse farm in the region.

Concepts and theories are just temporary teasers to Murrell. Forget the window dressing; give him the facts and give them to him quick. Murrell can handle it. That basic philosophy has resulted in a horse farm with clean appearance, vast spaciousness carpeted with an abundance of grass, and one that presents an unpretentious efficiency over style points. The consistent and established focus at Clear Creek Stud is the care and safety of horses. You don't need petunias, rows of palm trees, and a water fountain to have an attractive farm.

The term "full service" is alive and well at Clear Creek and with 280 acres there is plenty of room to get the job done.

"Sometimes, in fact, it's not big enough," Murrell said.

On a year 'round basis, horses that are boarded receive constant attention. Clear Creek mares and others that are shipped in for the breeding season are served by eight standing stallions and those mares produce a total of 65 foals a year. Laid-up horses enjoy a swimming pond and a jog inside the 120-foot Eurociser for their recuperation. There is a five-furlong training track with break-away safety rails. Local veterinarian Dr. Lowell Roger is on hand every day of the week. Two vans are provided for owners or trainers in need of transportation. When it comes to sales prep, Clear Creek has a consistent record of being a leading consignor of yearlings at public auctions for several years.

The cowboy part of Murrell (he still has broken ribs from riding Brahma bulls in his youth) comes out in him when describing his favorite task—breaking yearlings. Beginning

with lunging, the process moves to driving and activity in the round pen for three to four weeks. This is followed by slow gallops (about 25 minutes a day) around the perimeter of the farm in open fields.

"It's a routine system but adaptable to a trainer's specific wishes," Murrell explained. "When they put their head down and want to buck we shut it down right there. We never let things get out of control. It's all about learned behavior so you want to eliminate the danger and nervousness. It is not something that you want to rush. There is nothing wrong with just waiting for a better time."

The best example of the full-service operation at Clear Creek is Evelyn Benoit's Star Guitar. Born and raised on the farm, Star Guitar raced from ages 2 to 7, winning 24 of 30 starts. With earnings of \$1,749,862, the son of Quiet American is the leading money winner of all time for Louisianabreds and has come full circle to join the stallion roster at Clear Creek.

People are more important than place and farm manager Michelle LaVoice is an invested link in the success of Clear

Creek. With an undergraduate degree in Business Administration from Loyola University and a MBA from the University of New Orleans, LaVoice brings an "old school," "new school" balance to her position. After watching her first horse race as a 7-year-old at the old Jefferson Downs racetrack, LaVoice sustained her interest in horses while securing an education that could complement her skills in the breeding industry. A progressive thinker in terms of automation, it is LaVoice that quenches Murrell's thirst for iPhone apps. Her natural grasp of the importance of customer service makes her a perfect fit to carry out the mission of Clear Creek. The breeding piece of the business is her secret garden.

"There is nothing more satisfying than seeing a new baby foal," LaVoice said. "To be there at 3 o'clock in the morning and watch them take their first breath. And then after when they go on to do something special like win a stakes. That's awesome."

LaVoice is protective of the number of people involved in the delivery and development of a foal. She is more comfortable talking about her team than tooting her own horn. One veteran member of that team is shedrow foreman Javier Diaz, who has worked on the farm for 30 years.

"When we are in full swing during sales prep time we have about 25 workers," LaVoice explained of the staffing. "Other than that it varies. I just know that when I bring out biscuits in the morning that they go pretty fast."

The 14½ miles of fencing that borders and sections off Clear Creek Stud are one of the responsibilities of operations man-

ager Trey LaVoice. Trey grew up on a family farm, working with livestock and row crops. Along with his crew, Trey works seven days a week with a five-hour break

on Sunday afternoon. They cut grass, feed and water the horses, muck stalls, unload delivery trucks of alfalfa, spread shavings for bedding or do anything else that re-

They cut grass, feed quires a pitchfork, rake, shovel, hammer, or lug wrench.

"When my boys say there is nothing to

"When my boys say there is nothing to do they aren't looking hard enough," Trey said, changing into a new pair of gloves. "Some days may be harder than others but the truth of the matter is that we love what we do. There aren't any clock-watchers on this farm."

On a cold winter morning trainer Gary Scherer arrived at Clear Creek to watch one of his 2-year-olds go to the training track. Scherer races horses on the Louisiana/Illinois/Minnesota circuit and is a regular client of Clear Creek Stud.

"They do it all here and they do a good job," Scherer said. "You could take these facilities and the set-up and drop it right into Kentucky and nobody would notice. Everybody is friendly and courteous plus they know their jobs. I like to send my horses out here because it just plain feels good to be in the country life."

reputation as the standard bearer for Louisiana's stud farms. Displayed at a height level that makes you look up, 13 bronze statues representing past Louisiana stallions of the year are lined up on the wall.

Ready to compete with those past honorees are the nine stallions assembled on the current roster. With pedigree, conformation, and proven ability on the racetrack, six of the nine stallions at Clear Creek are Breeders' Cup nominated. The latest addition to the line-up is Star Guitar. A winner of 22 stakes races, Star Guitar's stud fee is \$3,500 live foal and he has his own website.


A son of More Than Ready, Custom for Carlos hit the board 11 times from 15

everywhere but loose. Murrell was not present. Attending a horse sale in Texas, Murrell watched the storm's eve of destruction on a television monitor.

"I had been through dozens of hurricanes," Murrell recalled. "No big deal. I figured it would be just another near

Wrong. Katrina was more of a direct hit. What flood water did to New Orleans, sustained winds more than 100 miles per hour did to the area around Folsom. Barn roofs were blown off. Fences destroyed. Horses were loose. Yvette Barbazon was farm manager at the time. A Clear Creek employee for 19 years, Barbazon held things together, dealing with frightened employees that were threatening to leave the premises.

A flight from Dallas to Baton Rouge got Murrell to ground



zero. His imagination could not have prepared him for what he saw.

"We got off the Interstate exit and there

was a narrow trail cut through the debris on Highway 1077," Murrell remembered with a shudder. "Two cars couldn't pass each other. Power lines were draped over the road. Everybody with chainsaws was cutting the downed trees into sections and pulling them out of the way."

Murrell eventually reached the farm. Groves of pine trees had been reduced to splinters. Giant oak trees more than 100 years old were uprooted.

"It looked like a war zone. It was mindboggling," Murrell said. "Then, as if things couldn't get any worse, it was over 90 degrees and the humidity was miserable."

With no water, ice, or electricity, living and working at Clear Creek Stud became like a primitive camping trip. Meals were prepared outside in bar-b-que pits.

Murrell is a binge watcher for news and information so the dead airwaves after Katrina were torture.

"It was like gravitating back in time. All we had were these little battery-operated transistor radios," Murrell recalled. "But there is always a silver lining. I learned how to text message."

The miserable conditions lasted for six weeks and during that time the future of Clear Creek hung in the balance. Murrell did not raise the white flag. True to his nature, he assembled a list of priorities that started with the safety of the horses and

the comfort of his employees. With a price tag of \$800 each, Murrell bought 45 generators. Michelle LaVoice remembered the distribution decisions of the equipment.

"There are five water wells on the farm and the first generators went to run the water pumps so the horses could drink," she explained. "The next generators went to our Hispanic help so they could have air conditioning. Unless we wanted to start cleaning stalls, they had to come first."

Throughout the ordeal, the pecking order of "horses before family" was maintained. The storm hit four weeks before a big sale and there were yearlings to prep. One of the top filly yearlings was a non-sweater. Rows of fans, run by generators, were put in place to keep her and the others cooled off in the heat.

"Nobody blinked," Murrell recalled of the crisis. "Time was precious. Everybody jumped in and did what they had to do."

Their efforts preserved a long tradition. The legendary Jack Lohman founded Clear Creek in 1969.

"Jack was an innovator, a brilliant visionary who networked with legislatures and put our industry on solid ground," Murrell remembered. "He was a Masters student at LSU in Baton Rouge majoring in Equine Science with an emphasis in reproduction physiology. His ideas have withstood the test of time but most of all he was my mentor."

Two hours after he graduated in May 1977, Murrell was at the farm, continuing his research with hormones that could enhance the heat cycle of Thoroughbred broodmares. That same year Murrell assumed management oversight of Clear Creek.

"I'm one of the few people you will ever meet that actually gets to use what they learned in school," Murrell said.

Lohman's most lasting lesson to Murrell was the importance of keeping good records. Weighing close to 10 pounds, a black binder in the main office contains the individual files on each broodmare. Hell or high water, Murrell and Michelle enter data at the end of each day that documents categories such as foaling date, sutures, plasma for the baby, heat cycle, ovulation, etc.

"It's a physiological snapshot of each mare at a specific point in time," Murrell explained. "It may look unnecessarily complicated but it can be the deciding factor in whether or not you have a baby. After all, that's the whole game in a nutshell."

In the last hour of daylight, Murrell eased away from the noise. He turned off the iPhone apps and made his rounds to check on the horses. He used to ride his lead pony Willie (named

after Willie Nelson), but these days he sometimes rides a golf cart. From pasture to pasture, the wheels crunch on the freshly scraped gravel.

"There is one fundamental truth about this business," Murrell said while going past the training barn. "We all have a passion here for the work and life that revolves around horses. It wouldn't work otherwise. Believe me, it's not about the money. It's much bigger than that. From rich owners to hotwalkers and grooms, the enthusiasm comes from being around these horses." BH
