John McKee and Cynthia O'Bannon get rewarded by Fiber Sonde

JOHN McKEE and his partner, Cynthia O'Bannon, are bargain hunters in the Thoroughbred world, and their favorite outlet is the massive Keeneland November breeding stock sale.

"We don't miss too many November sales," O'Bannon said as the pair sat in their Beau Ridge Farm office near Kearneysville, W. Va. "One of us would have to be incapacitated. (John) had a hip replaced, and he was on a walker and I had to carry his chair, but he sat by the ring. We go about every year."

McKee, 76, has now had both hips replaced, and O'Bannon, 58, a knee, but they are far from incapacitated. Rather, they are tireless workers up at 4 a.m. to breed, raise, and train racehorses. In 2007 McKee and O'Bannon made a purchase at the Keeneland sale that suggests fashion and commercial considerations can sometimes allow overlooked gems to fall through the cracks. They coveted and landed an unraced 2-year-old stallion prospect named Fiber Sonde, an Unbridled's Song half brother to leading sire and champion sprinter Speightstown, for a mere \$8,000. That's right, a 2-year-old stallion prospect.

The gray colt had gotten hung up in some fencing as a baby, and it ruined his chances for the track.

"He's got white scars on both of his front feet," McKee said. The injury, however, didn't affect Fiber Sonde's ability to *(continued on page 34)*

The West Virginia market initially ignored Fiber Sonde, but it doesn't now.

Although it took some time for confidence to take hold, Fiber Sonde's babies can run, and the now 11-year-old stallion is not only ascending the ladder of Mid-Atlantic sires but ranks among the best in several critical categories.

In 2011-four years after his stud career

MILLIONAIRE MULTIPLE GRADED STAKES WINNER began—Fiber Sonde had just six runners, and four of them won. Last year he had 20 winners from 29 starters and the 69% success rate led all other Mid-Atlantic sires with 20 or more starters. Three of those 20 won a combined seven stakes races.

Seven of his 12 2-year-old starters in 2015 won, with four runners becoming stakes horses. No other stallion in West Virginia comes close to those percentages. His runners last year made a total of 168 starts with 33 victories for a 19.3% strike rate.

Now, McKee said, breeders come not only from West Virginia but from all around the region, including across the mountains from Kentucky, for Fiber Sonde.

The sire covered 94 mares last year, a *(continued on page 38)*

record for a West Virginia stallion, according to statistics supplied by The Jockey Club, and McKee and O'Bannon expect at least that many this year although they admit to uncertainty.

"You never know until they show up here," O'Bannon said. "You have very few people who actually sign contracts. Some people will come in—we have an open house every year—and tell you, 'I'm going to breed to him,' and some of them you never see again. This is West Virginia. It's getting better. People tell us they're going to breed to him, and I would say 80% of them show."

The very first mare mated to Fiber

Sonde produced Grey Tiger, who won. Yet McKee and O'Bannon, who share a barn at Hollywood Casino at Charles Town Races, were as hesitant as the market with their young stallion.

McKee said he kept thinking about the failed sire Buddha, another big, gray son of Unbridled's Song, who won the Wood Memorial Stakes (gr. I) but was a disappointment in the breeding shed.

"I didn't want to breed a lot of my mares in case he was another Buddha," McKee said. "I didn't want a lot of slow horses running around the farm."

Gradually the couple got over their fears. Beau Ridge has a barn for 23 broodmares, and McKee and O'Bannon took the ones

they thought less of and bred them to Fiber Sonde and were amazed when the babies won.

Outside breeders waited until McKee and O'Bannon proved the sire's worth.

"There is a stigma around here," McKee said of the initial wariness to breed to Fiber Sonde. "You know, he doesn't have a lot of horses. We got him as a 2-year-old; we bred him at 3. He's 11 now. So, you've got to prove that they are going to throw runners. Because \$8,000 (his purchase price) is public information. We started him at \$1,000 and that's where we're still at, and I get questioned, 'Why do you keep it at \$1,000?' And the reason is we want as many runners as possible for our breeders' program."

Mark Taylor, vice president of marketing and public sales operations with the Taylor Made Sales Agency in Kentucky, marvels at Fiber Sonde.

"He's probably turned out to be the (continued on page 40)

best sire in the Mid-Atlantic," said Taylor, who has a long working relationship with McKee, offering him client horses that aren't going to pan out as successful runners on the major racing circuits but might fit in at Charles Town.

"The bottom line is there is a fine line between being worth a million and being worth a bid," said Taylor, who stood Unbridled's Song on his family's Taylor Made Stallions. "Unbridled's Song had been a mainstay of ours and Fiber Sonde is out of Silken Cat, who is one of the most unbelievable mares we had on the farm. He was damaged goods going through the sale and people just ignored him. "If you look at it now, it's very hard for a grade III winner to make it as a stallion. The big grade I winners get the huge books—they breed 175 mares apiece. If you get a horse that wasn't a good racehorse, people don't want to breed to them.

"Back in the '60s, '70s, '80s, the average book of the top sires in the country was maybe 48 mares. Now it's three or four times that. In the past three years in Kentucky, the average book size for all sires has gone from 60 to 80. It's a concentration of mares going to the top horses. We sold a horse a couple of years back, Stately Victor, who won the (Toyota) Blue Grass Stakes (gr. I), and there was hardly any market at all, and that's a grade I winner.

You go down to Fiber Sonde, who doesn't even have stakes wins, and as far as stallion possibilities, it's very slim. That's why we have regional programs, and some of these horses can get a chance and climb their way to the top."

One of the castoffs McKee bought from Taylor Made was the Indian Charlie filly Ghost Canyon. Taylor had her consigned as a broodmare prospect but told McKee she could still run. The filly finished second in a 4¹/₂-furlong restricted stakes before bowing a tendon and being retired.

They bred her to Fiber Sonde and watched the offspring, Hidden Canyon, win nine of 14 starts and earn \$313,695 for trainer Javier Contreras. At one stage Hidden Canyon reeled off seven wins in a row.

Other good Fiber Sonde runners include 3-year-old filly Aye a Song, a winner of five of eight starts and third in January in the open-company Marshua Stakes at Laurel Park. Another is Flirting Song, a winner of two stakes and \$186,798.

McKee says Fiber Sonde has responded to mares whose sires are established broodmare sires. Some of his best winners have come from mating with daughters of Indian Charlie, With Approval,

Kris S., and Langfuhr. He just doesn't see enough of them.

Asked if he looks for lesser-priced mares out of proven broodmare sires, regardless how crooked their legs, McKee quipped, "Doesn't everybody?"

McKee dreams about how Fiber Sonde would do with quality mares.

"The only 'A' (nick) mare we've got is right there in front of the house," he said,

pointing to Ghost Canyon.

So far, McKee and O'Bannon haven't brought any Fiber Sonde babies to the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic sales at Timonium in Maryland because "they won't bring what we want," McKee said. "But we might test the waters at any time when we get a little more established than we are. People don't believe they can get that kind of horse in West Virginia. In time, I think he will do OK in a sale."

"We don't have to sell them," O'Bannon added. "We can always bring them home. We've been so successful running them. What's the old saying? If it ain't broke, don't fix it."

Plus, the West Virginia Thoroughbred Development Fund distributes 60% to breeders and those who raise the foals, 25% to owners, and 15% to sire owners.

"A lot of women like Valentine's Day; I like the day after—that's when we get our breeders checks," O'Bannon said, laughing.

At one time McKee and O'Bannon stood as many as 10 stallions, including Arromanches and Explosive Red, buoyed by the advent of video lottery terminals at Charles Town supplementing the state's racing program. Now they're down to two.

They sold their underperforming stallion On Eagles Wings last year to interests in Korea, which they have done with other horses in the past, and Footnotes followed him out the door when a buyer from Argentina showed up at the farm.

"He wanted to buy him," O'Bannon recalled. "He said, 'Is he for sale?' I said, 'Buddy, (John will) sell anything, me included, if the price is right.'"

Fiber Sonde is joined at Beau Ridge by one other stallion, Master Rick, a multiple graded stakes-winning son of the A.P. Indy stallion Master Command. His first crop are yearlings this year.

The operation spans three properties.

Along with Beau Ridge, there is a 60-acre farm near Boyce, Va., called The Hunting Box, where broodmares and some cattle are kept; they also have 60 acres they call the Beau Ridge Annex near Rippon, W. Va., where they raise young horses.

"She has her own horses, and I have mine," McKee said.

Beau Ridge has a 23-stall barn for

broodmares and a barn for 22 2-year-olds in training. By April the young horses will be at the track and broodmares will fill up the barn.

The farm has 12 paddocks and a threeeighths-mile training track. Charles Town management gave them the dirt during a resurfacing. All they had to do was pick it up.

A staff of five, not counting exercise riders, works on the grounds, and the farm grows its own hay and most of its own straw, according to McKee.

The couple are lifers to the area, having

grown up in the shadow of Charles Town Races. O'Bannon's late father, Charles, worked there 39 years, 30 of them as track superintendent.

"She was raised about three blocks from the racetrack, and I was probably raised five blocks, although my family didn't have anything to do with racing," McKee said.

"I've been around racing all my life," O'Bannon said. "I galloped horses as a kid, pony horses."

When they met 38 years ago McKee was running a farm he owned near Bunker Hill, W. Va., living in a single-wide trailer and in the second year of training horses under his own name after racing from 1969-76 under the name of his stepfather, Kenneth Boyd.

"My show ponies were at the racetrack," O'Bannon said. "He said to me one day, 'Wouldn't you like to have your show horses on a nice farm?' He wanted my stalls! I said, 'Yeah, but I don't have a farm.' He said, 'You can take them up to my farm,' and that's how it happened."

O'Bannon laughs now about moving into the trailer, which had a hole in the floor.

"He'd go to Penn National or somewhere, and I'd be at Charles Town," she said. "Back then I still ponied all our horses. Oh, God, that was back in the early '80s. I'd come home and he wouldn't be there, and I'd have to rip the sheets off the bed before I'd get in it for fear of a snake or a rat because of the hole in the floor."

McKee and O'Bannon love to laugh and their conversation is tightly woven, the mark of a couple that gets along happily in close quarters. Both agree Fiber Sonde has renewed them with his success.

"Oh, yes," O'Bannon said. "We probably would be doing something else if it wasn't for him."

"I don't know about that," McKee said.

Stroud's Lane Farm boasts promising stallion roster

" 'WILD BILL HICKOK,' 'The Sagebrush Trail...,' " real estate attorney Murray Stroud said. "There is not a Western that I haven't seen."

Stroud still has the programs from when Roy Rogers, Gene Autry, and their trusted sidekicks Trigger and Champion performed at Maple Leaf Gardens hockey arena. "I've loved horses since I was a little kid."

Having grown up watching thundering horses and virtuous heroes on the silver screen, it is only fitting that Stroud has partnered with straight-shooter Ryan Barbazon in establishing a commercial breeding operation at his Stroud's Lane Farm near Ocala, Fla.—now home to a treble of sire power in grade I winners Seek Again and Admiral Kitten and multiple group II winner Daddy Long Legs.

General manager and trainer Barbazon describes the recent acquisitions as "a hell of a stallion roster for Florida."

All three are sired by trending stallions whose fees were set at \$100,000 for 2016.

Starting Out

Murray Stroud Law Office in Pickering, Ontario, is located due north across Lake Ontario from Niagara Falls and 30 miles east of Woodbine, where up until a few years ago, Stroud raced his horses almost exclusively. He was first involved with show cattle. His Aberdeen-Angus took Supreme Champion Bull and Grand Champion Cow honors at the Royal Agricultural Winter Fair in Toronto in the 1980s. Through his association with cattle, he met Bob Anderson, who had a horse farm near London, Ontario. It was Anderson who put forward the idea of owning a racehorse.

"I bought a quarter-interest in a filly named Star Reputation," Stroud said. The filly placed in the Star Shoot and Victoria stakes.

Stroud's best horse to date is homebred Sovereign Award winner Youcan'tcatchme (The Daddy—Poppy's Baby Girl, by Yankee Victor). Conditioned by a close friend, Sam DiPasquale, Youcan'tcatchme was Canada's top female sprinter of 2013. She earned \$425,710 and was later sold to CandyLand Farm at the 2015 Keeneland January sale for \$225,000.

Barbazon was born into Ocala's Thoroughbred business and set out to cultivate his own aspirations. At one point though, he sought a change after objecting to industry politics and what he called "sugarcoated" explanations from trainers whom he had employed. Fortunate enough to be financially stable, it seemed the perfect opportunity to

pursue a childhood dream of becoming a policeman. Barbazon served the city of Gainesville, Fla., in its police department for nearly four years and moved to the Marion County force. The time away made him realize how much he missed the horses.

"I knew what I wanted to do for the rest of my life," he said.

The break made him a better person and more determined to produce a better horse. A man of integrity and faith, Barbazon believes "Everything happens for a reason."

He spent five years at Forever Spring Farm near Danville, Ky., transforming from what appeared more of a cow pasture into a viable Thoroughbred nursery and equestrian center. From drilling the first fence post to building a substantial client base, the farm was on its feet within a year.

Like many native Floridians, however, he wasn't built for the snow and chose to return to his roots, training for his family at Pleasant Acres Farm, where he and Stroud's trails aligned.
