Diverse Approach

loe and Terri Carter commit to Oklahoma through a variety of ventures

IN DEVELOPING A BUSINESS PLAN that allowed them to continue their lifelong passion for horses, Joe and Terri Carter have placed an emphasis on diversification.

The couple founded the Oklahoma Equine Hospital in Washington, Okla., which itself relies on a varied approach by treating Thoroughbreds, Quarter Horses, and all breeds of horses who call the area home.

At about the same time the equine hospital was launched in the late 1980s, they began standing stallions such as Text in Oklahoma through their Oklahoma Equine operation. The Carters also launched a pinhooking division, Calle Real Thoroughbreds, which purchased Oklahoma- and Texas-bred yearlings to resell in Florida. They also have bred and consigned horses under the Calle Real banner.

Seeing a need for a Thoroughbred-only sale, and encouraged by the addition of added gaming money to purses, the Carters launched the Carter Sales Co., which conducted its first OKC summer sale of yearlings, 2-year-olds, and horses of racing age in 2007. The sale has evolved into largely a yearling sale.

The different backgrounds and interests of the Carters likely shaped their diverse business approach.

"I grew up around racing Quarter Horses and worked cattle to pay my way through school. Terri grew up around ranch horses. We are both horse and animal lovers," said Joe Carter, who traces his many business interests in horses to the approval of pari-mutuel wagering in Oklahoma in the 1980s and the opening of Remington Park in 1988. "When we started in this business, we knew di-



versification was essential to any business plan. Then we needed to adapt to changing circumstances."

Dave Faulkner, president of the Thoroughbred Racing Association of Oklahoma, is thankful for the commitment the Carters have made to Thoroughbred racing and breeding in the state.

"I personally appreciate their many contributions, even from the early days of campaigning to get racing to where it is today-they were very involved," Faulkner said. "The breeding operation of course is one thing, and Joe is an outstanding vet. The sales company has provided an opportunity to showcase the Oklahomabred Thoroughbred, and I appreciated them launching that sales company.

"They've done a great job of putting on sales and making the customer feel at home. It's a nice atmosphere. They've had hors d'oeuvres and things like that you'd never seen in Oklahoma before."

Joe Carter grew up 10 minutes from Oklahoma Equine Hospital's current location, and from the time he was in high school thought the area was a good location for an equine hospital. Washington is just 25 minutes from Remington Park

in Oklahoma City, halfway between two large Thoroughbred and Ouarter Horse breeding and training areas, and near many of the state's show horses in Purcell.

After veterinary school Joe worked in California as resident veterinarian at Monty and Pat Roberts' Flag Is Up Farms, where Terri learned pinhooking from Monty Roberts. When pari-mutuel wagering was approved in Oklahoma, the Carters ventured back home and launched Oklahoma Equine Hospital in 1988.

"Oklahoma has a diverse horse popula-

tion, so we planned to take advantage of that," Joe Carter said. "A veterinary practice is like a restaurant; it's about location, location, location. I kept my eye on this spot through high school, undergraduate school, veterinary school; until our eventual return to Oklahoma in 1988."

With the excitement of Remington Park's launch Terri Carter negotiated with Gainesway Farm and Flag Is Up to bring grade I winner Text to stand at their Oklahoma Equine farm.

"He was the second-highest money

earner (behind Seattle Slew) in the 1974 foal crop," according to Joe. "To this point Oklahoma mainly had unraced sons of 'so and so' standing as Thoroughbred studs since it was mainly a Quarter Horse racing state. We thought we had an opportunity to diversify our business model by standing a Thoroughbred stud."

Oklahoma Equine has continued to stand Thoroughbred stallions. It currently is the home of Diamond, a stakes-winning son of Mr. Prospector; Liquor Cabinet, a son of Hennessy who finished as leading freshman sire in the state in 2012; and young Storm Cat son Mister Lucky Cat, who entered stud in 2015.

"Good fortune came our way because we bought Text in March 1988-with a \$1,000 down payment and a \$57,000 I.O.U—and that summer he came along (on the track) with Tex's Zing, a colt that became a champion in Illinois and made about \$600,000," Joe Carter said. "His success led to three big breeding seasons

for us, allowing us to pay off Text, build a clinic, and buy a house."

After Text's success, the Carters' next big stallion was Prospector's Music, a son of Mr. Prospector bred by Edward Evans and Peter Brant who sold for \$900,000 as a yearling. Prospector's Music finished as Oklahoma's leading sire multiple times after arriving in the state in 2002, the same year his son Gygistar, an Evans' homebred, won the King's Bishop Stakes (gr. I).

"This was our first introduction to the breeding of Edward Evans," Carter noted. "We learned a lot analyzing his program and from his Spring Hill Farm general manager Chris Baker (now chief operating officer at Three Chimneys Farm). Brent and Joan Charlton were our partners with Prospector's Music, and Farm). Brent and Joan Charlton were our we attribute most of his success to them and their breeding and training operation. He was Oklahoma's leading sire two years in a row."

Joe Carter said with the launch of the sales company, the stallion operation has become less commercial.

"With the success of Carter Sales Co. we have de-emphasized our marketing of

stallions to the public," Carter said. "We have tried to become more of a boutique breeding program with higher-quality mares of our own breeding to our own

stallions. We do breed the mares of special clients, but we are a lot more selective than we used to be."



The Carters enjoy spending time with their family and have placed an emphasis on hiring top employees to allow them that time. For the past 20 years they have made international trips to conduct charity and mission work.


"The Thoroughbred industry gave us an opening, a beginning. But to have a lifestyle that allowed for family and other interests, we knew we needed a great staff to allow us time off," said Joe Carter, who noted he has phased out his initial veterinary work at tracks. "The racetrack practice wasn't conducive to family life, so we hired an associate to work the track while we built Oklahoma Equine Hospital. As it grew, we phased out of the racetrack."

The Carters noted that Heather Serrano, business manager at the equine hospital; and Cyndi Compton, hospital and farm manager, have both worked for them for about 20 years and have played big roles in the operation's success.

Daughter Jessi Arnold is an equine surgeon who has taken over running Oklahoma Equine Hospital.

Carter said. "I think Terri and I are natural horsemen of sorts. I feel we intuitively know what people are trying to do with their horses. So we are comfortable with all kinds of horse people."

In part through that interaction, the Carters wanted to make a splash at their first sale in 2007.

"We decided if we wanted to have a sale, it needed to begin with a bang. Here is a situation where we looked at what was working in another segment of the horse industry and applied it to the Thoroughbred industry," said Joe Carter. "J.R. Reichert was putting on a Western Pleasure-Quarter Horse Show in Tulsa with much success. It was called the Reichert Celebration. It had a kind of Professional Bull Riders feel to it.

"We held our first OKC summer sale with a lot of fanfare. We had free steak dinners for horse trainers. We had the local sports radio station there with a live telecast. We gave a free four-wheeler to the buyer that bought the sale-topper. The sale was a smashing success."

Joe Carter said yearlings that had been bringing \$1,300 at previous sales conducted in Oklahoma suddenly were bringing \$5,300. Last year's average price for a yearling at the sale reached \$8,267.

"It created a vibe and an identity to the Oklahoma Thoroughbred breeding industry," Carter said of the fast start. "Our consignors were thrilled. It took off from there."

The Carters credited a long list of loval consignors for allowing the yearling sale to maintain its numbers despite a reduction of breeding in the state. The Oklahomabred foal crop fell 32% from 2006 to 2014 from 926 to 628 horses.

"We have basically been able to maintain the same number of yearlings in the sale even though the number of yearlings available to the sale has dropped," Joe Carter said. "I would be lying if I said it

hasn't been a struggle, but it is a tribute to Terri. Her relationship-building skills are incredible. And we have great support from our consignors."

The Carters said they love 2-year-old sales and tried one for a couple of years that failed to gain traction. It's still something they're considering, possibly for 2017.

The Carters' efforts have been noticed in Oklahoma.

"They do an excellent job; they're very easy to deal with," said Thoroughbred breeder and consignor Randy Blair of Mighty Acres near Pryor, Okla. "They put a lot of time and money into this sale. They've been a lot of help to the consignors."

Remington Park president Scott Wells said the state's racing and breeding industries appreciate the varied Thoroughbred services offered by the Carters.

"They love the industry and obviously Terri does a lot with the sale and races a lot through partnerships. They're very dedicated to the sport," Wells said. "I admire their commitment to the industry. Like so many, their commitment begins with the horse, the health of the horse.

"They weathered the hard times before 2005 (added money from gaming), and since then they've helped grow the business in a lot of areas." BH
