friends and relationships throughout the state and region. I'm quite fond of them."

The main parcel for Thoroughbreds at Mill Creek consists of 100 acres. Morgan and Little have an additional 400 acres about 25 miles away, but there are no horses on it.

"We also rent a couple of hundred acres for hay because Tim does all of our baling, and he's very particular about the hay the horses get," Morgan said. "We also get our feed from a local mill that makes it specifically for us each week."

Certainly particular about the care their horses receive, Morgan and Little keep a relatively low profile.

"We are primarily a service farm," Morgan said. "We don't care if your horse is worth two cents or two million dollars, they all get treated the same. We have a lot of individual care. Every horse gets fed for its needs; it's not a factory situation.

"Even though we stand a couple of stallions for our clients, we do the foaling and we raise babies. We do a limited amount of sales prep, but we don't advertise for business. Ninety-nine percent of our business comes from word of mouth."

Morgan and Little are quick to point out Mill Creek is a hands-on operation.

"We try to be as comprehensive and control as many things as we can to make it best for the horses," Morgan said. "Our employees have been with us for years, and they all know how particular we are.

"We don't stay in the house. We are out there with them. A lot of our employees have worked at other farms and say working here is awesome because we are out there—good, bad, or ugly."

Morgan and Little don't mind getting out to work the farm because they were instrumental in the layout and design of the operation. When they purchased the property back in the 1980s, it was cow pasture.

"Everything is set up to make it easy, not only for the horses but for the employees," Morgan said. "There are no long walks to any of the fields. Tim set this whole farm up. Everything you see was organized and built by Tim, myself, and our employees.

"When the van companies come in, they say, 'We love to come here because no matter what the weather is you can get in and you can get out.' It is all set up for big equipment. It just makes life a lot easier."

"The horse business has been very good to us," Little said. "But you are married to it seven days a week."

Morgan and Little have been married to horses and farming throughout their professional careers. It hasn't gone unnoticed.

"Anne and Tim have been a staple of the New York breeding program at Mill Creek for a very long time," said Jeffrey Cannizzo, executive director of the New York Thoroughbred Breeders. "They've raised so many foals and cared for a large part of

New York's mare population. They define hard work, and their farm's development and property is a testament to that."

Little's parents were in the cattle business, and when he got out of school in the early 1970s took a different tack and began

boarding Standardbreds.

Morgan's family was not directly involved with farming as her father was a manager for General Electric.

"We lived overseas when I was younger," she said. "When we moved back, my par-

ents bought a house that was across the street from a Thoroughbred farm. I was about 12 at the time. I begged and begged and begged some more until they let me start riding horses."

In college Morgan was galloping Thor-

oughbreds on the weekends and during the summers for trainer T.J. Kelly. After getting a degree in biochemistry at Plattsburgh State, she continued to work for Kelly for a few years.

"He was an amazing guy," she said. "The whole Kelly family is just chock full of unbelievable people."

Morgan took out her trainer's license while opening a tack shop on the side. That is where she met Little.

"I was still training a few horses, and it was the old 'We're not having any Thoroughbreds," she said of the time she and Little started doing business together. "Then people started calling: 'Will you take lay-ups? Will you take broodmares?'"

"It escalated from there," Little said.

"We swore we'd never have a Thoroughbred on this place..."

With the addition of children—now 29 and 24—the training life became difficult.

"When you've got kids and a farm, it's too tough to travel with racing," Morgan said. "I just kind of gave up the training. I'm not sorry I did. I love foaling mares. I love the babies."

Mill Creek is home to about 45 broodmares as the industry heads into foaling/ breeding season in upstate New York. Mill Creek also has 11-12 yearlings and a handful of lay-ups.

"During November, December, and January we usually get a bunch of layups-both Thoroughbred and Standardbred," Morgan said. "We give them a nice break here. We have one particular client that calls this 'horse heaven,' which I feel is a huge compliment.

"We have some clients that come in year after year from other states," she continued. "They send mares here to foal and be bred here (in New York). We have about 45 clients. We also have a lot of partnerships. That is getting big now."

Mill Creek's equine population has been scaled back to about 65 horses. Morgan and Little both admit they had too many horses on the farm a few years ago.

"A lot of people have asked, 'Are you happy with that?'" Morgan said. "The answer is 'yes.'"

Mill Creek stands two stallions but is not a traditional stallion operation.

"Timmy had two very good New Yorkbred Standardbred stallions, and in the 1980s when the Thoroughbred business was coming on strong and the harness business was in a really bad slump, that's when we first got approached about standing Thoroughbreds," Morgan said. "We picked up a few when another farm got out of the business. Once you advertise a little, people start approaching you."

Along the way Mill Creek has been the home for horses such as grade 1 winner and Kentucky Derby (G1) runner-up Captain Bodgit and Mayakovsky.

Standing for 2017 at Mill Creek is Sir Whimsey and freshman sire Tencendur, owned by Birsh.

"I'd be afraid to face Annie if I went anywhere else; it's a fear-based decision," Birsh said jokingly.

Tencendur (Warrior's Reward-Still Se-

cret, by Hennessy) will stand for \$2,500. His biggest effort came in the spring of 2015 when he ran second to Frosted in the TwinSpires.com Wood Memorial Stakes (G1). The colt made his way to the Kentucky Derby where he was unplaced behind American Pharoah. Later in the year Tencendur ran second in the Ohio Derby. In eight starts with trainer George Weaver, Tencendur earned \$368,500.

Birsh likes the proximity of Mill Creek to his own farm in upstate New York and likes the fact it doesn't have a deep stallion roster.

"Sometimes if you place your unproven stallion at a farm full of popular fellows, you normally will have an uphill battle to find mares. Like the old baseball saying goes: 'You've got to hit 'em where they ain't.' Mill Creek offers us a focus for our stallion that is hard to get at other farms. Anne and Tim only have two stallions... and I think that works in my favor as far as attention."

Sir Whimsey raced for Harvey Weinstein's Turtle Bird Stable, which still owns the son of Jump Start—Apogee, by Star de Naskra. A winner of the Gulfstream Park Handicap (G2) in 2008 and of the 2010 R.R.M. Carpenter Jr. Memorial Stakes at Delaware Park, Sir Whimsey stands for \$2,500.

From limited opportunities Sir Whimsey has four winners from 10 foals of racing age (3-year-olds and up in early 2017) and one black-type winner.

"The guys that are involved with him—Toby Sheets, Steve Asmussen's as-

sistant—get most of his offspring," said Little. "They get a fantastic level of care. He's going to have eight foals this year, and we're tickled to death.

"Our clients pretty much breed to race and not to sell. That makes a huge difference."

Another key difference in New York, of course, is the breeding incentive program through the New York State Thoroughbred Breeding & Development Fund.

"It's a big selling point for New York," Morgan said. "New York was never really considered a major part of breeding until they developed the state-bred program. You've got some serious power now in Thoroughbreds."

Birsh concurs.

"New York has a lot of opportunities," he said. "We have such a terrific breeding program. There is no question if you breed a horse here and you sell the horse here that your own stallion has sired, the possible return on your investment is truly one of a kind."

One of the many success stories of 2016 for the New York-bred program was the \$569,000 earned by Royal Posse. Raised at Mill Creek, the son of New York leading sire Posse was bred and originally raced by Richard Troncone Jr. and Sr. Racing for Michael Dubb, Bethlehem Stables, and Gary Aisquith in 2016, Royal Posse won five times and ran second four times—all in stakes—in nine starts, bringing home big purses such as \$180,000 for winning the Empire Classic Handicap for state-breds at Belmont and \$110,000 in Gulfstream Park's Claiming Crown Jewel Stakes.

That's not your run-of-the-mill horse and is indicative of what can come off of Mill Creek Farm.
