The state-bred program at the time was just getting its feet under itself, and with Dale being from Michigan and his wife being an Alabama-bred, Indiana seemed to be solid middle ground.

The Hoosier State power couple operates Hidden Springs Farm in the southern part of the state near Palmyra. The 45-plus-acre farm, spread over the rolling hills of the Ohio River Valley, is home to 18 of their own mares and a pair of stallions for 2019. Taking advantage of the state's lucrative breeding and stallion program, they breed, race, buy, and sell to those in their state as well as to nearby horsemen in Kentucky.

"Robin Berryhill has been a strong and active supporter of our Indiana breed development program. She is focused on bringing in new participants—both people and horses to our program—and is passionate about horse breeding," said Jessica Barnes, director of racing and breed development for the Indiana Horse Racing Commission.

Working the Midwest racing circuit, the couple met at Fair Grounds Race Course & Slots and will have been married 20 years in January. Dale, a journeyman rider, has 38 Thoroughbred registered wins from 351 starts. However, his riding talents stretch beyond just Thoroughbreds.

"As far as we know, Dale might be the only rider that has won on every flat racing breed and steeplechase," Robin reported. "He was a steeplechase rider for five years. He was an assistant trainer for Eugene Weymouth and they got him started. He's won on Appaloosas, Paints, Quarter Horses, Arabians, Thoroughbreds, and steeplechase. There's some guys out west

who might have won those flat races, but steeplechase takes it to a new level."

But like many other racetrackers, the couple grew weary of traveling and wanted to settle into the industry on their own patch of ground.

"We looked at all of the states and we wanted to look at some of the regional programs," Robin said. "We had run some horses in Indiana for some clients. Ohio hadn't quite kicked off at that time. We liked Indiana and we liked Louisville. The weather is better here than in some of the other states.

"We looked at a couple of farms in the Indianapolis area and a couple of farms in the southern Indiana area, and we just liked being as close to Lexington as we could be and still be part of the Indiana program. The farm is 14 miles from the

state line (Ohio River)...we had to have that Indiana address.

"We like that the terrain is rolling here and we always seem to have usable pasture. It's pretty flat in northern Indiana. We have a few natural springs and in the summer we can have really nice, green grass."

The Berryhills purchased the property eight years ago. At the time the house on the farm, which is of historic significance, was uninhabitable.

"The house is 180 years old," Robin said. "It was a stagecoach stop. Louisville has a waterfall and the only way to get the cargo down river was to off-load it and go around, and reload it in Corydon. Every four or five miles there was a stop to switch horses because they would be at a gallop to move the cargo as fast as possible.

"There was a huge barn and a team would come in, and they'd pull the harness off and attach it to the new team, and they'd go away. It was like a pit crew at a car race.

"The barn on this property wasn't there, but the house still was. It started out as a two-room log cabin. The floor joists are the cedar trees they took off the property. You don't see cedar trees that size anymore.

"When we bought the place the floors were caved in and the windows were knocked out, so when we made an offer, we said, 'let's pretend there's no house.' We weren't sure we could save the house, but we did.

"We've been renovating the house and property as we've gone along and gotten a breeders' award or a sale...then it's another project or something else gets remodeled."

In addition to the housing, the Berryhills have also been doing a lot of fence work taking out the old and putting in new lines. They are also working on a barn that will be converted from six stalls to four to make it work for mares and foals. The farm also has an indoor arena that has a track that is about an eighth of a mile.

that when you purchase a mare and bring her to lowa, you can make her foal an lowa-bred. Here's how:

Register the mare with the Iowa Department of Agriculture. Call (515) 281-4103

The mare must be registered *prior to foaling* and must remain in the state until she foals.

If you brought the mare to lowa and registered her **before** December 31, 2018, you may breed her back to any stallion.

If you bring the mare to lowa *after*December 31, 2018, and registered her prior to foaling, you must breed her back to an lowa-registered stallion if not in foal to an lowa-registered stallion

The mare is **required** to be in the state of lowa for a minimum of 30 days during the foaling period.

After foaling, the Department of Agriculture must inspect your foal before it leaves the state.

The foal must also be registered with the Iowa Department of Agriculture prior to racing.

13 mares in 2018, and newcomer Forever d'Oro, an exciting son of Medaglia d'Oro bred and raced by Charles Fipke.

General a Rod (Roman Ruler—Dynamite Eyes, by Dynaformer) began his racing career for J. Armando Rodriguez and was hot on the 2014 Triple Crown trail after winning the Gulfstream Park Derby, running second in the Besilu Stables Fountain of Youth Stakes (G2), and third in the Besilu Florida Derby (G1). Prior to his run

in the Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (G1) he was sold to Skychai Racing (Harvey Diamond and Jim Shircliff), with Starlight Racing jumping on board prior to the First Saturday in May.

General a Rod ran 11th in the Derby, fourth in the Preakness Stakes (G1), and seventh in the Belmont Stakes (G1). He won three of 10 starts at 4 and 5, with career earnings of \$553,177. His final start came in the Michael G. Schaefer Memorial

Stakes at Indiana Grand.

"Someone had called me before the Fasig-Tipton (Kentucky July) yearling sale about standing a (different) stallion and I looked at him," Berryhill said. "I didn't feel like he would fit Indiana. Indiana has a lot of shorter races and he looked more like a grass/route horse. The guy called and said, 'Are you going to be at the sale? I have a horse in mind.' He drops off an envelope and he left; I opened it and it was some papers about General a Rod. I called my husband and I said to him I think this horse will really work. So, I got in touch with Sky Chai Racing and that's how it started."

As far as his first season went, "General a Rod used to be a handful. I'm the one who breeds him. He was pretty rowdy when he was racing, but he's a piece of cake to handle," Berryhill said. "He's figured out his new job."

Forever d'Oro has a different story. By one of the world's leading sires—by progeny earnings, stakes winners, and commercial value—Forever d'Oro is out of the Kentucky Oaks (G1)-winning, 2017 Kentucky Broodmare of the Year Lemons Forever (by Lemon Drop Kid) and is a half brother to grade 1-winning full sisters Forever Un-

bridled and Unbridled Forever.

Fipke purchased Lemons Forever for \$2.5 million at the 2007 Keeneland November sale and it turned out to be a bargain. Unbridled Forever, a foal of 2011, won the 2015 Ballerina Stakes (G1) and won or placed in seven other stakes events while earning \$805,257.

Her full sister, who arrived in 2012, won four grade 1 events in 2016-17, culminating her racing career with a score in the Longines Breeders' Cup Distaff (G1) and earning an Eclipse Award as the champion older female. She earned \$3,486,880.

Forever d'Oro made only seven starts, and finished third in Saratoga's Curlin Stakes at 3 in 2016.

Fipke was selling Forever d'Oro this year, entering him in Keeneland's November sale.

"Mr. Fipke called while I was at the sale and said, 'Look at the page for Forever d'Oro and see what you think.' He asked if I was at the sale and I told him, 'yes,' so he said, 'Go look at him, eh?' "Berryhill said.

He was Hip 3496 in the horses of racing age portion of the sale.

"I went over there and then walked away from the consignor (Four Star Sales) and I called Mr. Fipke and told him he was 'perfect.' He said, 'OK, then, he's out (of the sale).' I walked back over and told the consignor he was going to Indiana.

"He's got a scopey neck," Berryhill said.
"He's really balanced; he looks like he's
16.2. He seems like he's very kind for a
stallion. He's pretty easy to handle."

THE PROGRAM

Indiana is not unique when it comes to the rise and fall of the Thoroughbred population. The foal crop has fallen since the Great Recession and nationally the crop is pegged at around 21,500 for 2019. In Indiana the foal crop was as high as 771 in 2011 (according to The

Jockey Club Fact Book) and for 2016 it was less than half of that at 377. With those kinds of numbers, the Berryhills have to adjust to scale. That's why they only stand two stallions.

"We want more mares per stallion," Robin said. "We have the capability of four stallions. We did that one year but I felt like it was too many choices. When you already know the broodmare pool is not as big in some places, you try to do what you can for the stallion owner to get more mares.

"When we came in there was a larger number of foals, so it was a little harder. The program had just sort of started. It's leveled itself out now. I think the number of foals in conjunction with the number of (state-bred) races...maybe we need a few more mares foaled here."

The program has been rewarding for the Berryhills, regardless of the foal crop size. The rules regarding mares coming in to foal and the breed-back options make it fairly simple to get started. "If a mare comes into Indiana by Nov. 1, and she foals in January or February, you are not required to breed back," Berryhill said. "If you have a mare that is going to foal later, as long as you are here 10 days (I always recommend 30 days), and drops the foal, you are required to breed back (to an Indiana stallion). If they are foaling here and the stallion doesn't stand here, it is an Indiana-bred, but if the stallion stands here and you come back and foal, it is an 'Indiana-sired' foal.

"You could also buy a horse at the sales in January and February and have your first Indiana-bred in a month. I think it's

"If you are breeding a good enough '-sired' horse and you win an open race, you are getting the purse; and getting an extra 40% to the breeder. If you own the stallion, you get another 10%. Sometimes we lose sight that the goal is to breed racehorses."

Those are percentages that can add up. BH
