# LUCKY SHAMROC

Shamrock Rose the latest success story for Best A Luck Farm

THIS IS BEGINNING to be old hat, these grade 1 winners bred by Best A Luck Farm. When Shamrock Rose thrillingly rallied from dead last to prevail by a head in the Nov. 3 Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Sprint (G1) at Churchill Downs last year, it marked the second runner bred by Best A Luck's Tommy and Lori Fackler to win at the highest level. Dance With Fate, winner of the 2014 Toyota Blue Grass Stakes (G1) at Keeneland, also was a product of the Facklers' operation.

Not bad for a 45-acre farm outside Ocala, Fla., that never carries more than a dozen of its own broodmares.

There is, however, plenty of history that goes into Best A Luck.

The Facklers have been at it for some 34 years raising horses and have been married for the last 33 of those.

Lori is the daughter of a trainer and grew up on Lots A Luck, a Florida horse farm while Tommy worked there for several years before going off to ride. They eventually started their operation with a pinhooking venture. Lori is also a stepsister to trainer Mark Casse-her mother having married Mark's father, Norm-whose family has a rich Florida pedigree in the horse business. Mark Casse happens to be the trainer of Shamrock Rose.

"I have a daily pipeline into how Shamrock Rose is doing," said Fackler. "And she's doing very well. She came out of the Breeders' Cup perfect."

The Facklers named Best A Luck for Tommy's grandparents, whose surname was Best, and for Lori's family's farm where they first met. The fortunes of Best A Luck improved drastically thanks to one auction, that being the 2007 Keeneland November mixed sale. There, the Fack-

lers purchased the unraced Elusive Quality mare Slew's Quality for \$35,000 from Warrendale Sales, agent for Stonestreet Thoroughbred Holdings; and the onetime winner Flirting With Fate in foal to Eurosilver for \$28,000 from the consignment of Taylor Made Sales Agency, agent.

"I look for a very strong pedigree," said Lori Fackler, "and, if they're in foal, I'm looking for a first- or second-year sire. Or else something that's really proven and has been a racehorse."

Slew's Quality filled the bill of having a sturdy pedigree, being a half sister to grade 3 winner Slew the Red (by Red Ransom), grade 3-placed winner Grenadia (by Thunder Gulch), and stakes-placed winner Rich City Girl (by Carson City). She is also a great-granddaughter of Great Lady M., whose daughter Lady's Secret took the 1986 Breeders' Cup Distaff (G1). Slew's Quality has produced five winners, none more accomplished than Shamrock Rose, who took the Filly & Mare Sprint as a 3-year-old and has blue sky stretching in front of her.

"You never know when they're babies, other than she always did everything right that she was supposed to do," Lori Fackler said of Shamrock Rose. "She was athletic, very easy to break and train, and was wellmannered to be around. She had no issues. Nothing seems to bother her. You can see

that when you look at her in the paddock before a race. Within two weeks she was in two graded stakes with huge crowds and it didn't bother her a bit. At that level the mental aspect is so important."

Shamrock Rose had won the Lexus Raven Run Stakes (G2) at Keeneland just two weeks before scoring in the Breeders' Cup.

Best A Luck sits about 30 miles northwest of Ocala. Besides breaking and training about 10 of their own youngsters annually, the Facklers also handle between 30 and 50 client horses a year, giving steady work to a five-eighths-mile training track they co-own. No surprise for a Florida operation, Best A Luck points its produce toward the 2-year-old auctions in the Sunshine State.

It parted with Shamrock Rose for \$120,000 from its consignment at the 2017 Ocala Breeders' Sales' April auction of 2-year-olds in training. Penny and Manfred Conrad bought her in the name of their Conrad Farms and have reaped four straight victories from the filly, who has banked \$917,687. Shamrock Rose also took the Malvern Rose Stakes at Presque Isle Downs and the La Lorgnette Stakes at Woodbine as a sophomore, and she also scored in the Ontario Debutante Stakes and finished second in the Mazarine Stakes (G3) at Woodbine as a 2-year-old.

Interestingly, Dance With Fate fetched the exact same \$120,000 amount at the 2013 edition of the OBS April sale when Best A Luck consigned him and Joe Ciaglia Jr. purchased him. The son of Two Step Salsa won three times from nine starts and earned \$680,050 before dying after a training accident at Del Mar in July of his 3-yearold season. In addition to winning the Blue Grass, he had also run second in the Del Mar Futurity (G1), FrontRunner Stakes (G1), and El Camino Real Derby (G3).

Unlike Shamrock Rose, Dance With Fate wasn't as well-mannered at the farm.

"He stood out for taking other foals by the neck and moving them around," said Fackler. "We had to take him out early, and I even threatened to geld him. He had a big presence; he was a character."

Dance With Fate was named champion Florida-bred 2-year-old.

Although that fateful November sale was 11 years ago, the Facklers still have Flirting With Fate and Slew's Quality in their pasture. Flirting With Fate has a "gorgeous Frosted yearling," according to Fackler, and is in foal to champion Classic Empire.

"People can't believe we still have both of the grade 1 producers we bought at that sale," said Fackler. "We keep improving who we breed them to, so hopefully we'll have some more champions.

"Our specialty is the 2-year-old sales," Fackler stated. "If we can, we sell them then. Once in a while we'll race them, but our goal with every one of them is the 2-year-old sales. We were very happy with the price we got for Shamrock Rose."





She added, however, that the Frosted yearling could be headed to the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga select yearling sale this summer along with an Uncle Mo yearling.

The Facklers sent Slew's Quality to Florida stallion First Dude to produce Shamrock Rose, who became the grade 1 winner (Hollywood Gold Cup Handicap) and dual classic-placed stallion's first grade 1 victor.

"We gravitate toward sires who are showing they can get some speed because at the 2-year-old sales it all comes down to that work on the grounds," said Fackler. "You don't have to be the fastest, but you don't want to be slow, either, because that makes a huge difference in how you sell them. So if we find a stallion who was a little quicker or more precocious as a 2-year-old, that will often help.

"It doesn't do us as much good to find a two-turn specialist who was a late bloomer in their 3- or 4-year-old season. We look at that speed and precociousness for our program."

Slew's Quality has a 3-year-old colt by Bandbox named Quality Pitch who was a \$55,000 purchase at the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic sale of 2-year-olds in Timonium, Md.; and a 2-year-old colt by Stay Thirsty.

"He's been in training since last autumn and is slated to go to the OBS April sale," Fackler said of the Stay Thirsty colt. "He looks great, and we've certainly got a nice update in the catalog with what Shamrock Rose has done. The mare (Slew's Quality)



is in foal to Hard Spun and is due in late January or early February."

Fackler hasn't determined whom Slew's Quality or Flirting With Fate will be bred back to this year.

Although the Facklers didn't make it up to Churchill Downs for Shamrock Rose's Breeders' Cup victory, Lori vowed to make it to Santa Anita for this year's World Championships should the filly continue to progress as a 4-year-old.

"We watched the Breeders' Cup from the farm, and it was very exciting," she noted. "For as small an operation as we are, it's great to have two grade 1 winners."

Although the youngsters eventually come to Best A Luck for their early lessons,

the Facklers take advantage of several state incentive programs and normally have their mares foal up north. Shamrock Rose, for example, is a Pennsylvania-bred, having been foaled at Horseshoe Valley Equine Center near Annville, Pa.

"The mares that go to Kentucky do come back here, although some are rotated through Maryland and Pennsylvania," Fackler said. "They have a really strong breeding program in Pennsylvania now, and we move our mares among Maryland, New York, Pennsylvania, and Kentucky. In September we start working with the yearlings and breaking them. We have found it's best for us to point for the April 2-yearold sale at OBS. Everybody is at that sale, so if you have a top-notch horse it tends to do better there than at the March sale."

Having grown up on a horse farm, Fackler really had no choice but to make her living working around them, and certainly has no regrets.

"It's very exciting when everything comes together," she said. "We enjoy the horses, and we love living on the farm and watching them play in the paddocks. It's great to see them as they grow, and we try to figure out who is going to be the next big horse.

"For us, with the small number of mares we have, to have two grade 1 producers is unbelievable. And it's made it really exciting and rewarding to have bred a 2-yearold champion and now a Breeders' Cup champion, and there's still a lot more to come from Shamrock Rose, I believe."
