WENTY YEARS AGO the land, untouched by plow or human hand, was in charge: an expanse of impenetrable brush tangled with thorns, palmetto, and brambles. Night creatures such as raccoons and possums crawled in the thick undergrowth. By day it was a dense forest home for snakes, rabbits, and squirrels.



"When I was a kid, it was my place to hunt after school and in the summer," Carrol Castille remembered. "The scrub trees were so close together you had to walk sideways."

From boyhood squirrel hunter to property owner-look at what Castille has accomplished with the land two decades later. The landscape image of the 145 acres of what is now Whispering Oaks Farm near Carencro, La., is the Taj Mahal of breeding farms in the state. Owned and operated by Castille, the farm is as clean, spacious, and tidy as a Walt Disney theme park. The farm could pass for a well-manicured golf course.

"I guess I lean toward being obsessivecompulsive," Castille admitted, "but I want things looking nice and clean. Things

need to be in their proper place and organized. It doesn't cost any extra money to be neat. It is something I instill in my people constantly."

A busy man with an open mind, frequent flyer Castille travels to yearling sales and visits farms in Florida, Kentucky, New York, and California in search of horses and ideas to improve his operation.

"We can't duplicate the big Kentucky farms," Castille explained, "but we are trying to imitate the best we can. You walk into a Bob Baffert, Steve Asmussen, or Todd Pletcher barn, and you see that nothing is out of place. All the major Kentucky farms are the same way. They are a showcase to the industry. I don't have the deep pockets that those big farms have, but I can do with what I've got."

Good help might be hard to recruit in other parts of the country, but Whispering Oaks is located in the mother lode of horsemen. The Cajun culture of southwest Louisiana has produced generations

of jockeys, trainers, exercise riders, and grooms whose lives revolve around horses.

"Working on a farm is not the most glamorous job," Castille said. "It's seven days a week mostly outside in the elements. Construction jobs or in the oil fields are paying better, so it's a challenge. You need to find the person with a passion to do this work.

"There is still a tight-knit group of

Only 32% of all sires have a lifetime AVERAGE-EARNINGS INDEX higher than their mares' COMPARABLE INDEX.

horsemen connected to their roots," Castille continued, "but the generation gap is closing. It has shrunk somewhat, but there are still some diehards."

A stallion station and racing and breeding operation, Whispering Oaks makes a substantial contribution to the local job market. The racing operation has 20 employees on the payroll. There are seven full-time workers employed on the breeding side. The farm maintains two full-time veterinarians. The blacksmith has worked

at Whispering Oaks for 10 years. Two night watchmen work in rotating shifts. Tired of the road/travel grind, trainer-in-residence Steve Flint is happy to stay home and break the babies and train all of the racehorses under the colors of Whispering Oaks.

PUBLIC RELATIONS—CAJUN STYLE

Farm manager Phyllis Comeaux never met a stranger. Giving freely of her cordial warmth to clients and visitors, Comeaux offers a welcoming face to Whispering Oaks. Her expertise is oversight of the breeding operation, where she ensures accuracy in the matings. Given her knowledge of pedigree and history of the area, Comeaux names all of the Whispering Oaks babies. Competent with automation and regulations, she completes the foal registration process.

"Phyllis has been in the horse industry her whole life," Castille remarked on the pivotal role Comeaux performs at Whispering Oaks. "With her, there was no learning curve. She understands the game, and she knows the people. She even knows their nicknames."

Office work, breeding the mares, and paperwork are Comeaux's routine. But the passion that ignites her enthusiasm is none of the above.

"What I love about this place and this position is meeting the people. Face to face and listening to their stories. I can't wait to see what each day brings," she said.

Castille scratches his itch in a different way. Like a water bug on the bayou, he is in constant motion. Solving technical problems, finding solutions, cleaning, washing, and operating equipment are within his comfort zone.

"My meditation is out there cutting


grass on the mower," he said.

The popular term is "hands on." Castille's confidence with handling the stallions is remarkable to watch. It is obvious there is a depth of life experience in his touch.

"I grew up on the bush tracks around here," Castille said. "Every Sunday was a routine. Church at 8 o'clock and then load the horses in a van (his father trained Quarter Horses) and the family would spend the day at the match races. I got to see Eddie Delahoussaye and Calvin Borel grow up around these parts."

Castille's background with horses is more "blue collar" lunch bucket than suede shoe operator, and his calloused hands show it.

"Look. I've done it all," Castille said.
"My first job after school was running a small breeding farm. I did all the breeding. Broke the yearlings and galloped the horses. In grade school it was the same old, same old. After class I went straight

to the barn and cleaned stalls. There is not one small part of this industry that I have not put hands on."

STALLION STATION

"Every stallion has different quirks," Castille explained. "Some want to jump from different angles. It takes discipline to observe their habits. You get a stallion, and

they have developed some habits that we have to redirect. I handle all the stallions myself, and I make the corrections I think need to be made."

The stallion roster that Castille handles on a daily basis is impressive. Three of the top 20 stallions (Run Production, Closing Argument, and D'wildcat) in Louisiana stand at Whispering Oaks. Walking down

the stallion shed row, in and out of the stalls, Castille enjoys playing with his assembled team.

"We started breeding Run Production to a broader band of bloodlines, and his babies are starting to show some quality," Castille commented. "His babies stay sound and in the game for a long time. His temperament is so calm that a 10-year-old

kid could handle him."

D'wildcat is the oldest sire standing at Whispering Oaks.

"A great horse to be around—his hole card is that he consistently throws nice, very useful babies," Castille said. "Year after year his foal rate remains high."

Successful progeny of the son of Forest Wildcat include grade 2 winner D' Funnybone and stakes winners Authenticat and D'wild Ride.

The "celebrity" stallion at Whispering Oaks is the popular Closing Argument. The son of Successful Appeal—Mrs. Greeley, by Mr. Greeley, won the 2005 Holy Bull Stakes (G3) and finished third in the Toyota Blue Grass Stakes (G1) before run-

ning second at 71-1 in the Kentucky Derby (G1). In the breeding shed Closing Argument has demonstrated he has some tricks up his sleeve.

"For a router he throws a lot of speed, and he throws it early in their career," Castille pointed out. "His babies are quick to mature as 2-year-olds. His pedigree shows he has speed that can carry. He can get you a solid miler or a 1%-mile horse for sure."

If you want to look stallion Mobile Bay in the eye, you are going to need a stepladder. A Louisiana-bred, Mobile Bay (Lone Star Special—Tranquility Bay, by Out of Place) won the 2015 Super Derby (G2) and was twice named Louisiana horse of the year.

"He's a giant," Castille said, holding the

son of Henny Hughes—Mean Imogene, by Silver Deputy, was trained by Bill Mott and is in his second season at Whispering Oaks.

On March 29, Castille retired One Liner and put him on the van to Whispering Oaks. A graded stakes-winning son of Into Mischief—Cayala, by Cherokee Run, the 5-year-old One Liner will stand for a stud fee of \$3,500. One Liner began his career in brilliant fashion by winning three races at three (Saratoga, Gulfstream Park, and Oaklawn Park) different tracks. The Oaklawn victory was in the grade 3 Southwest Stakes.

training track has excellent drainage and a deep eight-inch cushion. Long-range planning with soil experts, hours of time, effort, and a budget that didn't blink an eye are the background of the training track.

"We built it from the ground up," Castille explained. "We stripped away the top soil and got down to the clay base. We spread shells and came back with compaction clay, then cut lime into the base, a layer at a time until it was uniform all the way around. Then we let it set for about a month."

For the final touch it took three weeks to spread the top cushion. According to Castille, 265 truckloads of spillway sand from the old Evangeline Downs racetrack were delivered. Each truck carried 14 cubic yards of soil. That was Castille himself driving the bulldozer, scraper, top loader, and tractor that pulled the harrows.

"It all came together," Castille recalled.

"Every chance I got I was out there on the harrows. I built it so I want to feel it."

Cajun ingenuity. Castille grew weary of the two to three hours a day that he drove a water truck over the training track.

"I was out there by myself, sometimes till 9 o'clock at night," Castille recalled. The solution was to bring in a golf course consultant to install an automatic sprinkler system with a timer. "Those guys could tell you how many ounces of water

per square foot was needed to maintain consistent moisture levels."

A total commitment to quality and a network of trusted allies have been critical elements in the success of Whispering Oaks. Castille's relationship with Hall of Fame trainer Asmussen is woven into the fabric of the growth curve of the farm.

"Steve has been a tremendous friend, asset, and mentor to me," Castille said.

"We are friends first and foremost," Castille continued. "He calls a spade a spade. He is up front about what he thinks about a horse. And disciplined in the sales ring as far as what he thinks a horse is worth. I don't feel that I have ever overpaid for any horse that he purchased for me. Steve taught me that pedigree follows athleticism. He knew that my long-term vision was to buy good fillies with the hope to run out their career and eventually to turn them out as broodmares to complement my stallions. You can call it my assembly line."

Recently nominated and elected to the Louisiana Thoroughbred Breeder's Association, Castille has a watchful and concerned eye on the future.

"Working with guys such as Jake Delhomme, Brett Brinkman, Don Stemmans, and Roger Heitzmann, we are trying to bring Louisiana racing back to the status it enjoyed 10 years ago," Castille said. "Louisiana was once one of the top breeding programs in the country. We lost some ground, and we have to gain that back. We are doing a lot of research and study, doing some comparisons to see what new ideas we can bring to the table. We want to bring more people back into the industry. It's the guy with two or three mares that we lost, and we have to find a way to bring him back to the game."
