Foals deserve attentive care at any boarding facility

In addition to its hands-on approach to horse care, Cambrey distinguishes itself with lower than average board rates for Central Kentucky.

"We are able to keep our rate significantly lower because we oversee all of the vet work and day-to-day operations ourselves," said Vickie Hewitt. "Your horse will be seen by the same vet throughout the breeding season."

MADERA THOROUGHBREDS

Cal Fischer's Madera Thoroughbreds offers breeding, boarding, layup, and sales

services in an ideal location. Situated in California's San Joaquin Valley, Madera Thoroughbreds sits on 160 acres with the Fresno River running through the property and the Sierra Nevada Mountains serving as the backdrop.

Fischer, who also manages the operation, has more than 50 years of experience in the Thoroughbred industry. He established Madera Thoroughbreds in 1984 after running a farm in Calistoga for 24 years and is joined by his wife, Jill, a former schoolteacher.

There are three barns on the ranch, which is only an hour drive from Yosemite National Park. One barn is used for foaling, one for sales prep, and the other houses Madera's stallions. The front of the property includes nearly 20 paddocks, and there are irrigated pastures between 10-20 acres in the back.

Alert Bay, foaled and raised at Madera, represents a top graduate of the program. The 8-year-old City Zip gelding won 11 black-type events and earned more than \$1.3 million. Six of his wins came in graded company, including the City of Hope Mile (G2T) and Mathis Brother Mile (G2T) at Santa Anita Park, and back-to-back versions of the San Francisco Mile (G3T) at Golden Gate Fields. Earlier in his career, Alert Bay's victories in the British Columbia Derby (G3) and BC Premier's Handicap (G3) earned him British Columbia Horse of the Year and 3-year-old male honors.

Awesome Daze, a five-time stakes winner and earner of \$652,435, was also

foaled and raised at Madera. Chief among the gelding's victories is the Wells Fargo Bank California Cup Classic, which he took by two lengths under jockey Gary Stevens. Awesome Daze earned California's champion older horse title.

Madera has also cared for Solid Wager, winner of the 2019 Toboggan Stakes (G3) at Aqueduct Racetrack and earner of \$871,170. Other graduates include stakes winners Super Strut, Jack's Wild, Mateo, More Angels, Red Warrior, Soul Candy, Sheer Pleasure, and Got Even.

The stallion roster for 2020 features Elusive Warning, a son of Elusive Quality out of the multiple stakes-winning Valid Appeal mare Valid Warning. Elusive Warning won five of his 13 starts from ages 3 through 6, was a group stakes winner at Nad Al Sheba in Dubai, a black-type winner in the United States, and second in the Etisalat Godolphin Mile (G2). He is the only son of Elusive Quality standing in California and is the sire of Atavismo, a 2-year-old champion in Panama.




OAK LODGE USA

While the Fitzsimonses have run Oak Lodge for a decade, they had years of dedicated service to the industry under their belt before they opened the gates.

Alan Fitzsimons, a graduate of both the English and Irish National Stud's Management Diploma Course, has had an extensive learning curve, having worked in Australia, New Zealand, as well as in the U.K. and the U.S.

In New Zealand he had the good fortune to work with Sir Patrick Hogan at Cambridge Stud as well as work as the stallion manager at Eliza Park in Australia before coming to Kentucky to work for Robert Clay at Three Chimneys Farm for two years. That service was followed by another two-year stint at Coolmore's Ashford Stud.

Suzy Fitzsimons attended the University of Limerick Equine Degree Course and has since spent more than 10 years working for Coolmore in Ireland, Australia, and the U.S.

Continuity is key to any successful operation, and the crew at Oak Lodge has been together seven years and knows the farm inside and out.

Come foaling time, Fitzsimons attends every birth, along with the assistant manager, and should an issue arise, Dr. Tina Cassar of Cassar Equine Clinic is just minutes away.
