Vequist raises the national profile of trainer Butch Reid

IT WAS LATE DECEMBER when Dr. Whitney Reid Fink heard someone mention the Breeders' Cup, and her mind played a trick on her.

As she reflected on that Nov. 6 afternoon at Keeneland, much of the day was a blur.

"It was such a whirlwind experience," she said. "It happened so fast, I couldn't really focus on an individual moment."

So, the 30-year-old third-year resident physician at Children's Hospital of

Philadelphia watched a video of the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies (G1), and all of the emotions came back to her with the same overpowering force as a month earlier.

"I'm sitting in my kitchen watching the video by myself," Fink said, "and there are tears in my eyes."

Fink's emotions stemmed from being the daughter of trainer Robert "Butch" Reid and knowing all of the hard work and sacrifice by her father and mother, Virginia, over the course of the last four decades that were finally and fittingly rewarded when Vequist captured the Juvenile Fillies at Keeneland.

"It was such an emotional experience because my dad has had such a long and successful career but not at that level. It was overwhelming for me because my mom and dad are the most honest people I know," Fink said. "They have a successful business, and I know everything they did and all of the work was to support me in my endeavors. So, whenever they have a success like that, it makes me emotional and proud. They truly deserve it."

In a training career that goes back to the days of the Ronald Reagan presidency in about 1984, 64-year-old Butch Reid has won 796 races and compiled earnings of more than \$26.9 million with 47 stakes wins. In that time, while traveling to seasonal circuits along the East Coast, he trained some top-class runners such as the grade 1 winner Poseidon's Warrior and Breeders' Cup Marathon (G2) victor Afleet Again as well as the multiple graded stakes winner Groscar.

Just two years ago he appeared to have a bona fide Triple Crown candidate in Remsen Stakes (G2) winner Maximus Mischief until a soft tissue injury ended the colt's career in the early spring of his 3-year-old season.

Yet, it wasn't until Gary Barber, Wachtel Stable, and Tom and Sue McGrath's Swilcan Stable's 2-year-old filly Vequist surged to a decisive two-length victory over Dayoutoftheoffice in the \$2 million Juvenile Fillies that the Parx Racing-based trainer notched his initial grade 1 win at the World Championships. Moreover, in January he is an odds-on favorite to be named as the trainer of an Eclipse Award winner for the first time.

"To win a race with that much prestige was fantastic," Reid said. "It was such an incredible day to share with my family."

For Reid, Vequist has generated the kind of notoriety on a national stage that has eluded him since the days of the 1970s when he and his brother Mark (a trainer with 1,796 wins to his credit), worked for trainer Dick Dutrow. It moved into the background through decades of pulling up roots several times a year while operating his stable in New York, the Mid-Atlantic region, and Florida. Those days were not easy for him or his family.

"This family has been through the ups and downs of this job and the stress of moving," Reid said, "but we've been able to main-

tain an even keel, which is the important thing."

Fink said she attended eight different schools before entering college, and Reid was frequently told by school officials how such a lifestyle would negatively impact his daughter. Yet seeing how Fink is poised to begin a three-year fellowship with the goal of being a pediatric immunologist and Reid's career is now at its zenith vividly reflects the family's resiliency.

"It was always the three of us. I've lived with my parents in every state on the East Coast with racing, and it's helped me to become more outgoing," Fink said. "It is just amazing that my dad has gotten a break like this and that he could be the trainer of a champion. It's been a long time coming."

Having Vequist in his barn required a couple of fortunate turns of fate for Reid.

The daughter of Nyquist was bred by the McGraths' Swilcan Stable out of the Mineshaft mare Vero Amore, who was second for McGrath and Reid in the 2014 Black-Eyed Susan Stakes (G2).

Though Vequist showed potential in her early days at the farm, McGrath entered her in the 2019 Keeneland September yearling sale but brought her home when there was no serious interest in her (she RNA'd at \$135,000 from the Brookdale Sales consignment).

"She didn't bring the price we wanted," said Reid, whose career started at Monmouth Park with a string of three horses from his bother and took off in the late 1980s when owner Sidney Baer gave him 18 horses. "A lot of people looked at her, but no one vetted her. There was something people didn't like, though I don't know what it was. Thank God we were able to keep her."

McGrath then pondered entering her in a 2-year-old sale, but some advice from Barry Eisaman, who raised the filly on his Florida farm, convinced him to keep her.

"Barry is a man of few words, and he told us she's a tall, gangly filly, but when she puts things together, she could be something special," Reid said. "He said, 'I think you want to hold on to her.' Fortunately, he was correct."

Once Vequist arrived at Reid's barn at Parx, it didn't take long for him to see everything Eisaman loved in the young filly.

In plotting her career, Reid considered running her at Saratoga Race Course but opted for a July 29 4½-furlong maiden race at Parx, knowing it was too short of a distance for a filly with her pedigree.

Despite the lack of ground, Vequist showed enough speed to press the pace throughout and wound up finishing second by a nose.

Yet much more than a promising debut effort came out of the race. In covering the distance in :51%, Vequist earned a Ragozin Speed Figure of 12, which caught the eye of Adam Wachtel, who relies on those numbers to team with fellow owner Gary Barber to make private purchases of horses with an alluring upside.

"We were doing our review of horses' Ragozin figures, and she ran a huge number. It was the second or third fastest figure for a 2-year-old filly," Wachtel said. "It looked like Nyquist was off to a good

start as a stallion, and we were comfortable with that. I looked on the dam side and saw Butch trained her and she was a nice distance mare. We felt between Nyquist and the dam maybe this is a two-turn horse."

Wachtel and Barber approached Mc-Grath about purchasing Vequist, but there was one sticking point. McGrath insisted on keeping Reid as her trainer.

"I've been with Butch about 12 years, and he's done a fantastic job for me," said McGrath, who has four horses in training, all with Reid. "I always appreciated Butch's training abilities. He cares about the horses and puts them first. They are well-cared for. The proof is in the pudding with Vequist. Over the years we've become friends, and as long as I'm involved in the sport, I'll have Butch as my trainer."

Wachtel did not know much about Reid, so he did some homework and liked what he found out.

"We were told the way to get the deal done was to keep Butch," Wachtel said. "The big part for us was deciding if we wanted to do a deal where we keep a trainer we don't really know. So I asked people about him, and everyone said he was a very good horseman, very shrewd. He has a small operation with his wife, and they do a real good job. They thought I would like him. I called him. We had a good talk, and I told Gary why don't we give him a chance."

Most times, Wachtel and Barber would send a new acquisition to Bill Mott or Mark Casse, a pair of Hall of Fame trainers. Yet they agreed to allow McGrath to stay on with a 25% share of the filly, and kept her in Reid's barn, mirroring a move that had worked out well a year earlier when they bought into Shotski, kept Jeremiah O'Dwyer as the trainer, and were rewarded with a victory in the Remsen Stakes (G2).

It didn't take long for the purchase to

pay a dividend as Reid heeded Wachtel and Barber's advice and ran the maiden filly in the Spinaway Stakes (G1) at Saratoga. Vequist exceeded expectations by capturing the prestigious Spa stakes by 9½ lengths at 6-1 odds for Reid's first grade 1 win in eight years.

"It's a rare opportunity to stay with a filly like this, especially for a guy from Parx," Reid said. "Usually when the big guys from California and New York come in, it's a one-way ticket out for the trainer,

but Gary and Adam have been fantastic with me. I'm glad I could reward them."

After a runner-up finish behind Dayoutoftheoffice in the Frizette Stakes (G1), a race in which Reid believes breaking from the rail worked against Vequist, the next stop was Keeneland for the Breeders' Cup, where the family aspect of the stable came to the fore.

When Reid shipped Vequist to Kentucky about two weeks before the Juvenile Fillies, it was his wife, Virginia, who traveled with her and spent each day before the race rubbing legs and walking the filly to prepare her for the race.

"She did a great job with Vequist," Reid said.

Like her husband, "Ginny" Reid has spent much of her life around horses. As a teen, she worked for trainer Lucien Laurin and was a hotwalker for the immortal Secretariat. After she met and married Reid, she became a combination assistant trainer/exercise rider for the stable, who reluctantly relinquished her riding duties only a few years ago.

"Mom worked horses for my dad for 35 years, and she only stopped because we made her stop after she broke her back in two places," Fink said. "If we hadn't stopped her, she would still be out there."

When race day arrived, all three members of the Reid family were on hand at Keeneland.

"There was no way I was going to miss the Breeders' Cup," Fink said. "It was a surreal experience."

They were treated to a momentous victory by Vequist, who avenged her loss to Dayoutoftheoffice and allowed the Reids and McGrath to savor a moment that was a dream come true for people rarely seen on the sport's biggest stage.

"In a year like this one, it's special," Mc-Grath said. "We are small scale as breeders and owners, and both the big players and

the small players were impacted across the board. It's a feel-good story to be where we were in the spring and to wind up with a champion."

For Reid, there was special satisfaction in accounting for the third straight year in which a Parx-based horse has triumphed at the World Championships.

"I'm glad we kept the Parx streak alive at the Breeders' Cup. Believe it or not, there are people outside of New York and Kentucky who know how to train racehorses," said Reid, who settled at Parx after the 2009 opening of its casino. "It's a matter of having the right clients who will go to the sales and give you good horses. I believe Parx is one of the best opportunities for horsemen. We have a pension, health insurance, help with workman's compensation, and year-round racing; and it allows me to stay in the Philadelphia area all year. The situation they present for horsemen is the best in the country, in my opinion. It's worked out very well being here."

Reid will be spending some time in

Florida this winter, preparing Vequist for a 3-year-old campaign that is expected to start Feb. 27 in the Davona Dale Stakes (G2) at Gulfstream Park with the longrange goal of the April 30 Longines Kentucky Oaks (G1).

As busy as Vequist keeps him, Reid will have longer and more hectic days in the spring and summer. While he normally has a stable of about 20, Reid expects to have 40 horses once a new crop of 2-year-olds arrives. After four decades of working outside of the spotlight, thanks to Vequist, more people than ever have become aware of the quality work done by Reid year-in and year-out and have sent him horses.

"When babies come in, it will be as big a group of horses as we've ever had," Reid said. "Vequist has taken the stable to a new level. You have to prove to people that you can do the job as good or even better than anyone else, and we did that this year."
