TRACK ANNOUNCER JOHN DOOLEY HAS BEEN A STEADY PRESENCE AT FAIR GROUNDS SINCE 2004

F THE MASSIVE variety of statistics available in racing, one for "number of races called" is not easy to find or calculate. But it's a sure bet that since 2004, few other track announcers have amassed a total to rival John Dooley. Since that year, Dooley has worked almost year-round, alternating between Fair Grounds Race Course & Slots and Arlington Park for most of that time period until the end of racing at the Chicago-area track in 2021, after which he swapped Horseshoe Indianapolis into his schedule. Even though he is in the announcer's booth for close to 200 race dates per year, fans and horsemen can count on Dooley to consistently provide accurate and passionate calls, whether it's the \$1 million Louisiana Derby (G2) or a maiden claiming race on a Tuesday afternoon.

Fair Grounds and the city of New Orleans are both special places for Dooley, even though they are a long way from where he grew up on Long Island listening to Marshall Cassidy call races at Belmont Park, Saratoga Race Course, and Aqueduct.

Dooley's rise to the top of his profession came relatively quickly, considering there are only so many upper-tier tracks, and job openings are infrequent. Dooley got his first full-time announcing position in 1991 at Thistledown (now JACK Thistledown Racino) in Cleveland, and then in 1997 he took the microphone to inaugurate racing at Lone Star Park near Dallas. Just a few years later,

he became the voice of Arlington Park, where he remained from 2000 until calling the final race at the historic oval 21 years later. Since there was no winter racing at Arlington, the Fair Grounds meet fit perfectly into his schedule, and the fact that Churchill Downs Inc. owned both tracks made it an obvious fit.

"I was so excited my first year there because before 2004 I had never actually visited New Orleans," he said. "The city of New Orleans has been there for over 300 years, and this is the 153rd racing season at the Fair Grounds, so to be a part of it for 20 seasons, I think it's pretty cool."

Dooley loved everything "The Big Easy" had to offer—the history, culture, food, and of course, the horse racing—but he soon experienced one of the drawbacks of a city on the Gulf Coast when Hurricane Katrina devastated the region in August 2005.

"It was my second season there and

One of the biggest thrills at Fair Grounds experienced by Dooley was calling Bricks and Mortar's narrow victory in the 2019 Muniz Memorial Handicap, one of six races in the horse's undefeated campaign that year that culminated in Horse of the Year honors

then suddenly here comes Hurricane Katrina and obviously impacted not only horse racing, but the entire community and so many people," he said. "They moved a shortened race meet to Louisiana Downs that year, so I went there to represent the Fair Grounds.

"Then the following year, Churchill

Downs made all the necessary repairs at Fair Grounds. They put a lot of money into the facility. For the Fair Grounds to get back to racing and get the Louisiana Derby back to where it belongs, that was a part of the rebirth of New Orleans after Katrina."

While the Louisiana Derby is the

biggest race on Fair Grounds' schedule, some of Dooley's most memorable moments were other stakes.

"One race that always sticks out to me is Pyro in the 2008 Risen Star," he said. "He was one of the top contenders for that year's Kentucky Derby, and people were expecting a really big run from him. When they turned for home, he was last and then just absolutely exploded and wound up winning, so that stretch run always stands out to me."

The 2019 Muniz Memorial Handicap (G2T) is another race Dooley will not soon forget, as he called the eventual Horse of the Year's victory at Fair Grounds and then again later that year in the Arlington Million XXXVII Stakes (G1T).

"I can still see Bricks and Mortar's nose dive on the line," he recalled about the narrow victory over longshot Markitoff. "That was an undefeated campaign for him, so it was great that part of it happened at Fair Grounds."

Dooley also enjoys Louisiana Champions Day, which showcases the top horses bred in the state. He's been at Fair Grounds long enough to see generations

of Louisiana-breds on the track.

"Louisiana Champions Day is fantastic, and Fair Grounds does a great job honoring Louisiana-breds," he said. "We've had state-bred stars like Free Like a Girl who went over \$2 million and has just been reigning supreme, and going back to Star Guitar, who is now a top sire."

DEDICATED TO HIS CRAFT

The racetrack is full of jobs unlike anything you'll find in a regular office setting, and being a track announcer certainly has some unique characteristics. If you are an accountant, then calling in sick is probably not a big deal; someone can pick up the slack that day or you'll get caught up the next day. Not so for a track announcer. While most tracks have a contingency plan for a back-up race caller, sometimes those plans don't work out.

Dooley said there have been days he didn't feel at his best, but he's never missed a day at Fair Grounds and could only recall two times where he was a scratch at Arlington. He nearly took a rare sick day this past meet at Horseshoe Indianapolis, but thanks to some help from a colleague he made it through.

"We had a week break here during the meet, so I went over to Europe, and I came back and caught a little bit of a virus. "I CAN REMEMBER CELEBRATING ONE ST. PATRICK'S DAY WITH BRIAN HERNANDEZ JR. I wanted to take a sick day, but they just had a hard time finding someone to fill in for me," he said. "So I basically took some medicine and (racing analyst and production manager) Rachel McLaughlin brought me a blanket and some soup, so I made it through the card."

Rarely missing a day is one thing, but Dooley also must bring passion and accuracy to somewhere in the neighborhood of 1,800 race calls a year. In a

regular job it might be easy enough to slack off now and then, but Dooley strives to do his best in every race.

"I think of the jockeys, trainers, and owners, and as an announcer, you're aware of the fact that fans are tuning in and they are wagering," he said. "Every race is important to them, and it's important to me."

Even though Dooley only called races at Lone Star Park for a short time, his stint in Texas left a major impression.

"That was a thrill," he recalled. "Working for Corey Johnsen and Steve Sexton, absolute titans of horse racing, and for them to open a world-class facility like that, which eventually hosted a Breeders' Cup, was a great experience. And the crowds, I'm talking about in the tens of thousands, not just thousands, in those opening years there. It was so well received by the people around Dallas-Ft. Worth."

Dooley, as one would expect after spending nearly two decades in Chicago, also has tremendous recollections of Arlington Park.

"Chicago is another city that I absolutely

loved," he said. "I was there when the Cubs won the World Series. I miss the city. I still have a lot of friends back there, and I always root on an Arlington Million winner. I do miss it, but racing moves on."

It was Dooley's relationship with Eric Halstrom, the current vice president and general manager of Horseshoe Indianapolis who formerly held the same position at Fair Grounds, that helped him move on to a new opportunity in Indiana.

"I worked with Eric at the Fair Grounds, so when the position came open from April to November at Horseshoe Indianapolis, which leads right into Fair Grounds, I absolutely jumped at the chance," he said. "It's been

exciting. It's a long race meet so you need to keep the energy level up, but they have a great stakes program with the Indiana Derby and Oaks. We've seen the handle increase from year to year, so I hope to be there in the future."

MORE TO LIFE THAN CALLING RACES

Even when he's not calling racing, Dooley might be following and talking about it on X (formerly Twitter) or watching international racing.

"I love watching international racing from Dubai, Hong Kong, England, and Ireland," he said. "When I went over to Europe, I met with UK commentator Mike Cattermole and had a couple of pints and we talked about race commentators here and there and around the world."

Dooley did take some time off just before the end of the Horseshoe Indianapolis meet to go back and visit family in New York. He also manages to squeeze in some travel and sporting events into his tight schedule.

"I'm a big World War II history buff, so I've been to London, Berlin, Paris, Prague, Vienna, and Munich, so any chance I get to travel and check out some history, count me in.

"And I love all other sports besides horse racing. Get me to Wrigley Field for a Cubs game or a Saints game in New Orleans. Sports, history, and horse racing are the biggest parts of my life."

While Dooley seems to always be busy and on the move, whether he's at the track or traveling, he does have an appreciation for perhaps the biggest benefit of his job—the human relationships he's made over the years.

"Horse racing has been the most impactful thing in my life," he said. "I'm fortunate to have worked with so many great people."
